LORD LIEUTENANT-GENERAL AND GENERAL GOVERNOR OF IRELAND.

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR EXCELLENCY,—

I have the honour to submit, for your Excellency's information, the Twenty-third Annual Report on Marriages, Births, and Deaths in Ireland. The tables comprise all the usual details connected with the subject for the year 1886.

Before reviewing the facts shown in these tables it may be interesting to give a short account of the growth of this Department, and a statement of the various functions it now discharges as the office charged with administering the Laws for the Registration of Births, Deaths, Marriages, and Vaccinations in Ireland, with the custody of important Public Records, and with the collection and tabulation of most of the statistical information published for the country.

The General Register Office was established in 1845, under 7 and 8 Vic. cap. 81, for the registration of marriages solemnized by the Protestant Clergy and the District Registrars. In 1864 its duties were extended to include the supervision of the Registration of all Marriages, Births, and Deaths, and the Registration of Vaccinations, and at the same time the Agricultural and Emigration Statistics hitherto managed by a separate office, under the Registrar-General, were placed under its control.

Since that period its functions have been gradually extended by various Acts of Parliament imposing fresh duties and responsibilities. Notwithstanding this, and the large increase in the work owing to the increased number of references to its accumulating Records, the number of the Staff and the annual cost of the Department are much less than they were formerly.

The following table shows the annual expenditure; the number of persons employed in the Central Office; and the amount received as Fees for Searches, &c., in each year from 1864-5 to 1886-7. From this Table it will be seen that the expenditure which in 1864-5 had been £15,031, rose to £18,290 in 1874-5, since which year it has, owing to re-organization, improved methods of working, and curtailment of detail in connexion with the work of the Agricultural Statistics, been largely reduced. In 1886-7 the expenditure was only £15,684, being a diminution of £2,606 as compared with 1874-5.

In 1864 the number of persons employed in the Central office was 46, this number rose gradually to 63 in 1876-7, notwithstanding which increase in the staff, the work of the Office fell largely into arrear. In the two following years, however, the arrears were cleared off without any addition to the staff, and the work re-organized. The number of the staff is now 41, being 22 persons less than in 1876-7, notwithstanding the very great increase of work since that date.

There are 2,629 Local Registration Officers holding office directly under the Department or who have entered into bonds with the Registrar-General for the due discharge of their duties. The changes amongst these officers are frequent. During the year, 1886, 548 cases of vacancies or appointments were dealt with, involving in many instances transfer of local Records, Books, and Documents, while the instruction, &c., of these officers in their duties, and advising them in cases where legal questions arise, involves a heavy correspondence of an administrative character.

In addition to this the Department has the direction of the prosecution of defaulters for various offences under the Registration and Vaccination Acts, a duty which was formerly discharged under the direction of the Chief Secretary's Office. The investigation of the evidence for these prosecutions, which is properly legal work, forms another important item in the administrative business of the Department.

During the year 1886 there were 123 prosecutions instituted for neglect to register, one prosecution on indictment and 17 on summary proceedings for giving false information, and one for the loss of a Register Book.

The Statistical work of the Department comprises the compilation of Vital, Agricultural, Emigration, and Banking Statistics.*

Under the heading of Vital Statistics, there are issued regularly Weekly Returns of Births and Deaths in cities and towns, prepared from special information furnished by the Registrars, also Quarterly and Yearly Summaries containing abstracts of these Returns. Quarterly Returns for the whole country, also compiled from information specially furnished by the local officers are issued as soon as possible after the close of each quarter, thus giving early notice of outbreaks of disease, defective sanitary arrangements, neglect of vaccination, and other matters affecting the health of the people. The Detailed Annual Report under improved arrangements, is now ready within about six months from the close of the year, rendering unnecessary the Parliamentary Abstract formerly published annually.

The Agricultural Statistics form a separate series of Reports, in which much public interest is taken. The acreage of the crops and number of live stock are published in General Abstracts issued early in August each year. In September, a Report and Tables on Migratory Labourers are issued. These are followed in December by the issue of the Report on the Produce of the Crops, and Returns of Scutching Mills, and the Detailed Report for the year is ready in about five or six months from its termination.

These Statistics were first collected in Ireland in the year 1841 in connexion with the Census of that year. They were again taken in the year 1847, since which time they have been collected and compiled annually. The District Inspectors of the Royal Irish Constabulary, and about 3,400 members of that force and of the Dublin Metropolitan Police are employed as Superintendents of Districts and Enumerators in the collection of these Returns by the authority of the Government.

The Emigration Statistics were first collected in May, 1851, in connexion with the Census of that year, and since that time they have been regularly obtained through the agency of the Royal Irish Constabulary and two special Enumerators employed on this duty in the Port of Dublin. There are 20 Enumeration Stations in Ireland.

Bulletins of Emigration are furnished to the Government at the close of each month, and an Abstract of the Emigration for each quarter is published in the Quarterly Returns of Births and Deaths. In addition to these, a Detailed Report is published in January, reviewing the Emigration for the preceding year, and giving details regarding the Sexes, Ages, Occupations, Destinations, &c., of the Emigrants.

The Banking Statistics, formerly compiled by Dr. Neilson Hancock, have since 1885 been prepared in this office. They consist of Tables compiled from information furnished directly to me from the Banks, General Post Office, &c., and are presented to Parliament in Half-yearly Reports, usually published in January and July.

The various Statistical Reports compiled in this office for the year 1886 number 69, and comprise 1,298 pages, in addition to which Special Reports and Returns are frequently called for, such as the Returns of Railway Traffic in Ireland, which for some time past have been furnished to me by the Railway Authorities, and the results tabulated weekly for information of the Government.

The charging of one department with the compilation of these various classes of statistics is advantageous in several ways. It is an economical arrangement, as the services of an experienced staff are obtained for all these operations by transferring the clerks from the work for one report to that for another till all for each year are completed. It has also another great advantage. These Statistical inquiries all bear more or less upon each other, and the placing of them all under the control of one

Office, enables it to review effectually the social and economic condition of the country and become practically a Social Intelligence Department of the State, having its representatives in every district in Ireland, and having dealings with almost every class in the community.

The Record business of the Department consists of the collection and arrangement of the Returns of Births, Deaths, and Marriages, the examination and correction of these records and the compilation of the printed Alphabetical Indexes for public reference.

The returns of Births and Deaths and Roman Catholic Marriages are collected quarterly from 819 Registrars through 162 Superintendent Registrars, while those of Protestant Marriages are collected from about 2,430 clergymen through 162 District Registrars of Marriages under the 7 & 8 Vic., cap. 81, and 26 Vic., cap. 27.

The examination of the Records and the correction of the errors discovered in them and in the original Registers occupies a period of about nine months from the close of the Quarter.

The Indexes which formerly were annual are now compiled quarterly. They are available for the use of the public in about six months after the termination of each quarter.

The Searches show a steady increase in the amount of business transacted, thus proving that the records are becoming more appreciated and more availed of by the public.

I append a table showing the number of Searches, &c., since the commencement of the Acts for the Registration of Births and Deaths and of Roman Catholic Marriages in 1864. It will be observed that the number of searches and of certified copies issued has increased with great rapidity during the past few years. This is mainly due to the demand for certificates of births, consequent on the requirements of the Board of Intermediate Education and the Senate of the Royal University. The demand for certificates, of birth may be expected to increase steadily, as the records in the custody of the department accumulate, a reference to the Indexes affording the readiest method of obtaining accurate information.

The Financial work of the Department consists of the auditing and payment of the Accounts of Local Registration Officers, viz., Superintendent Registrars, Registrars of Births and Deaths, District Registrars of Marriages under 7 & 8 Vic., cap. 81, Superintendents and Enumerators of Agricultural Statistics, Enumerators of Emigration Statistics, also Legal Expenses Accounts, and Accounts of the Central Office. During the Financial year 1886-7, 8,400 accounts from individuals were examined and paid, and though they were not for large sums, they involved much labour in their audit, the items in many of them being numerous, and entailing a considerable correspondence before settlement.

The operations of the Department under the various Acts of Parliament, &c., entail the supply of a large quantity of books and forms to the Clergy, Local Registration Officers, Coroners, Police, &c. The keeping of these stores forms a distinct branch of the business; over 550 different kinds of books, forms, &c., are kept in stock in addition to the necessary office forms, and during the year 1886 over 7,200 packets were sent out, exclusive of the issue of printed reports and returns.

I have pleasure in stating that the work of the Department in its various branches is well up to date.

In addition to the work of the General Register Office proper, as already detailed, it is the Department charged with the duty of taking the Decennial Census, an operation of such magnitude as to make unusual demands upon its resources. In considering the organization of the Staff, this fact must always be kept in view. The Census of 1881 was admittedly a great success. Its value is acknowledged by the most eminent statisticians—and viewed from a financial point it resulted in a saving of nearly £20,000 as compared with that of 1871, while it was completed in a much shorter time than any preceding Census. I look forward confidently to the Department being able to meet with credit the demands which will be made upon it in connexion with the next Census.

GENERAL SUMMARY.

The Marriages registered in Ireland during the year 1886 number 20,594; the Births 113,927; and the Deaths 87,292. Both absolutely and in proportion to the estimated population, the marriages, births, and deaths are under the annual average for the preceding ten years.

The recorded natural increase of population, or excess of births over deaths, was 26,635: the loss by emigration amounted to 63,135; there would thus appear to have been a decrease of 36,500 in the population during the year, but against a portion of this decrease there is a set-off in immigration, of which no official record has been obtained. The estimated population in the middle of the year was 4,889,498.

MARRIAGES.

The number of Marriages registered during the year was 20,594, being equal to 1 in every 237, or 4.21 per 1,000, of the estimated population, a rate which was .9 under that for the previous year, and .22 under the average for the ten years 1876–85.

Of the 20,594 Marriages registered during the year 1886, 14,248 were between Roman Catholics, 3,383 were celebrated according to the rites and ceremonies of the late Established Church; 2,118 were in Presbyterian Meeting-houses; 379 in "Registered Buildings" belonging to various religious denominations; only 443 by civil contract in the Registrars' offices; 14 were according to the usages of the Society of Friends; and 9 according to the Jewish rite.

Of the 3,383 Marriages according to the rites of the late Established Church, 48 were by special licence, 2,835 by licence, 391 after the publication of banns, 11 on Registrar's certificate, and in 98 instances there was no information afforded as to which of the foregoing methods was adopted.

During the year 1886 there were issued by the Registrars 675 Licences for Marriage in Registered Buildings and in the Registrars' offices.

There being no civil restrictions as to the time or place for celebrating marriages between Roman Catholics in Ireland, a registration of the churches and chapels of the Roman Catholic Church is not necessary for the purposes of this office; but with reference to other religious bodies, a record is kept of the places of Divine worship in which marriages may lawfully be solemnized without special licence, and from this it appears that, on the 31st December, 1886, there were 1,496 churches and chapels of the late Established Church, 597 registered Presbyterian Meeting-houses, and 337 "Registered Buildings" belonging to various religious denominations. Compared with the previous year, these numbers show a decrease of 2 as regards the late Established Church, an increase of 5 in the number of Presbyterian Meeting-houses, and also an increase of 5 "Registered Buildings."

As more than a moiety of the annual number of Roman Catholic marriages in the provinces of Munster and Connaught are celebrated between Christmas and Shrovetide, the marriages registered in Ireland during the first quarter of the year always largely outnumber those in any of the other quarters. In 1886, the numbers recorded were— in the first quarter 7,178; in the second, 4,031; in the third, 4,549; and in the last 4,836.

The marriages of bachelors and spinsters constitute 86.2 per cent. of the total; those of widowers and spinsters 8.4 per cent.; of bachelors and widows 2.9 per cent.; and of widowers and widows 2.5 per cent. Thus, 10.9 in every 100 of the men married were widowers, and 5.4 per cent. of the women were widows; and in 14 instances in every 100 marriages one or both of the contracting parties had been in the married state before.

A complete registry of the exact ages of the persons married would be valuable from many points of view; hence it is matter for regret that in the great majority of instances the ages are not recorded. The requirements of the law are technically complied with by the entry in the age column of "minor" or of "full age," as the case may be, and there seems to be a general and increasing inclination to take advantage of this circumstance, as in 1886 the ages of both parties were specified in only 5,093 instances, being about one-fourth of the total number of marriages. In the year 1865, when 30,802 marriages were registered, the ages of both parties were given in 13,910 instances.

Of 20,594 men married during the year, 480, or 2.33 per cent., were minors; and of the women married, 2,174, or 10.56 per cent., were under age. These proportions differ but slightly from the averages for the preceding ten years.

The highest proportion of husbands (2.64 per cent.) married under age in 1886, was in the province of Ulster, and in that province there was also the highest percentage of wives (11.97), not of full age.

It may be added that the per-centage of persons married in Ireland who were under age is very far below the corresponding rates in England and Scotland.

The signatures of the contracting parties in the marriage registers or certificates afford a rough test of the progress of elementary education. In the year 1886, 15,771, or 76.6 per cent., of the husbands, and 15,381, or 74.7 per cent., of the wives wrote their names, and the remainder signed by marks.

These figures, though still leaving much to be desired, contrast hopefully with the corresponding results eleven years since, the per-centage of persons married in 1876 who wrote their names being—men 68.1, and women 62.7.

As usual, the most favourable results appear in Leinster, and the least satisfactory in Connaught, the number of those married who wrote their names varying from 81 in every 100 men and 81 in every 100 women, in the former province, to 69 per cent. of the men and 70 per cent. of the women in the latter.

In 2,907 instances, both of the parties married signed the register by "mark," and in 4,222 cases the register was thus signed by either the husband or the wife, so that in 7,129 instances, or 34.6 per cent. of the total number of marriages, one or both of the parties signed by mark; and in 13,465 instances, or 65.4 per cent., both parties wrote their names.

The number of marriages registered in each of the eleven years 1876–86; the proportion per cent. of persons married who wrote their names in the registers; of minors, of widowers, and of widows are given in the following Table for Ireland, and for each of the four provinces.

In proportion to the estimated population at all ages, the registered marriages were most numerous in the province of Leinster, in which, however, the rate was only 4.7 per 1,000 persons; Ulster comes next, with 4.5 per 1,000; Munster third, with 3.5 per 1,000; and Connaught last, the rate being 2.7 per 1,000.

The highest rate in any county was 6.8 per 1,000 which was the marriage rate for Dublin; and the lowest 2.5 per 1,000, for Galway. Between these, the most favourable were 6.3 for Antrim, and 4.9 for Down; and the least so 2.6 in Sligo and 2.7 in Mayo.

BIRTHS.

The number of births registered during the year 1886 was 113,927—58,898 boys and 55,029 girls, or 107.0 of the former to every 100 of the latter—the rate afforded in proportion to the estimated population being 1 in 42.9, or 23.3 per thousand, which is considerably under the low average rate (24.7 per 1,000) for the ten years 1876–85; and less than the rate in any of those years.

Of the 113,927 children whose births were registered in Ireland during the year 1886, 110,878, or 97.3 per cent. were legitimate, and 3,049, or 2.7 per cent., were illegitimate. The average per-centage of illegitimate births in the preceding 10 years was 2.5.

It is unnecessary to say that these results compare very favourably with the returns for most other countries.

Of the children born in wedlock during the year, 57,300 were males, and 53,578 females, being 106·9 of the former to every 100 of the latter, and of the illegitimate children 1,598 were males, and 1,451 females, or 110·1 boys to 100 girls.

Comparing the provinces, we find that the per-centage of children born in Ulster, who were illegitimate, was 4·2 ; in Leinster, 2·2 ; in Munster, 2·1 ; and in Connaught, 0·8.

The respective total birth-rates for the provinces in 1886 were—Leinster, 22·9 per 1,000 of the population ; Munster, 21·5 ; Ulster, 22·6 ; and Connaught, 20·2.

The four counties having the highest rates are Dublin, 28·5 per 1,000 inhabitants ; Antrim, 28·0 ; Down, 25·7 ; and Kerry and Armagh each, 22·4. Those with the lowest rates are—Monaghan, 17·1 ; Longford, 17·8 ; Tyrone, 18·2 ; and Queen's and Cavan, 18·5.

Of the total births, 52·7 per cent. were registered in the first six months of the year (181 days), and 47·3 per cent. in the second half of the year (184 days).

The number registered in the first quarter was 29,700 ; in the second, 30,313 ; in the third, 27,514 ; and in the fourth, 26,400.

DEATHS.

The deaths registered during the year amount to 87,292, being equal to 1 in 56·0 or 17·9 per 1,000 of the estimated population. The deaths of males number 43,493, and those of females 43,799, the former being equal to 18·1 in every 1,000 males living, and the latter representing 17·6 per 1,000 females.

The death-rate (17·9) is slightly under the average rate (18·3) for the preceding ten years.

As heretofore, very many of the Registrars furnished at the close of each quarter valuable notes on the sanitary condition of their respective districts. These notes were embodied in the Quarterly Returns issued from this department, and emanating as they did, from gentlemen qualified to speak decisively on the subject, it is to be hoped that they received the serious attention of the various Local Authorities intrusted with the administration of the Public Health Acts.

With respect to the death-rates for the four provinces, the rate for Connaught is only 13·0; that for Munster is 15·9; for Ulster, 17·3, and for Leinster, 19·8.

Of the thirty-two counties, the four having the lowest registered mortality are—Roscommon, 11·8 per 1,000; Mayo, 12·5; Sligo, 12·6; and Kerry, 12·7.

Those in which the rate was highest are—Dublin, 25·9; Antrim, 20·3; Down, 18·9; and Waterford, 18·5.

The deaths registered in the first half of the year generally outnumber those in the second. In 1886, 57·4 per cent. of the total deaths were registered in the six months, January to June inclusive, and only 42·6 per cent. in the remaining six months of the year.

The annual rates represented by the deaths registered in each quarter are as follow:—First quarter, 22·1 per 1,000 of the population; second, 19·0; third, 14·4; and fourth, 16·0.

From Table on pp. 160–169, it will be seen that, of the 87,292 deaths registered during the year, 1,910 took place in Infirmaries and General and Special Hospitals; 921 in Public Lunatic Asylums; 10,530 in Workhouses and Workhouse Hospitals; and 73,931, were of persons who died “At their Own Homes, &c.” As in the Report for the preceding year an additional Table (see pages 170–171) is given showing like information for those Registrars Districts in which the principal Urban Sanitary Districts in Ireland are situated.

The deaths in “Infirmaries and General and Special Hospitals” constitute 2·2 per cent. of the total number, the per centages for the four provinces varying from 0·2 in Connaught to 5·3 in Leinster. Twelve per cent. of the deaths registered occurred in Workhouses or Workhouse Hospitals, the respective per centages for the provinces being—Leinster, 13·3; Munster, 17·8; Ulster, 7·9; and Connaught, 9·3.

CAUSES OF DEATH.

I.—SPECIFIC FEBRILE OR ZYMOTIC DISEASES.

The deaths from Specific Febrile or Zymotic diseases registered during the year 1886, amounted to 6,658, or 136 in every 100,000 of the estimated population, being 1,507, or 30 per 100,000 persons, under the deaths from these causes in the preceding year, and much below the average for the ten years, 1876–85.

Of the 6,658 deaths from zymotic diseases 3,781, or 56·8 per cent., were amongst children under 10 years of age.

The deaths from the eight principal zymotic diseases* registered during 1886 form 6·6 per cent. of the deaths from all causes, and are equal to 117 in every 100,000 persons living; the average annual mortality from the same diseases in the preceding 10 years represents 9·7 per cent. of the average number of deaths from all causes, and is equal to 179 deaths in every 100,000 of the estimated mean population.

Small-pox.—There were but 2 deaths from small-pox—1 in Leinster and 1 in Ulster—registered during last year. The average annual number of deaths from this disease for the ten years, 1876–85, was 225. In 1882 there were 129 deaths registered; in 1883 there were but 16 fatal cases of the disease recorded; in 1884, 1; and in 1885, 4.

Measles.—Deaths from measles, which had risen from 559 in 1884, to 1,323 in 1885, fell last year to 284, or 5·8 per 100,000 of the population. The 284 deaths consist of 55 in

* Small-pox, Measles, Scarlet Fever, Diphtheria, Whooping-cough, Fever, Diarrhœa (and Dysentery), and Cholera.

Leinster; 86 in Munster (including 40 in Cork union); 127 in Ulster (including 37 in Londonderry union and 25 in Belfast union); and 16, only, in Connaught.

Scarlet Fever.—The number of deaths from this disease is 850, being a decrease of 297 as compared with the preceding year, 680 under the average for the ten years 1876–85, and the lowest number registered in any year since registration was established in 1864.

The deaths from scarlet fever in 1886 were distributed through the four provinces as follows:—Leinster, 299 (including 187 in the two Dublin unions, and 27 in Rathdrum union); Munster, 294 (of which number 55 occurred in Cork union, 24 in Dingle union, and 32 in Kilmallock union); Ulster, 239 (79 of which occurred in Belfast union, 21 in Ballymena union, and 26 in Lurgan union); and Connaught, 18 only.

In Leinster, deaths from scarlet fever were equal to 23·4 per 100,000 of the population; in Munster, the rate was 22·1 per 100,000; in Ulster, 13·7; and in Connaught 2·2 only.

Diphtheria.—This disease proved fatal in 336 instances, being 18 in excess of the average annual number for the ten years 1876–85, and 40 over the number for the year 1885. In proportion to population the highest mortality (9·1 per 100,000 persons) was in the province of Ulster.

Whooping-cough.—The deaths (1,219) from whooping-cough are 504 below the average for the ten years 1876–85, and 217 under the number registered in the year 1885; they afford an annual rate of 24·9 per 100,000 of the estimated population. In proportion to population the mortality was highest in Leinster and lowest in Connaught, the rates for these provinces being 34·6 and 3·0 per 100,000 persons respectively.

Fever.—The number of deaths from the several forms of continued fever was 1,546 (793 males and 753 females), being the lowest number registered in any year since registration was established in 1864; the average annual number for the ten years 1876–85, was 2,496; the number in 1885 was 1,664. The deaths recorded during last year are equal to a rate of 31·6 per 100,000 of the estimated population; the respective rates for the provinces being—Leinster, 31·4 per 100,000; Munster, 32·6; Ulster, 28·3; and Connaught, 26·4.

Of the registered deaths from fever, 394 were ascribed to typhus, 772 to typhoid or enteric, and 380 to simple continued fever, or vaguely as to “fever.” The age periods, 20 and under 25 years, and 65 to 75, were those in which fever proved most fatal in proportion to the living at the same ages; the former yielding a rate of 41·47 per 100,000, and the latter 40·64. The lowest rate was 18·07 for the period “75 and upwards.”

Erysipelas.—The deaths from erysipelas number 232, being 48 below the annual average for the preceding decade, and 31 under the number in the year 1885. The highest mortality in 1886, in proportion to population, was in Ulster, and the lowest in Munster.

Puerperal Fever.—The number of deaths from this disease registered in 1886 was 332, being 21 below the average for the ten years, 1876–85, and 38 under the number in the year 1885.

Influenza.—There were but 34 deaths ascribed to this disease; the number in 1885 was 36, and the annual average for the ten years, 1876–85, was 67.

Diarrhoea and Dysentery.—The mortality from diarrhoea and dysentery, although not as low as in the preceding year, was considerably below the average, the number of deaths being 1,422 (equal to 29·1 per 100,000 of the population), or 158 over the number for the preceding year, and 348 under the average annual number for the ten years, 1876–85.

The rates for the provinces in 1886 were as follow:—Leinster, 34·6 per 100,000 persons; Munster, 27·6; Ulster, 29·8; and Connaught 11·3.

Simple Cholera.—Fifty-nine deaths were ascribed to this disease—13 over the annual average for the ten years 1876–85.

One male and one female died from *Hydrophobia*.

II.—PARASITIC DISEASES.

There were 100 deaths caused by diseases of this class.

III.—DIETETIC DISEASES.

The deaths in this class number 155; they comprise 151 from intemperance, 44 of which (42 males and 2 females) were caused by delirium tremens, and 107 (85 males and 22 females) come under the head of chronic alcoholism.

IV.—CONSTITUTIONAL DISEASES.

From diseases termed “constitutional” there resulted 16,783 deaths (7,883 males and 8,900 females), affording a rate of 1 in 5·2 of all the deaths, and equal to 343 in every 100,000 of the population.

Phthisis or Pulmonary Consumption proved fatal in 10,694 instances (4,903 males and 5,791 females) being equal to 218·7 in every 100,000 persons; the average annual number for the previous ten years was 10,503.

As heretofore, Leinster and Ulster yield the highest rates, and Connaught the lowest. The rates for the four provinces are as follow:—Leinster, 245 per 100,000 of the population; Ulster, 233; Munster, 178; and Connaught, 137.

Of the total deaths from phthisis, 7,786, or 73 per cent., were of persons between 15 and 45 years of age.

Mesenteric Disease.—The deaths from mesenteric disease number 1,120—556 males and 564 females.

Gout.—Only 23 deaths from gout were registered (15 males and 8 females).

Cancer.—There were 2,029 deaths tabulated under this heading, of which 894 were those of males and 1,135 of females.

V.—DEVELOPMENTAL DISEASES.

The deaths in this class amount to 17,975, of which 17,512 (8,152 males and 9,360 females) were ascribed to “old age.” Of the remaining 463 deaths, 357 are tabulated under the head of “premature birth;” 30 were caused by atelectasis, 19 by cyanosis, 38 by spina bifida; &c.

VI.—LOCAL DISEASES.

The number of deaths from “local diseases” registered amounted to 36,666 (19,221 males and 17,445 females); or 1 in 2·4 of the deaths from all causes.

Diseases of the Nervous System.—From this group of diseases there resulted 8,726 deaths—4,690 males and 4,036 females. They include 3,191 from convulsions, (nearly all children), 1,404 from hemiplegia (brain paralysis), 1,128 from apoplexy, 1,043 from inflammation of the brain or its membranes, 374 from epilepsy, 270 from insanity (general paralysis of the insane), 11 (4 males and 7 females) from chorea or St. Vitus’s dance, 278 from softening of the brain, &c.

Diseases of the Circulatory System.—Diseases of the circulatory system caused 4,973 deaths—2,593 males and 2,380 females.

*Diseases of the Respiratory System.**—The deaths from these diseases, amounted to 15,178 (7,850 males and 7,328 females), being equal to 310·4 in every 100,000 of the population. The average number for the preceding ten years was 16,403, the annual numbers varying from 14,046 in 1884 to 19,634 in 1879. The respective rates for the Provinces, in 1886, are Leinster, 348·2 per 100,000 persons; Munster, 288·0; Ulster, 291·2; and Connaught, 220·9.

Of the 15,178 deaths from these causes 9,938 (4,763 males and 5,175 females) resulted from bronchitis; 2,807 (1,793 males and 1,014 females) were from pneumonia or inflammation of the lungs; 762 from croup; 313 from asthma and emphysema; 224 from pleurisy; 110 from laryngitis, &c.

Diseases of the Digestive System.—These diseases contributed 4,883 deaths (2,565 males and 2,318 females). They include 546 from enteritis or inflammation of the bowels; 382 from peritonitis or inflammation of the covering of the bowels; 443 from ileus or obstruction of the bowels; 264 from ulceration of the intestines; 141 from hernia; 8 (7 males and 1 female) from fistula; 218—143 males and 75 females—from cirrhosis of liver, &c.

Diseases of the Urinary System.—To the various affections of this order of diseases 1,636 deaths (1,152 males and 484 females) were ascribed. Of these deaths, 588 (337 males and 251 females) were from Bright's disease, 158 from acute nephritis or inflammation of the kidneys; 22 from ischuria or suppression of urine; 14 from stone in the bladder; 51 from uræmia, &c.

The remaining deaths from Local Diseases comprise 50 from *Diseases of the Lymphatic System and of Ductless Glands*; 642 from *Diseases of the Reproductive System* (including 163 from diseases of the Organs of Generation, and 479 from the Accidents of Childbirth); 302 from *Diseases of the Locomotive System*; and 228 from *Diseases of the Integumentary System*.

VII.—VIOLENT DEATHS.

The number of violent deaths registered during the year was 1,860 (1,293 males and 567 females), or 38·0 in every 100,000 of the population, being slightly under the average rate for the ten years 1876-85. Accidents or negligence caused 1,611 of these deaths (including 602 from fractures and contusions, 344 from burns or scalds, and 358 from drowning); there were 131 cases of homicide (murder and manslaughter), and 116 of suicide; 2 men were executed—one in Leinster, the other in Munster.

Inquests.—There were 2,051 inquests reported to the Registrars during the year 1886, being 1 inquest to every 43 deaths registered.

AGES.

Deaths of infants under 1 year old numbered 10,760, being equal to 9·4 per cent. of the number of births registered.

Amongst children under 5 years of age 18,041 deaths occurred—a mortality equal to 33·2 in every 1,000 of the living at that age. Of these, 9,615 were boys and 8,426 girls; the former number representing 34·8 in every 1,000 boys, and the latter 31·4 in every 1,000 girls under 5 years old.

The deaths of persons aged 65 years and upwards are equivalent to 9·9 per cent. of the living at that age.

Amongst the deaths registered are 582 of persons stated to have been aged 95 years or upwards—261 males and 321 females.

* Exclusive of Phthisis, or Pulmonary Consumption, for which see "Constitutional Diseases."

EMIGRATION.

According to the Returns obtained by the Royal Irish Constabulary and the Metropolitan Police, who acted as enumerators at the several Irish seaports, the number of emigrants who left Ireland during the year 1886 amounted to 63,135; of these 31,950 were males and 31,185 were females. Of the whole number, 10,350 were from the Province of Leinster; 21,106 from Munster; 19,637 from Ulster; and 12,042 from Connaught.

Of the total emigrants from Ireland in 1886, 11.2 per cent. were under 15 years of age; 78.1 per cent. were between 15 and 35 years old; and 10.7 per cent. were 35 or upwards.

PRICES OF PROVISIONS, AND PAUPERISM.

The average prices, in Dublin, of potatoes and beef in 1886 were under those for the preceding year; the average price of Messrs. Manders and Co.'s 4-lb. loaf was 5½*d.*, being ½*d.* under the average price for 1885. Oatmeal averaged 16*s.* 7*d.* per cwt., being 11*d.* under average price for 1885; the average prices of potatoes ranged from 2*s.* 6*d.* to 3*s.* 5*d.* per cwt., against 2*s.* 4*d.* to 3*s.* 3*d.* in 1885; and those of beef from 49*s.* to 59*s.* 6*d.* per cwt., against 52*s.* 6*d.* to 66*s.* in 1885.

Surveying the period covered by the several Tables in this Report, *i.e.*, 1886, and the ten years preceding, it is found that beef was lowest in the year 1886, when the average prices ranged from 49*s.* to 59*s.* 6*d.* per cwt.; bread also was lowest in that year, the average price of Messrs. Manders' 4-lb. loaf being 5½*d.*; oatmeal was cheapest in 1881, when the average price was 14*s.* 1*d.* per cwt.; and potatoes in 1885, when the average range of prices was from 2*s.* 4*d.* to 3*s.* 3*d.* per cwt. The highest average price of bread was 8*d.* in the years 1877; of oatmeal, 17*s.* 10*d.* in 1877; the highest range for potatoes, 4*s.* 9*d.* to 7*s.* 6*d.* per cwt. in 1878, and for beef, 66*s.* 6*d.* to 77*s.* per cwt. in 1883.

From Returns, for which I am indebted to the Local Government Board, it appears that the average number of workhouse inmates in Ireland on Saturdays during the year 1886 was 46,749, being 260 under the average for the preceding year; and that the average number of persons receiving out-door relief was 77,456, or 18,825 over the corresponding number for 1885.

THE WEATHER.

The following particulars have, by the kind permission of the Editor of the Dublin Journal of Medical Science, been derived from Returns of Meteorological Observations taken in Dublin City during the years 1866–86, by J. W. Moore, M.D., F.K.Q.C.P.I., F.R.MET. SOC.; and published in that Journal during the years 1886–87:—

The mean Atmospheric Pressure has been obtained from daily readings of the barometer at 9 A.M. and 9 P.M., corrected and reduced to 32° Fahrenheit at the mean sea level. The Mean Temperature values have been deduced from the maximal and minimal readings of the thermometer in the shade by Kaemtz's Formula, viz., $min. + \{max. - min. \times .41\} = \text{Mean Temperature}$. The Rainfall is that measured daily at 9 A.M. A *rainy day* is one on which at least one-hundredth (.01) of an inch of rain falls within the twenty-four hours from 9 A.M. to 9 A.M.

The *Mean Height of the Barometer* during the year 1886 was 29.884 inches. The highest observed reading was 30.776 inches at 9 P.M. on November 24th. The lowest observed reading was 27.758 inches, at 2.30 P.M. on December 8th. The extreme range of atmospherical pressure was 3.018 inches compared with 2.244 inches in 1885.

The *Mean Temperature* of the year, deduced from the maximal and minimal readings of the thermometer in the shade by Kaemtz's Formula, was 47.9°. The highest reading was 78.7° on July 3rd; the lowest reading was 22.0° on December 21st. The average mean temperature for the years 1866–85 calculated in the same way, was 48.8°. The mean temperature deduced from the daily readings of the dry bulb thermometer at 9 A.M. and 9 P.M. was 48.4°.

Rain fell on 220 days, including snow or sleet on 40 days, and hail on 41 days. The average number of rainy days in the years 1866–85 was 196.1. The total rainfall measured 32.966 inches, compared with an average of 27.973 inches in the twenty years 1866–85. During the first half of 1886 (January to June, inclusive) the rainfall was 15.579 inches on 111 days; during the second half (July to December, inclusive) 17.387 inches fell on 109 days.

As regards the *Direction of the Wind*, 730 observations were made during the year, with this result—N., 40; N.E., 65; E., 83; S.E., 56; S., 59; S.W., 112; W., 186; N.W., 83; Calms, 46.

Appended are some remarks upon the different months of the year 1886.

JANUARY.—Although the New Year opened with very mild, dull weather, January, 1886, will be remembered as a cold, snowy month. It is true that no severe frosts were recorded near Dublin, but in many parts of the United Kingdom extremely low temperatures were noted from time to time—the lowest of all being 7° Fahr. at Newton Reigny, near Penrith, in Cumberland, on the 19th, and 6° at Rothamsted, on the 8th. Some idea of the severity of the weather may be gathered from the fact that in Dublin snow or sleet fell on eighteen days, and hail on fourteen days. Both the rainfall and rainy days were much above the average, while atmospherical pressure and temperature were as much below it. The maximal temperature did not exceed 40° from the 17th to the 27th inclusive.

The mean height of the barometer was 29.662 inches, or 0.219 inch below the average value for January—namely, 29.881 inches. The mercury rose to 30.287 inches at 9 P.M. of the 11th, and sank to 29.032 inches at 9 P.M. of the 17th. The observed range of atmospherical pressure was, therefore, 1.255 inches—slightly more than an inch and a quarter. The mean temperature deduced from daily readings of the dry bulb thermometer at 9 A.M. and 9 P.M. was 37.6°, or 4.3° below the value for December, 1885; that calculated by Kaemtz's formula—from the means of the daily maxima and minima was 37.1°, or 3.7° below the average mean temperature for January, calculated in the same way, in the twenty years, 1865–84, inclusive (40.8°). The arithmetical mean of the maximal and minimal readings was 37.9°, compared with a twenty years' average of 41.4°. On the 3rd the thermometer in the screen rose to 53.4°—wind S.W.; on the 7th the temperature fell to 24.9°—wind W. The minimum on the grass was 20.0° on the same date. The diurnal range of temperature was considerable on the 3rd, and from the 10th to the 15th inclusive, but the maxima in this period were sometimes reached at night. The rainfall was 3.244 inches, distributed over 26 days. The average rainfall for January in the twenty years, 1865–84, inclusive, was 2.243 inches, and the average number of rainy days was 17.1. The rainfall, therefore, and the rainy days were both decidedly above the average.

Sleet or snow fell on the 5th and four following days, the 13th, the 15th and six following days, the 23rd, 24th, 25th, 30th, and 31st—in all on eighteen days. Hail was noted on the 6th, 8th, 13th, 16th, and four following days, the 22nd and three following days, the 30th and 31st—in all on fourteen days. Ice-crystals were seen on the evening of the 19th. The air was more or less foggy on the 7th, 10th, 22nd, 25th, 26th, 27th, and 28th. Lunar halos were observed on the nights of the 20th and 22nd, and a solar halo appeared on the 28th. High winds prevailed on thirteen days.

At the beginning of the year temperature was generally high for the season.

In the course of the week ending Saturday, the 9th, the dominant systems of atmospherical pressure over the United Kingdom were alternately cyclonic and anti-cyclonic, the wind-type varying from south-westerly to north-westerly or northerly. The weather was very changeable—at times mild and again very cold and foggy. On the 6th a heavy snowstorm prevailed in the valley of the Thames.

During the second week the weather was most changeable. The distribution of pressure was cyclonic—deep depressions appearing in the far north, while elongated subsidiary disturbances travelled in an easterly direction across our Islands. Southerly winds, rain, and comparatively mild

weather alternated with north-westerly and northerly winds, snow, sleet, hail, and frost—the changes from one type to the other being sudden and frequent.

In the third week (ending the 23rd), pressure distribution was again mainly cyclonic, but the type was complex and variable. On Monday, the 18th, the barometer was very low over the North Sea and so continued for some days. Shallow depressions then began to advance *westwards* from Germany to the S.E. of England—cold weather was thus continued, with frequent falls of snow or sleet in many places, and occasionally clearer skies and frost.

The weather remained very unsettled and changeable in the fourth and last week. On the 24th and following days a depression lay over the Bay of Biscay, Brittany, the English and St. George's Channels. Heavy snow fell in and about Dublin on Sunday and Monday, the 24th and 25th, as well as in the S.W. of England. At 9 A.M. of the 25th the temperature in Dublin was 27°2', and the appearance was quite Arctic. A thaw followed in the afternoon and a heavy fall of rain took place at night. The low pressure system in the S. gradually filled up, but on the 28th the barometer fell to the W. and N.W., and a new series of depressions began to come in from the Atlantic, causing showery, broken weather to the end of the month.

It is noteworthy that the cold weather appeared to be of Atlantic or North American origin—it certainly came in from the westward, at a time when no extreme cold prevailed in the N. or N.W., of Europe; and it also showed itself near the centre of an extensive and very deep atmospherical depression.

FEBRUARY.—Like January, this was a cold month; but unlike January, the cold was connected with high pressure systems, and was accompanied by calms, or easterly to southerly winds. In the twenty years, 1865–84 inclusive, only once was February colder than in 1886—namely, in 1873, when the mean temperature was 37°9' compared with 39°7'—or, by Kaemtz's formula, 37°1' compared with 38°9'. The distribution of the cold in the British Islands was that usually observed in winter Continental anticyclones—the weather was most severe in the midland counties, S. and S.E. of England; less severe in Scotland, and least severe in Ireland. This was specially so from the 7th to the 12th inclusive, when fine, mild weather was experienced in Ireland and Scotland, while hard frost and dense fogs prevailed in and about London, and in the S. and E. of England generally.

The mean height of the barometer was 30·096 inches, or 0·234 inch above the average value for February—namely, 29·862 inches. The mercury rose to 30·577 inches at 9 P.M. of the 8th, having been as low as 29·319 inches at 9 A.M. of the 1st. The observed range of atmospherical pressure was, therefore, 1·258 inches—slightly more than an inch and a quarter. The mean temperature deduced from daily readings of the dry bulb thermometer at 9 A.M. and 9 P.M. was 39°1', 1·5° above the value for January, 1886; that calculated by Kaemtz's formula—from the means of the daily maxima and minima was 38°9', or 3·6° below the average mean temperature for February, calculated in the same way, in the twenty years, 1865–84, inclusive (42·5°). The arithmetical mean of the maximal and minimal readings was 39°7', compared with a twenty years' average of 43·2°. On the 8th the thermometer in the screen rose to 53°4'—wind W.S.W.; on the 5th the temperature fell to 27°3'—wind calm. The minimum on the grass was 23°2° on the same day. The diurnal range of temperature was small on many occasions. The rainfall was 1·981 inches, distributed over 15 days. The average rainfall for February in the twenty years, 1865–84, inclusive, was 2·244 inches, and the average number of rainy days was 17·6. The rainfall, therefore, and the rainy days were both decidedly below the average.

Sleet or snow fell on the 14th, 27th, and 28th. Hail was noted on the 1st, 25th, 27th, and 28th. The air was more or less foggy on the 4th and four following days, the 10th and two following days, the 15th, 19th, and three following days, and the 26th. Lunar halos were observed on the nights of the 11th and 12th, and solar halos appeared on the 12th, 13th, and 15th. High winds prevailed on five days.

At the beginning of the month, atmospherical pressure was low, under the influence of an extensive depression, the centre of which (28°60' inches) lay over the extreme south of Norway. Fresh W. to N.W. winds were blowing, with cold, showery weather. A rapid rise of the barometer took place in the rear of this depression, and on the 4th an anticyclone appeared over Ireland, subsequently moving southwards to France. This was succeeded by the development of two shallow depressions—one of which travelled in a northerly direction, while the other followed in the wake of the high pressure system to France.

The weather in the week ending Saturday, the 13th, was changeable and showery on the extreme western coasts, mild in the east of Ireland and in most parts of Scotland, but chiefly dry, cold, and foggy in the greater part of England. From the 7th to the 10th an anticyclone extended from Germany across the south of England, causing light variable winds, calms and very cold, foggy weather in that region; while conditions were cyclonic in Ireland and Scotland, where the weather was open and changeable. On the night of the 9th temperature fell to 19° at Cambridge, 22° in London, and 23° at Hurst Castle and Oxford.

After Sunday, the 14th, a large anticyclone—in which readings at one time exceeded 30·90 inches—was formed over Russia and Northern Europe, from which a well-marked "ridge" extended south-westwards across the North Sea and the United Kingdom. Easterly winds consequently set in over the southern parts of our area, while variable airs prevailed in the north. The weather became gloomy, cold, and foggy over England, but was at times fine and bright in Ireland and Scotland. Showers of sleet fell on the N.E. coast of England, but elsewhere the weather was, as a rule, dry.

During the last week similar conditions held, so that easterly (N.E. to S.E.) winds were very prevalent, with a continuance of cold weather, much cloud and fog. Snow or sleet fell daily in the east of Scotland, north-east of England, and the close of the period in Ireland also. On the 21st and 22nd large quantities of rain fell in Munster, in connexion with shallow depressions

which developed themselves within the limits of the anticyclone. On Sunday, the 28th, a cyclone approached St. George's Channel from S.W., the S.E. wind freshened to a gale at night, and a heavy snowstorm occurred in the east of Ireland, over the Irish Sea, and in Wales, subsequently extending over almost the entire kingdom.

MARCH.—The bitterly cold weather, which had prevailed during the greater part of January and February, held until the 18th of March, when a magical change occurred throughout the British Islands. From the day named until the 29th the mean temperature was as much above, as it had previously been below, the average, and hence it happens that March, 1886, will not stand out prominently as a cold month in the record of many years. In Dublin the mean temperature of the month was lower than that recorded in 1886 (41.4°) on five occasions in the twenty years, 1865–84—viz., in 1865 (41.2°), 1867 (39.0°), 1869 (41.2°), 1876 (41.1°), 1883 (39.0°). At the same time, no such continuous and severe cold in March was noted in any of those twenty years as that which held until the 18th of March, 1886. The first week was, in fact, the coldest period of the winter of 1885–86—the mean temperature being only slightly above freezing point.

The mean height of the barometer was 29.880 inches, or 0.043 inch below the average value for March—namely, 29.923 inches. The mercury rose to 30.463 inches at 9 A.M. of the 11th, and fell to 29.200 inches at 7 A.M. of the 31st. The observed range of atmospherical pressure was, therefore, 1.263 inches—slightly more than an inch and a quarter. The mean temperature deduced from daily readings of the dry bulb thermometer at 9 A.M. and 9 P.M. was 41.2° , or 2.1° above the value for February, 1886; that calculated by Kaemtz's formula—from the means of the daily maxima and minima was 40.5° , or 2.2° below the average mean temperature for March, calculated in the same way, in the twenty years, 1865–84, inclusive (42.7°). The arithmetical mean of the maximal and minimal readings was 41.4° , compared with a twenty years' average of 43.5° . On the 21st the thermometer in the screen rose to 60.4° —wind S.W.; on the 4th the temperature fell to 23.0° —wind calm. The minimum on the grass was 17.3° on the same date. The diurnal range of temperature was small on many occasions during the cold period. The rainfall was 2.065 inches, distributed over 19 days. The average rainfall for March in the twenty years, 1865–84, inclusive, was 2.081 inches, and the average number of rainy days was 16.5. The rainfall, therefore, was slightly below, while the rainy days were decidedly above the average.

Sleet or snow fell on the 1st, 2nd, 3rd, 14th, 16th, 17th, 18th, 29th, and 31st. Hail was noted on the 2nd, 3rd, 14th, 15th, 16th, 17th, 29th, and 31st. The air was more or less foggy on the 4th, 13th, 18th, and 22nd. Lunar halos were observed on the night of the 19th, and solar halos appeared on the 7th and 10th. High winds prevailed on as many as fourteen days. A bright aurora borealis was seen on the evening of the 30th, and a fainter display occurred on the 31st.

The month opened with a snowstorm of exceptional severity, connected with a deep depression, which appeared over St. George's Channel on the 1st, and moved towards E.N.E., until its centre reached the mouth of the Humber on the 2nd. Snow lay five inches deep in the streets of Dublin, but in the N. and N.E. of England vast drifts completely blocked the traffic by rail and road. During the first week the weather remained in a most winter-like condition—the prevailing winds being easterly to northerly, the temperature low, and the air dry. Falls of snow and sleet were of frequent occurrence. On the 4th the frost in Dublin was more intense than it had been at any time during the winter, and the mean temperature of the week was only 33.1° .

In the week ending Saturday, the 13th, there was a continuance of cold weather, particularly over Great Britain and the North Sea, where keen, dry easterly winds prevailed. On the 7th an intense frost occurred in the N.W. of England in the rear of a depression, which had passed south-eastwards across France during the previous day. At Tean (Stoke-upon-Trent) the sheltered thermometer fell to 7° , at Worksop to 8° , and at Newton Reigny to 10° . At Worksop an instrument exposed on the snow descended to -5° . In Ireland, about this time, strong S.E. winds and gales prevailed. On Tuesday, the 9th, the wind was very searching and the atmosphere was unusually dry in Dublin—the relative humidity at 9 P.M. being only 50 per cent.

In the course of the week ending Saturday, the 20th, one of the most sudden and complete changes of weather experienced for many years took place throughout the United Kingdom. The period commenced with a continuation of the frosty, gloomy conditions which had held for so long. In and near Dublin hail, sleet and snow fell daily up to and including Wednesday, the 17th, and in Great Britain the nights were severely cold. During the forenoon of Wednesday, however, the barometer fell in the west, and later in the day a large depression advanced rapidly towards Ireland. Its centre moved north-eastwards outside our western coasts, so that the wind drew into S. and S.W. all over the Kingdom, and warm showery weather spread quickly across the country. Thus, whereas at Oxford the thermometer had been as low as 21° early on the 18th, it had risen to 55° —a range of 34° —by the afternoon of the 19th, when also a maximum of 62° was attained in London—the highest reading there recorded since September 29, 1885.

Throughout the fourth week (the 21st to the 27th inclusive) the weather was changeable, mild and damp, with southerly (S.E. to S.W.) winds, which, though moderate generally, freshened at times, especially in the West of Ireland, where they reached the force of a gale. During this period the barometer was low over the Atlantic, high on the Continent, the distribution of pressure being mainly cyclonic in the west. Temperature was considerably above the average—the mean for the week in Dublin was 52.5° , and maximal readings, varying from 60° to 65° were recorded in many places. A heavy fall of rain occurred in Ireland on the 26th.

During the last three days several depressions passed across this country. The weather was very broken, with unsteady temperature, severe gales from S.W. to N.W., showers of cold rain, sleet and hail, in places thunder and lightning, and brilliant aurora at night. The auroral display of the 30th was seen from Dublin as a broad band of moonlike light projected across the northern sky from W. to E. On the evening of the 31st white streamers rose from the north from time to time.

APRIL.—Opening with unsettled, stormy, and showery weather, this month proved finally to be both dry and cold—only a little more than half an inch of rain (550 inch) falling after the 9th on but six days, and polar (E. to N.W.) winds blowing almost constantly during the same period. Previously, strong S. to W. winds had prevailed, with higher but unstable temperature and frequent showers—these conditions being brought about by the passage north-eastwards along our Atlantic coasts of a series of extensive and deep atmospherical depressions. In Dublin the mean temperature (46.3°) was lower than that recorded in the month of April except on three occasions in the twenty years, 1865–84—viz., in 1877 (46.1°), in 1879 (44.5°)—the lowest mean temperature yet observed in April—and in 1881 (45.6°). In 1884 the mean temperature was one-tenth of a degree higher (46.4°) than it was in 1886.

The mean height of the barometer was 29.909 inches, or 0.052 inch above the average value for April—namely, 29.857 inches. The mercury rose to 30.404 inches at 9 A.M. of the 15th, and fell to 29.022 inches at 9 A.M. of the 8th. The observed range of atmospherical pressure was, therefore, 1.382 inches—not much less than an inch and a half. The mean temperature deduced from daily readings of the dry bulb thermometer at 9 A.M. and 9 P.M. was 45.5°, or 4.3° above the value for March, 1886; that calculated by Kaemtz's formula—from the means of the daily maxima and minima was 45.1°, or 2.0° below the average mean temperature for April, calculated in the same way, in the twenty years, 1865–84, inclusive (47.1°). The arithmetical mean of the maximal and minimal readings was 46.3°, compared with a twenty years' average of 48.1°. On the 27th the thermometer in the screen rose to 64.8°—wind E.S.E.; on the 11th the temperature fell to 31.8°—wind N. The minimum on the grass was 26.9° on the same date. The diurnal range of temperature was large on some occasions—notably on the 1st, 7th, 12th, and 30th. The rainfall was 1.524 inches, distributed over 15 days. The average rainfall for April in the twenty years, 1865–84, inclusive, was 2.029 inches, and the average number of rainy days was 15.0. The rainfall, therefore, was decidedly below, while the rainy days were exactly equal to, the average.

Sleet fell on the 6th. Hail was noted on the 6th, 8th, 9th, 10th, 17th, and 29th. The air was more or less foggy on the 11th, 16th, 24th, 27th, and 30th. Solar halos were observed on the 12th and 17th. High winds prevailed on as many as nine days, of which six fell within the first week.

Until Saturday, the 10th, atmospherical pressure was lowest over the Atlantic between the British Islands and Iceland, as well as over the Norwegian Sea, and a number of depressions travelled from S.W. to N.E. along the shores of north-western Europe. High winds, showers, and bright intervals prevailed at this time. The most important of these depressions came suddenly to the N.W. of Ireland during the night of the 6th–7th. Its rate of motion was immediately checked, so that its centre lay over Sutherland at 8 A.M. of the 8th, and had only reached the Shetlands twenty-four hours later. In this depression the barometer sank below 28.60 inches. Many subsidiary disturbances accompanied it, and the weather was consequently very unsettled and rough, with cold showers of hail and sleet in many parts of the United Kingdom, as the wind veered to W. and N.W.

In the course of the week ending Saturday the 17th, the weather was cold and rather unsettled. Northerly (N.W. to N.E.) winds of moderate strength prevailed over the British Islands during the entire period, but on the whole the weather was brighter and drier in Ireland than in Great Britain, especially towards the close, when the N.E. wind freshened with cold showers in the E. and S. of England.

The weather of the week ending the 24th was generally fair, with low temperatures until the end. On Friday, the 23rd, the sky became gloomy in Ireland with a freshening easterly wind, and at night a fall of rain occurred. Next day, a spell of warmth occurred in England, the thermometer rising to 68° at Cambridge, 69° at Loughborough and Oxford, and 70° in London.

Very important and decided changes occurred in the weather of the last week, the conditions being sometimes very springlike and at other times quite winterly. At first the weather was fine and bright, particularly on Easter Monday, the 26th; and temperature rose daily until Tuesday afternoon, when it reached 64.8° in Dublin, 67° in London, 71° at Parsonstown and some English stations, and 72° at Leith. On this same day, a N.E. wind, low temperature (36°) and sleet and snow prevailed in the Shetland Isles. The barometer now rose in the north, so that the cold N.E. wind spread steadily southwards, displacing the warm air-current just referred to, and bringing with it cold rain and sleet to many places. In Dublin, a heavy fall of cold rain occurred on Wednesday afternoon, the 28th, and next day rain, sleet, and hail fell heavily in London, reducing the temperature to 36° in the shade. Night frosts now occurred in most parts of the country—the thermometer in the screen falling to 28° at Parsonstown and 33.2° in Dublin on the morning of the 30th.

MAY.—Like May, 1885, this was a cold, unsettled, showery month, although not so cold as the month named, while the rainfall was more than double as large (5.472 inches, compared with 2.532 inches in 1885). Considering that May, on the average, is the driest month of the year in Dublin, the exceptional nature of the rainfall, in 1886 is thrown into bold relief; and a further noteworthy feature is the fact that more than an inch of rain was measured on each of two consecutive days—1.151 inches on the 11th and 1.266 inches on the 12th. This was altogether a phenomenal down-pour for May. The other leading characteristics of the month were cloudy skies, and north-easterly or easterly winds, often forming portion of the circulation round areas of low pressure, which did not come in over Western Europe from the Atlantic, but which either travelled northwards from the Mediterranean and the Peninsula, or else developed over France and the United Kingdom.

In Dublin the mean temperature (50.5°) was lower than that recorded in the month of May, except on five occasions in the twenty years, 1865–84—viz., in 1866 (50.1°), in 1869 (48.2°)—the lowest mean temperature yet observed in May—in 1872 (50.4°), in 1877 (49.7°), and in 1879 (48.8°). In 1885 the mean temperature was as low as 48.7°, and in 1876 it was identical with that recorded in 1886.

The mean height of the barometer was 29·898 inches, or 0·098 inch below the average value for May—namely, 29·996 inches. The mercury rose to 30·377 inches at 9 A.M. of the 5th, and fell to 29·182 inches at 6 15 P.M. of the 17th. The observed range of atmospherical pressure was, therefore, 1·195 inches—not much less than an inch and a quarter. The mean temperature deduced from daily readings of the dry bulb thermometer at 9 A.M. and 9 P.M. was 50·2°, or 4·7° above the value for April, 1886; that calculated by Kaemtz's formula—from the means of the daily maxima and minima was 49·3°, or 1·6° below the average mean temperature for April, calculated in the same way, in the twenty years, 1865-84, inclusive (50·9°). The arithmetical mean of the maximal and minimal readings was 50·5°, compared with a twenty years' average of 52·1°. On the 5th the thermometer in the screen rose to 67·4°—wind S.E.; on the 1st the temperature fell to 35·3°—wind E. The minimum on the grass was 26·9° on the latter date. The rainfall was 5·472 inches, distributed over 21 days. The average rainfall for May in the twenty years, 1865-84, inclusive, was 1·938 inches, and the average number of rainy days was 15·1. The rainfall, therefore, and the rainy days were very much in excess of the average. In 1869, the rainfall was also very large—5·414 inches on 19 days—and in 1878, 4·540 inches fell on 23 days. On the other hand, in 1871, only ·378 inch was measured on 9 days.

Sleet fell on the 12th. Hail was noted on the 14th, 26th, and 28th. The air was more or less foggy on the 6th, 8th, and 9th. Solar halos were observed on the 1st, 6th, 7th, and 16th. High winds prevailed on as many as eight days, and there was an easterly gale on the 12th.

The month opened with unusually low temperature in many places, but in other respects fine weather. Early on the morning of the 1st the thermometer in the screen fell to 35·8° in Dublin, 30° at Loughborough, 29° in London, and 26° at Cambridge.

During the week ending Saturday, the 9th, there were some fine warm days, and indeed a gradual increase of temperature was in progress over Western Europe generally, owing to the slow movement in an easterly direction of an anticyclone, which prevailed over the United Kingdom at the beginning of the month. On the forenoon of the 4th a warm rain fell in Dublin, where vegetation made rapid progress. On this day, also, a remarkable variation in the hygrometrical state took place—the percentage relative humidity falling from 90 at 9 A.M. to 49 at 9 P.M.

The week ending on the 15th was marked by the advent of some of the most unsettled weather which had been experienced for a long while past. Into the space between two areas of high pressure—one off the north of Scotland, the other over the Mediterranean and southern Europe—some depressions advanced, while others were formed over the south of England and France. In consequence N.E. and E. winds increased greatly in force in Ireland and England, with a remarkable fall of temperature and downpours of cold rain, with sleet and hail in many places. At the same time S.W. and W. winds prevailed in France, accompanied with severe thunderstorms. On the night of Wednesday, the 12th, a bourrasque, or tornado, passed across Spain, causing much havoc in Madrid. In Dublin 1·151 inches of rain fell on the 11th, and 1·266 inches on the 12th; but at several stations the precipitation was much greater—thus, between the 11th and 13th, 4·83 inches were measured at Churchstoke (Montgomeryshire), 4·36 inches at Hereford, 4·15 inches at Pershore (Worcestershire), 3·38 inches at Ross (Herefordshire), causing serious damage by floods on the Severn. At Fassaroe, in the Co. Wicklow, 3·44 inches of rain were recorded. On the 13th the highest temperature in Dublin was 45·5°, and when the clouds rolled away on the following day the loftier mountains south of the city were seen covered with snow.

The weather of the third week (16th-22nd) remained in a very disturbed condition. Heavy rain fell in many places, and temperature was rather low for the time of year. On the morning of Monday, the 17th, a deep and complex depression appeared off the west of Ireland, travelling towards N.N.E. and causing strong south-westerly gales throughout the country. The 21st and 22nd were very fine, bright days in Dublin, but at 4 A.M. of the latter day a severe thunderstorm, accompanied with heavy rain and hail, passed over London.

From the 23rd to the 29th the weather was again changeable, showery, and at times squally. On Monday, the 24th, rain fell heavily in London throughout to the amount of 1·15 inches. This was a fine day in Dublin, but the 25th was cold, with frequent drenching showers. Hail fell on the 26th and 28th, and on the 29th the clouds changed quickly in form as though surcharged with electricity. The last two days were cool and fair in Dublin, with light or moderate easterly breezes; but on Sunday, the 30th, a thunderstorm occurred in the Co. Meath, as well as in the N.E. of Ireland.

JUNE.—June, 1886 may be regarded as a month of average temperature, north-westerly winds, and a frequent but scanty rainfall. Cool, squally, winds blew on several days from points between W. and N.N.W. At first these fresh winds were accompanied by showers, but after the 14th only 1·48 inch of rain was registered on four days. About 42 per cent. of the rainfall for the whole month fell on the 2nd, when the measurement was ·540 inch. The amount of cloud was usually large, but the last few days were characterised by brilliant weather and intensely hot sunshine.

In Dublin the mean temperature (57·5°) was very nearly the average (57·7°); the mean dry bulb readings at 9 A.M. and 9 P.M. were, however, only 56·8°—the deficit being due to the low readings at 9 P.M.—55·8° on the average—in fact, the evenings were notably cold during the greater part of the month. In the twenty years ending with 1884, June was coldest in 1882 (M. T. = 55·8°) and warmest in 1865 (M. T. = 61·0°). In 1885, the M. T. was 56·2°; in the cold year, 1879, it was 55·9°.

The mean height of the barometer was 30·016 inches, or 0·092 inch above the average value for June—namely, 29·924 inches. The mercury rose to 30·325 inches at 9 A.M. of the 30th, and fell to 29·609 inches at 9 P.M. of the 11th. The observed range of atmospherical pressure was, therefore, 0·716 inches—that is, less than three quarters of an inch. The mean temperature deduced from

daily readings of the dry bulb thermometer at 9 A.M. and 9 P.M. was 56.8° , or 6.6° above the value for May, 1886; that calculated by Kaemtz's formula—from the means of the daily maxima and minima was 56.3° , or 0.3° below the average mean temperature for June, calculated in the same way, in the twenty years, 1865–84, inclusive (56.6°). The arithmetical mean of the maximal and minimal readings was 57.5° , compared with a twenty years' average of 57.7° . On the 28th the thermometer in the screen rose to 71.7° —wind E.; on the 27th the temperature fell to 46.3° —wind also E. The minimum on the grass was 39.5° on the 6th. The rainfall was 1.293 inches, distributed over fifteen days. The average rainfall for June in the twenty years, 1865–84, inclusive, was 1.962 inches, and the average number of rainy days was 14.7. The rainfall, therefore, was considerably below the average, while the rainy days were equal to it. In 1878 the rainfall in June was very large—5.058 inches on nineteen days—and in 1879, 4.046 inches fell on twenty-four days. On the other hand, in 1874, only .405 inch was measured on nine days.

The air was more or less foggy on the 4th and 11th. High winds prevailed on as many as six days, but there was no gale.

As happened in May, the month opened with unusually low temperature in many places, a keen N.E. wind, clouds and cold rain. Thunderstorms occurred in many parts of England. This unseasonable weather was caused by the passage across England and the North Sea of an irregularly-shaped depression. In the rear of this low-pressure system an anticyclone spread over the British Isles from the northward. Light breezes and fine weather, therefore, set in and continued until the close of the week. On the night of Friday, the 4th, the sheltered thermometer at Cambridge fell to 34° .

During the week ending Saturday, the 12th, the weather experienced in our islands and their neighbourhood—though fair as a rule—was at times rainy and unsettled, and on one occasion (Thursday, the 10th) a fog formed over the S.E. of England, which was unusually dense for the time of year. At the same time heavy rain fell in the district named. Next day, local electrical showers fell in Dublin, although no thunder was heard in the city.

The weather of the following week—ending Saturday, the 19th—was cool and very unsettled, with frequent showers at first. Thunderstorms were reported from some English stations. Between the 14th and 16th the weather was affected by a large depression, which crossed Scotland on its way to Norway. From the latter country it travelled in a S.E. direction to Germany and Central Europe. It caused strong squally W. to N.W. or N. winds. While the weather over our islands was thus showery and cool, that over Northern Europe was remarkably fine and hot. Maximal readings of 75° or upwards were frequently reported at the Scandinavian stations, and on Friday, the 18th, the thermometer rose to 81° at Haparanda and to 86° at Hernösand—both places on the Gulf of Bothnia. The last-mentioned reading was no less than 34° higher than the maximum recorded in London on the same day (only 52°). In Dublin the weather was comparatively fine and warmer than in England—the thermometer reaching 66.0° on the 18th and 71.6° on the 19th. On the evening of the latter day lofty cirri were seen illumined by the sun as late as 9 P.M.

In the course of the week ending Saturday, the 26th, a gradual but decided improvement in the weather was in progress over Western Europe. As the week advanced a high-pressure system moved slowly southwards from the N.W. coasts of the United Kingdom, temperature rose generally, and the weather became dry and at intervals very bright. Sunday, the 20th, was warm and fair in Ireland—the thermometer rising to 69.7° in Dublin, even with a N. wind; but in England it was dull and cold. On the 22nd an extensive depression again appeared in the N.W. and N., and at 11 p.m. intensely luminous cirri were seen in the northern sky. These clouds were, no doubt reflecting the sunshine to the northward. A similar phenomenon, in a less marked degree, appeared on the night of the 29th. Pressure remained low in the north until the 26th, but the isobars were not markedly cyclonic, and so very little rain fell, although the winds were high.

On the 27th the barometer rose generally and pressure became uniform, so that magnificent summer-like weather set in and continued to the close of the month. In Dublin light easterly sea-breezes tempered the heat of the sun, but on each of the last three days the thermometer rose to nearly 72° in the screen. Inland the readings were several degrees higher.

JULY.—Although it opened with brilliant, hot, summer-like weather, this month proved changeable, showery, and squally, with preponderating north-westerly to south-westerly winds. The contrast, as regards temperature, between the beginning and close, was very striking—the mean temperature of the first seven days being 66.1° , while that of the last week was only 56.2° —a falling off of nearly 10° . In Dublin the rainfall, although distributed over as many as eighteen days, was by no means heavy; and there was a complete absence of thunderstorms.

In Dublin the mean temperature (61.0°) was very nearly the average (60.7°); the mean dry bulb readings at 9 a.m. and 9 p.m. were 60.6° . In the twenty-one years ending with 1885, July was coldest in 1879 (M. T. = 57.2°) and warmest in 1868 (M. T. = 63.5°). In 1885, the M. T. was 60.8° ; in the year 1883 it was 57.9° .

The mean height of the barometer was 29.873 inches, or 0.049 inch below the average value for July—namely, 29.922 inches. The mercury rose to 30.346 inches at 9 a.m. of the 3rd, and fell to 29.355 inches at 11 p.m. of the 13th. The observed range of atmospherical pressure was, therefore, 0.991 inches—that is, very slightly less than an inch. The mean temperature deduced from daily readings of the dry bulb thermometer at 9 a.m. and 9 p.m. was 60.6° , or 3.8° above the value for June, 1886; that calculated by Kaemtz's formula from the means of the daily maxima and minima was 59.9° , or 0.3° above the average mean temperature for July, calculated in the same way, in the twenty years, 1865–84, inclusive (59.6°). The arithmetical mean of the maximal and minimal readings was 61.0° , compared with a twenty years' average of 60.7° . On the 3rd the thermometer in the screen rose to 78.7° —wind E.; on the 9th the temperature fell to 48.6° —wind N.N.W. The minimum on the grass was 42.0° on the same date. The rainfall was 1.722 inches, distributed over

18 days. The average rainfall for July in the twenty years 1865–84, inclusive, was 2·499 inches, and the average number of rainy days was 17·6. The rainfall, therefore, was considerably below the average, while the rainy days were equal to it. In 1880 the rainfall in July was very large—6·087 inches on 24 days—and in 1871, 4·391 inches fell on as many as 28 days. On the other hand, in 1870, only 5·39 inch was measured on 8 days, and in 1868 only 7·41 inch fell on but 5 days.

A solar halo was seen on the 29th. The atmosphere was foggy on the 2nd. High winds were noted on as many as ten days.

At the beginning of the month the distribution of atmospherical pressure over the British Isles and their neighbourhood was continuously anticyclonic, and the weather was bright with a high temperature. Even in Dublin the maximal shade readings on the first five days were 75·6°, 77·5°, 78·7°, 75·6°, and 75·7°, respectively; while in London the corresponding values were 73°, 79°, 83°, 86°, and 81°, the thermometer rising to 85° on the 6th and to 83° on the 7th, at a time when the weather had already become much cooler in Ireland. On Sunday, the 4th, the thermometer rose to 116° in the shade at Biskra in Algeria.

The hot dry weather which prevailed so generally until the 6th gave way gradually during the second week, the change beginning in the N. and W. It was caused by the transference of the high pressure area to a more southern position over France and Spain, and to the appearance in the north of cyclonic systems, which brought with them cloudy, showery conditions.

The weather of the week ending Saturday, July 17th, was very unsettled, with rain in all parts of the kingdom and a somewhat low temperature. The distribution of pressure was mainly cyclonic and the type westerly, the highest barometrical readings being found over France, the Bay of Biscay, or Spain. The centre of an important disturbance, in which the barometer was down to 29·10 inches, passed in an easterly direction across Scotland on the night of the 13th. As it came on, fresh S.W. gales were felt in many parts of Ireland and Scotland, and in its rear strong N.W. winds prevailed. Before it approached, a magnificent display of luminous cirri occurred on the evening of the 12th. The passage of this cyclonic system was accompanied with heavy rains—in Dublin, however, only 1·70 inch fell in the two days.

In the course of the week ending the 24th, the weather was again changeable and showery, with prevailing S. and S.W. winds and varying temperature. A number of depressions and subsidiary disturbances passed north-eastwards across the United Kingdom. The most serious of these systems had its centre off the coasts of Sligo and Donegal on the morning of the 22nd, when the barometer was down to 29·11 inches at Mullaghmore, and gales or strong winds from southerly (S.E. to S.W. and W.) points were blowing in Ireland. Next day, diverse air currents in Dublin indicated that a subsidiary depression was passing eastward south of the city. This brought rainy weather to the south of England, the north of France, and Holland, early on the 24th.

During the last week (ending Saturday, the 31st), broken, showery, cold or chilly weather prevailed. On Sunday, the 25th, very electrical cirro-stratus passed over Dublin in an upper current from S. or S.W., while the lower clouds (cumuli) and the wind came from N.E. A thunderstorm seemed imminent, but did not occur. In England, however, towards evening, severe thunderstorms and torrents of rain were reported—92 inch being registered in London, 1·4 inches at Cambridge, 1·81 at Oxford, and 2·20 at York. As this thunderstorm depression travelled away, fresh cold northerly winds spread over the kingdom. But other disturbances soon arrived from the Atlantic. At noon of the 29th a distinct solar halo was observed from Dublin, and later in the day drenching showers of rain fell locally. On the 31st several low-pressure areas amalgamated, forming a large depression, which travelled away towards Norway, leaving in its wake cold but fine weather.

AUGUST.—August, 1886, although changeable and at times cool and dull, was for the most part favourable. The leading characteristics of the month were—prevalent westerly and south-westerly winds, often blowing freshly as areas of low atmospherical pressure skirted the extreme western shores of Europe in a north-easterly direction, while the barometer remained high and steady over the Continent; clouded skies, particularly in Ireland, and rather low temperature until towards the close, when the weather became very hot in France and England and warm in Ireland and Scotland. In Dublin the rainfall and rainy days were both below the average, and there was again a complete absence of thunderstorms, although sheet lightning was seen on one occasion—namely, the evening of the 26th.

In Dublin the mean temperature (60·4°) was half a degree above the average (59·9°); the mean dry bulb readings at 9 a.m. and 9 p.m. were 59·7°. In the twenty-one years ending with 1885, August was coldest in 1881 (M. T. = 57·0°) and warmest in 1871 (M. T. = 62·0°). In 1885, the M. T. was only 57·1°; in the year 1879 (the cold year) it was 57·7°.

The mean height of the barometer was 29·964 inches, or 0·060 inch above the average value for August—namely, 29·904 inches. The mercury rose to 30·293 inches at 9 p.m. of the 19th, and fell to 29·344 inches at 9 a.m. of the 13th. The observed range of atmospherical pressure was, therefore, 0·949 inch—that is, slightly less than an inch. The mean temperature deduced from daily readings of the dry bulb thermometer at 9 a.m. and 9 p.m. was 59·7°, or 0·9° below the value for July, 1886; that calculated by Kaemtz's formula from the means of the daily maxima and minima was 59·3°, or 0·48 above the average mean temperature for August, calculated in the same way, in the twenty years, 1865–84, inclusive (58·9°). The arithmetical mean of the maximal and minimal readings was 60·4°, compared with a twenty years' average of 59·9°. On the 30th the thermometer in the screen rose to 75·6°—wind S.W.; on the 11th the temperature fell to 47·0°—wind W.N.W. The minimum on the grass was 42·0° on the same date. The rainfall was 1·503 inches, distributed over thirteen days. The average rainfall for August in the twenty years, 1865–84, inclusive, was 2·877 inches, and the average number of rainy days was 15·5. The rainfall and the rainy days, therefore, were both considerably below the average. In 1874 the rainfall in August was very large—4·946 inches on eighteen days—and in 1868, 4·745 inches fell on only thirteen days. On the other hand, in 1884, only 7·77 inch was measured on eight days.

A solar halo was seen on the 3rd. The atmosphere was foggy on the 20th and 23rd. High winds were noted on as many as eleven days. Sheet lightning was seen on the evening of the 26th.

The weather during the first week was changeable, with a good deal of cloud and some showers—from which Dublin was almost entirely exempt—variable winds, at first low and finally high temperatures.

In the second week, conditions were very unsettled, the weather squally and showery, and temperature for the most part low for the time of year. Barometrical pressure was usually highest to the S. of the United Kingdom, and in the course of the period two depressions of considerable interest appeared in our area. The first of these—a system of gradually increasing intensity—appeared in the Bay of Biscay on the 9th, then travelled north-eastwards to the north of Denmark, causing heavy rain in England. The second depression—one of diminishing intensity—came in over Ireland on the 12th; by the next morning the centre had reached Kerry and Cork, where the barometer was below 29.30 inches. It caused gales and rains in Ireland and severe thunderstorms in parts of England.

In the week ending Saturday, the 21st, the weather was again far from settled. The week commenced with S.W. winds, and squally showery weather—the wind blowing a gale in the extreme W. and N. of the kingdom. On Tuesday, the 17th, the barometer rose considerably in the west, and cool N.W. winds set in, with local showers and at Cambridge a heavy thunderstorm. Pressure remained high throughout the week, but there were local irregularities, which produced unsettled weather. One of these shallow depressions formed over the Irish Sea, on Saturday, the 21st, and caused a gloomy, wet day in the east of Ireland.

The weather of the fourth week (ending Saturday, 28th) was fine and dry over the greater part of England, but somewhat variable and cloudy in Ireland and Scotland. Atmospheric pressure was at first high, but a series of depressions soon began to pass in a north-easterly direction along our extreme western and northern coasts, notably on the 23th, when a S. gale occurred in the west of Ireland. With the advent of the southerly and south-westerly winds accompanying these Atlantic depressions, temperature rose decidedly and was generally rather above the average for the season. Over England the maxima frequently exceeded 75°, reaching 77° or 78° in the S.E. on the 22nd and 24th. In Dublin the highest reading for the week was 73.6° on the 26th.

During the last three days conditions were anticyclonic and quiet on the Continent and in England, where the heat became intense, but less settled in Ireland, as depressions continued to skirt our western seaboard. The maxima in London for these days were 80°, 87°, and 87° respectively; those in Dublin were 72.0°, 75.6°, and 71.6°.

The rainfall at Greystones, county Wicklow, during August, was 1.400 inches on only ten days.

SEPTEMBER.—Two distinct types of weather presented themselves during this month—cyclonic, rainy, and even stormy, from the 4th to the 13th, and again after the 24th; but anticyclonic, quiet, and dry, with easterly winds from the 14th to the 24th, inclusive. Temperature ranged about the average; rainfall was somewhat in excess, but it was distributed over only the usual number of days for September—namely, 15.

In Dublin the mean temperature (56.2°) was one-fifth of a degree above the average (56.0°); the mean dry bulb readings at 9 a.m. and 9 p.m. were 55.6°. In the twenty-one years ending with 1885, September was coldest in 1866 and 1882 (M.T. = 53.0°) and warmest in 1865 (M.T. = 61.4°). In 1885, the M. T. was only 54.4°; in the year 1879 (the cold year) it was 54.3°.

The mean height of the barometer was 29.978 inches, or 0.061 inch above the average value for September—namely, 29.917 inches. The mercury rose to 30.506 inches at 9 p.m. of the 15th, and fell to 29.448 inches at 12.30 p.m. of the 9th. The observed range of atmospheric pressure was therefore, 1.058 inches—that is, slightly more than an inch. The mean temperature deduced from daily readings of the dry bulb thermometer at 9 a.m. and 9 p.m. was 55.6°, or 4.1° below the value for August, 1886; that calculated by Kaemtz's formula from the means of the daily maxima and minima was 55.1°, or precisely equal to the average mean temperature for September, calculated in the same way, in the twenty years, 1865–84, inclusive (55.1°). The arithmetical mean of the maximal and minimal readings was 56.2°, compared with a twenty years' average of 56.0°. On the 13th the thermometer in the screen rose to 69.5°—wind S.W.; on the 23rd the temperature fell to 39.0°—wind N.N.W. The minimum on the grass was 32.5° on the same date. The rainfall was 2.471 inches, distributed over 15 days. The average rainfall for September in the twenty years, 1865–84, inclusive, was 2.289 inches, and the average number of rainy days was 14.5. The rainfall and the rainy days, therefore were both perceptibly above the average. In 1871 the rainfall in September was very large—4.048 inches on, however, only 13 days—and in 1869, 3.957 inches fell on 21 days. On the other hand, in 1865, only .056 inch was measured on only 3 days. This last was the driest month recorded in Dublin during at least the last quarter of a century.

A lunar rainbow was seen on the 11th. The atmosphere was foggy on the 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 20th and 28th. High winds were noted on as many as 12 days. Sheet lightning was seen on the evenings of the 26th and 27th. Thunder and lightning occurred on the 4th in the neighbourhood of Dublin, and distant thunder was heard on the 5th also.

The month opened with fine weather, high barometer readings, and warmth. Some of the maximal temperatures over England were as high as 87°, and on the Continent even this heat was exceeded on several occasions. On Saturday, the 4th, an irregular depression travelled northwards across the S.W. of England, Wales, and Ireland, causing severe thunderstorms and heavy rain.

During the week ending Saturday, the 11th, the weather was unsettled. At the beginning local thunderstorms were reported. After the 6th atmospheric pressure was low off the N.W. of Ireland, high over France and Germany. During this period three well-marked depressions passed by our extreme N.W. and W. coasts. These caused S. and S.W. gales or high winds, and heavy downpours of rain in most parts of Ireland and Scotland, while conditions were less unsettled in England.

Early in the third week (that ending Saturday, the 18th), an important change took place in the distribution of pressure, and consequently in the weather also. After a well-marked but shallow depression had travelled quickly north-eastwards across Ireland and Scotland on the 13th, a large anti-cyclone came in from the Atlantic, producing N. and E. winds, dry and cool weather. On the night of the 15th-16th temperature fell to 33° at Leith, and next night frost was reported from the N. and E. of Scotland. The barometer rose above 30.6 inches near the centre of the anticyclone. In Dublin the highest reading was 30.51 inches on the night of the 15th.

From the 19th to the 24th the meteorological conditions were anticyclonic in the N., cyclonic in the S. On Monday, the 20th, a system of low pressure formed over the Bay of Biscay, and the easterly wind freshened considerably. This depression lay for two days over Brittany and then dispersed. On the 25th, temperature rose, and conditions became mild, unsettled and showery, as depressions began to appear off the west coast of Ireland.

Sunday, the 26th, was very fine in Ireland, rainy in England; but at night a deep and extensive depression came in from the Atlantic, bringing with it gales, rain, and lightning. From this time to the close of the month, squally, showery weather continued in Ireland.

At Greystones, county Wicklow, the rainfall for the month was 2.614 inches, distributed over seventeen days.

OCTOBER.—A genial month as regards temperature, but rain fell heavily and well-nigh incessantly during the first three weeks—5.582 inches being measured on 18 out of the first 19 days. It is to be observed that October is, on the average, the month of the greatest precipitation in Dublin—3.025 inches. On the 23rd the barometer rose decidedly, and drying winds from E.N.E., of considerable strength set in, and continued to blow for several days. Some bright sunshine was enjoyed at the close of the month, the 31st being an exceptionally fine, clear day.

In Dublin the mean temperature (52.0°) was 2° above the average (50.0°); the mean dry bulb readings at 9 a.m. and 9 p.m. were 51.4°. In the twenty-one years ending with 1885, October was coldest in 1880 (M. T. = 45.4°) and warmest in 1876 (M. T. = 53.1°). In 1885, the M. T. was only 45.5°; in the year 1879 (the cold year) it was 49.7°.

The mean height of the barometer was 29.760 inches, or 0.087 inch below the average value for October—namely, 29.847 inches. The mercury rose to 30.378 inches at 9 p.m. of the 24th, and fell to 28.530 inches at 1 p.m. of the 15th. The observed range of atmospherical pressure was therefore, 1.848 inches—that is, more than an inch and three-quarters. The mean temperature deduced from daily readings of the dry bulb thermometer at 9 a.m. and 9 p.m. was 51.4°, or 4.2° below the value for September, 1886; that calculated by Kaemtz's formula [from the means of the daily maxima and minima was 51.2°, or precisely 2° above the average mean temperature for October, calculated in the same way, in the twenty years, 1865-84, inclusive (49.2°). The arithmetical mean of the maximal and minimal readings was 52.0°, compared with a twenty years' average of 50.0°. On the 5th the thermometer in the screen rose to 64.6°—wind S.S.E.; on the 22nd the temperature fell to 36.2°—wind calm. The minimum on the grass was 29.0° on the same date. The rainfall was 6.163 inches, distributed over as many as 24 days. The average rainfall for October in the twenty years, 1865-84, inclusive, was 3.025 inches, and the average number of rainy days was 17.2. The rainfall and the rainy days, therefore, were both largely above the average—the rainfall more than one hundred per cent. In 1880 the rainfall in October was very large—7.358 inches on, however, only 15 days; 2.736 inches being measured on the 27th alone in that year—and in 1875, 7.049 inches fell on 26 days. On the other hand, in 1884, only .834 inch was measured on but 14 days. In 1868 also—the "warm year"—the October rainfall was only .856 inch on 15 days.

A lunar halo was seen on the 6th. The atmosphere was foggy on the 6th and 8th. High winds were noted on as many as 13 days, gales prevailing on four days. Hail fell on the 10th.

At the beginning of the month southerly winds prevailed, and the weather was fine in the east of Ireland and in England. On the 1st the thermometer in the shade rose to 80° at Cambridge, 78° in London, 73° at Oxford, and 72° at Loughborough, but only to 59.7° in Dublin. On the evening of the 2nd a depression off the west of Ireland brought to that country a southerly gale and heavy rains.

The weather of the week ending Saturday, the 9th, was for the most part cloudy, unsettled, and rainy in Ireland and Scotland; but in England the earlier part of the period was fine and unusually warm for the time of year. On Monday, the 4th, the thermometer exceeded 75° in many parts of England, the highest reading of all being 80° in London and at Cambridge. On Saturday a deep depression appeared in the west moving northwards and occasioning fresh S.E. or S. gales and rain in most places.

During the week ending the 16th, very unsettled conditions were prevalent. Strong winds or gales and heavy rains were experienced in nearly all parts of the United Kingdom, and on the 15th and 16th a storm of exceptional violence caused much damage to life and property. Atmospherical pressure was continuously highest in Spain, while several depressions appeared over the British Islands—the most important being that of the 15th and 16th. This system advanced over Ireland on the night of the 14th, the readings of the barometer in its centre ultimately falling as low as 28.5 inches. In the course of Friday morning (the 15th) the disturbance travelled eastwards to the Irish Sea, with its centre a short distance north of Dublin, where the wind was light and fitful, blowing first from S.E. and then from W.S.W. After remaining almost stationary for some hours, the cyclone (for such it was) travelled in a S.E. direction to the south of England and afterwards to the north-east of France, finally dispersing over Holland on the 17th. The depression produced fresh E. gales in the north and fresh S.E. or S. gales in the east of our islands; but over the English Channel, the Bay of Biscay and the S.W. of England the wind blew a most severe gale, first from S.W. and afterwards from N.W. or N. During the progress of the disturbance heavy rain was experienced in nearly all parts of the United Kingdom. In Dublin the rainfall on the 14th and 15th was 2.090

inches, or one-third of the precipitation for the whole month and more than two-thirds of the average rainfall for October.

The weather of the period from the 17th to the 23rd was much quieter than that of the preceding week, but conditions were by no means settled, and several shallow depressions appeared, chiefly in the S. Temperature did not differ greatly from the normal, but towards the close night frosts were reported from the inland parts of Great Britain and Ireland—in Dublin the minimum was $36\cdot2^{\circ}$ on the 22nd.

In the last week (24th–31st) atmospherical pressure was highest ($30\cdot5$ inches, or upwards) over Scandinavia and the Baltic, and, as a rule, lowest over the Bay of Biscay and off the S. and S.W. of Ireland. Easterly winds prevailed, of greatest strength on the 25th. In Dublin the weather was at first dry and bracing, afterwards changeable, with sunny spells by day and rain or showers by night. The 31st was a brilliant, summer-like day.

NOVEMBER.—A mild, open month, but generally dull and damp. Rain fell frequently, but the amounts were on no occasion very large. During the prevalence of a remarkable anticyclone in the fourth week temperature was singularly high in Dublin for the time of year, whereas in London dense fogs and sharp frosts were reported daily.

In Dublin the mean temperature ($46\cdot4^{\circ}$) was—as in October— 2° above the average ($44\cdot4^{\circ}$); the mean dry bulb readings at 9 A.M. and 9 P.M. were $45\cdot9^{\circ}$. In the twenty-one years ending with 1885, November was coldest in 1878 (M. T. = $38\cdot2^{\circ}$) and warmest in 1881 (M. T. = $50\cdot39$). In 1885 the M. T. was $45\cdot9^{\circ}$, or actually $0\cdot4^{\circ}$ above that of the preceding October; in the year 1879 (the cold year) it was $43\cdot9^{\circ}$.

The mean height of the barometer was $29\cdot887$ inches, or $0\cdot020$ inch above the average value for November—namely, $29\cdot867$ inches. The mercury rose to $30\cdot776$ inches at 9 P.M. of the 24th, and fell to $29\cdot124$ inches at 11 P.M. of the 5th. The observed range of atmospherical pressure was, therefore, $1\cdot652$ inches—that is, more than an inch and one-half. Atmospherical pressure had not been as high in Dublin as it was on the 24th since 9 A.M. of March 5th, 1833, when the reading was $30\cdot791$ inches. On January 18, 1882, the remarkably high value of $30\cdot935$ inches was recorded at 10:30 P.M. The mean temperature deduced from daily readings of the dry bulb thermometer at 9 A.M. and 9 P.M. was $45\cdot9^{\circ}$, or $5\cdot5$ below the value for October, 1886; that calculated by Kaemtz's formula from the means of the daily maxima and minima was $45\cdot7^{\circ}$, or precisely 2° above the average mean temperature for November, calculated in the same way, in the twenty years, 1865–84, inclusive ($43\cdot7^{\circ}$). The arithmetical mean of the maximal and minimal readings was $46\cdot4^{\circ}$, compared with a twenty years' average of $44\cdot4^{\circ}$. On the 3rd the thermometer in the screen rose to $58\cdot5^{\circ}$ —the wind S.S.W.; on the 7th the temperature fell to $34\cdot1^{\circ}$ —wind N.W. The minimum on the grass was $27\cdot9^{\circ}$ on the same date. The rainfall was $2\cdot180$ inches, distributed over as many as 18 days. The average rainfall for November in the twenty years, 1865–84, inclusive, was $2\cdot312$ inches, and the average number of rainy days was 16·8. The rainfall, therefore, was somewhat below the average, while the number of rainy days was slightly in excess. In 1876 the rainfall in November was large— $3\cdot614$ inches on 20 days; and in 1872 $3\cdot414$ inches fell on as many as 24 days. On the other hand, in 1870, only $1\cdot218$ inches were measured on 11 days. In 1868 also—the “warm year”—and in 1871, the November rainfall was only $1\cdot258$ inches, on 19 and 14 days respectively. The amount of precipitation varies almost less in this than in any other month.

A solar halo was seen on the 1st and a lunar halo on the 2nd. The atmosphere was foggy on the 17th, 18th, 22nd, 23rd, 25th, 26th, and 27th. High winds were noted on 8 days, gales prevailing on 2 days. Hail fell on the 10th and 11th, and snow and sleet on the morning of the 9th. A thunderstorm, with heavy rain and hail, passed a few miles S.E. of Dublin early in the morning of the 10th. At 7:45 P.M. of the 2nd a brilliant meteor flashed across the southern portion of the heavens from N.E. to S.W.

In the week ending Saturday, the 6th, changeable weather prevailed, depending on a south-westerly type of pressure distribution, a large area of high barometrical readings being found over central and southern Europe, while a series of depressions skirted the W. and N.W. coasts of the British Isles. On the 5th, however, a deep depression formed over England, causing northerly winds and low temperature in Ireland. At 8 A.M. of the 6th the barometer was below $28\cdot90$ inches in Yorkshire and the midland counties of England.

During the second week (7th–13th inclusive) very changeable, wet weather was experienced in Great Britain, while it was colder, with northerly winds in Ireland. Numerous, although not deep, depressions moved along very erratic paths over the former country—some of the systems travelling from N. to S., while others pursued an opposite course, moving from S. to N. as tangents to a high pressure system, which held over Scandinavia. On the morning of the 9th, local cold and sharp frost held in central Ireland, and sleet and snow fell heavily in and about Dublin, the mountains being covered with snow for the first time this season. Early next morning a thunderstorm, accompanied with heavy rain and hail, came in upon the coast at Bray and Greystones, Co. Wicklow, from N.E. Hail fell in Dublin later in the day, as also on the 11th.

The weather of the third week (14th–21st inclusive) was much quieter and finer, although small amounts of rain still fell from time to time. At first the barometer was low generally, and on Wednesday, the 17th, a rather deep subsidiary depression passed eastwards across Wales and England, causing rains and high winds in those countries, whereas a bright bracing day was experienced in Dublin. On the 18th, however, the barometer rose briskly, and an anticyclone began to form over France. This system gradually became intensified, spreading northward over the United Kingdom, where it finally remained stationary for several days.

During the fourth week, from the 21st to the 27th, the distribution of pressure, temperature, winds, and weather, were all continuously anticyclonic. In Ireland the winds were at first S.W., and dull, mild weather prevailed, but in the S.E. of England dense fogs and low temperature accompanied the

high pressure system—early on the 24th minima were recorded as low as 27° at Cambridge, 28° at Oxford and in London. On the evening of this day the barometer read 30·79 inches at Birr Castle, Parsonstown, and 30·78 inches in Dublin. The London fogs during this calm period were of exceptional density, but of strange inconstancy as regards their distribution in that metropolis.

The last few days witnessed the gradual retreat of the anticyclone—which was also slowly dispersing—to the Continent, and the re-establishment of steep gradients for S.W. and W. winds in the British Islands and Scandinavia. At the close of the month temperature was falling decidedly and snow showers had set in over Scotland.

DECEMBER.—This was a cold month; the weather being especially unsettled and changeable. The most remarkable feature in the meteorology of the month was the phenomenal atmospherical depression which passed across the North of Ireland, and afterwards the North of England, on Wednesday, the 8th. Near the centre of this system the barometer fell below 27·50 inches—a reduction of pressure almost as great as that which occurred on the 26th of January, 1884, when the reading 27·334 inches was recorded at Ochtertyre, near Crieff, in Perthshire. The coldness of the month may be estimated from the fact that the thermometer fell to or below 32° in the screen on twelve nights, and on the grass on no fewer than twenty-nine nights.

In Dublin the mean temperature (37·9°) was 3·4° below the average (41·3°); the mean dry bulb readings at 9 A.M. and 9 P.M. were 37·2°. In the twenty-one years ending with 1885, December was coldest in 1878 (M.T.=32·8°) and warmest in 1865 (M.T.=46·2°). In 1874, the M. T. was 36·8°, and in 1870 it was 37·3°. In 1885, the M. T. was 42·0°; in the year 1879 (the cold year) it was 37·9°, or exactly the same as in 1886.

The mean height of the barometer was 29·682 inches, or 0·200 inch below the average value for December—namely, 29·882 inches. The mercury rose to 30·501 inches at 9 A.M. of the 31st, and fell to 27·758 inches at 2 30 P.M. of the 8th. The observed range of atmospherical pressure was, therefore, as much as 2·743 inches—that is, nearly two inches and three-quarters. Atmospherical pressure had not been as low in Dublin as it was on the 8th for more than fifty years, at all events. The mean temperature deduced from daily readings of the dry bulb thermometer at 9 A.M. and 9 P.M. was 37·2°, or 8·7° below the value for November, 1886; that calculated by Kaentz's formula from the means of the daily maxima and minima was 37·0°, or precisely 3·5° below the average mean temperature for December, calculated in the same way, in the twenty years, 1865–84, inclusive (40·5°). The arithmetical mean of the maximal and minimal readings was 37·9°, compared with a twenty years' average of 41·3°. On the 6th the thermometer in the screen rose to 53·2°—wind W. by S.; on the 21st the temperature fell to 22·0°—wind W.N.W. The minimum on the grass was 16·8° on the same date. The rainfall was 3·348 inches, distributed over as many as 21 days. The average rainfall for December in the twenty years, 1865–84, inclusive, was 2·516 inches, and the average number of rainy days was 17·0. The rainfall and the rainy days, therefore, were both considerably above the average. In 1876 the rainfall in December was very large—7·566 inches on 22 days; in 1872 4·932 inches fell on as many as 24 days; and in 1868 (which was otherwise a fine and dry year), 4·749 inches fell on as many as 27 days. On the other hand, in 1867, only ·771 of an inch was measured on 13 days; and in 1871, the December rainfall was only ·797 of an inch on 15 days. But in 1885, only ·742 of an inch of rain was measured on but 10 days.

Solar halos were seen on the 2nd, 13th, and 25th, and lunar halos on the 2nd, 7th, and 10th. The atmosphere was foggy on the 3rd, 14th, 15th, 16th, 20th, 21st, 29th, 30th, and 31st. High winds were noted on 16 days, gales prevailing on 4 days. Hail fell on the 8th, 16th, and 20th, and snow or sleet on the 1st, 8th, 14th, 16th, 18th, 19th, and 28th.

At the beginning of the month, N.W. winds and cold weather prevailed in the rear of an atmospherical depression which lay over the south of Scandinavia. On the night of Friday, the 3rd, a V-shaped depression passed eastwards across Ireland, causing rain and sudden changes of temperature. Then came two days of high temperature, and strong westerly winds, and dull damp weather. Tuesday, the 7th, was much colder and clearer, but, towards night, the barometer fell fast and the wind backed to S. and S.S.E., as one of the deepest depressions of modern times approached Ireland from the Atlantic.

On Wednesday, December 8, the centre of one of the deepest and most extensive atmospherical depressions observed during the present century, passed across the north of Ireland in an easterly direction. At 8 A.M. the centre was apparently close to Belmullet, County Mayo, where the barometer then stood at 27·58 inches, or as much as 1·85 inches below the reading recorded at that station only 24 hours previously. From Mayo the system travelled eastwards across Ulster, reaching the south of Scotland and north-west of England at 6 P.M., when the barometer read only 27·41 inches at Barrow-in-Furness.

In Dublin the minimal pressure was recorded at 2 30 P.M., and was 27·758 inches. At the Ordnance Survey Office, Phoenix Park, the minimum was 27·766 inches, being the lowest reading on record at that station since 1829. At Armagh Observatory the minimum was reached at 1 P.M., and was 27·446 inches (27·214 inches at an elevation of 208 feet above mean sea level and approximate air temperature 48·0°).

During the remarkable depression of Saturday, January 26th, 1884, when the barometer receded to 27·332 inches at Ochtertyre, near Crieff, in Perthshire, the lowest pressure in Dublin was 28·150 inches. In the hurricane of January 6 and 7, 1839, the reading was not even so low—viz., 28·290 inches at the Ordnance Survey Office, Phoenix Park. At that station, however, six weeks previously, on November 28, 1838, the barometer had fallen to 27·769 inches at 8 P.M. But even this phenomenal value was ·011 inch in excess of that registered in the city of Dublin on Wednesday, December 8, 1886—27·758 inches, a reading no less than 3·018 inches below that recorded a fortnight previously, namely, 30·776 inches at 9 P.M. of Wednesday, November 24, 1886. On February 5, 1870, the reading of 27·330 inches was recorded on the Cunard steamer *Tariffa*, in the Atlantic, in lat. 51° N. and long. 24° W.

The gales attending the depression of December 8 were very fierce from S.W. to N.W. on the English coasts, and so were the easterly gales in the North of Scotland, but in and about Dublin no violent storm occurred during the passage of the cyclone.

The weather of the week ending Saturday the 18th, was very unsettled. Rain or sleet fell frequently over England, and showers of snow were reported from Scotland nearly every day. On Tuesday and Wednesday, the 14th and 15th, an area of low pressure advanced over the southern portion of Ireland and the greater part of England. It caused strong easterly winds and heavy downpours of cold rain, sleet, and snow. On the morning of the 16th also, snow, sleet, and hail fell heavily, though but locally, in Dublin. After this, a severe frost set in, culminating on the 21st in Ireland and on the 22nd in England. On the former day a depression appeared off the N.W. of Ireland, whence it travelled eastwards to Scotland, producing a thaw and heavy rain, with thunderstorms in some places. Temperature now became very unsteady, the changes as the S.W. current of wind alternated with the N.W. or N. current being sudden and at times considerable. Christmas Day proved fair and bright, with a light frost.

On Sunday, the 26th, a deep depression appeared at the entrance to the English Channel, along which it travelled towards E.N.E. with great rapidity. In Dublin the day was dull and cold, and frost set in towards night, but no precipitation occurred. In England, however, violent gales prevailed, and a downpour of rain was followed by a snowstorm of unexampled severity. At Southampton, in 19 hours, the precipitation amounted to 2.88 inches of rain water, at Plymouth 1.8 inches of rain fell in 6 hours during a N.E. gale, and in London nearly 2 inches of rain were measured. The wet snow clinging to telegraph wires and trees caused great damage. On the 29th an anticyclone came in over Ireland from the westward, and as it advanced dense fogs and sharp frost set in—particularly in England, where temperature fell below 20° ere the year closed.

The rainfall was considerably in excess of the average annual measurement of the twenty years 1865-84, inclusive—viz., 28.015 inches. It will be remembered that the rainfall in 1884 was very exceptionally small—20.467 inches, the only approach to this measurement in Dublin being in 1870, when only 20.859 inches fell. In six of the twenty years in question the rainfall was less than 26 inches, and in 1885 it was 26.614 inches. Only twice since these records commenced has the rainfall in Dublin exceeded that of 1886—namely, in 1872, when 35.566 inches fell on 238 days, and in 1880, when 34.512 inches were measured on, however, only 188 days. The precipitation was nearly as great as in the past year in 1876, when 32.663 inches fell on 195 days, and in 1877, when 32.146 inches fell on 229 days.

In 1886 there were 220 rainy days, or days upon which not less than .01 inch of rain (one-hundredth of an inch) was measured. This was largely in excess of the average number of rainy days, which was 194.6 in the twenty years, 1865-84, inclusive. Included in the rainy days are 40 on which snow or sleet fell, and 41 on which there was hail. In January hail was observed on 14 days and in March on 8 days. Snow or sleet fell on 18 days in January and on 9 days in March. Thunder and lightning occurred on only three occasions during the year—twice in September and once in November.

The rainfall was distributed as follows:—7.290 inches fell on 60 days in the first quarter, 8.289 inches on 51 days in the second, 5.696 inches on 46 days in the third, and 11.691 on 63 days in the fourth and last quarter. The preponderance of the fall in the fourth quarter is more than accounted for by a downpour, amounting to 6.163 inches, which occurred on 24 days in October. More than an inch of rain (upwards of 105 tons of water per statute acre) fell on the 11th of May (1.151 inches), the 12th of May (1.266 inches), and the 15th of October (1.560 inches).

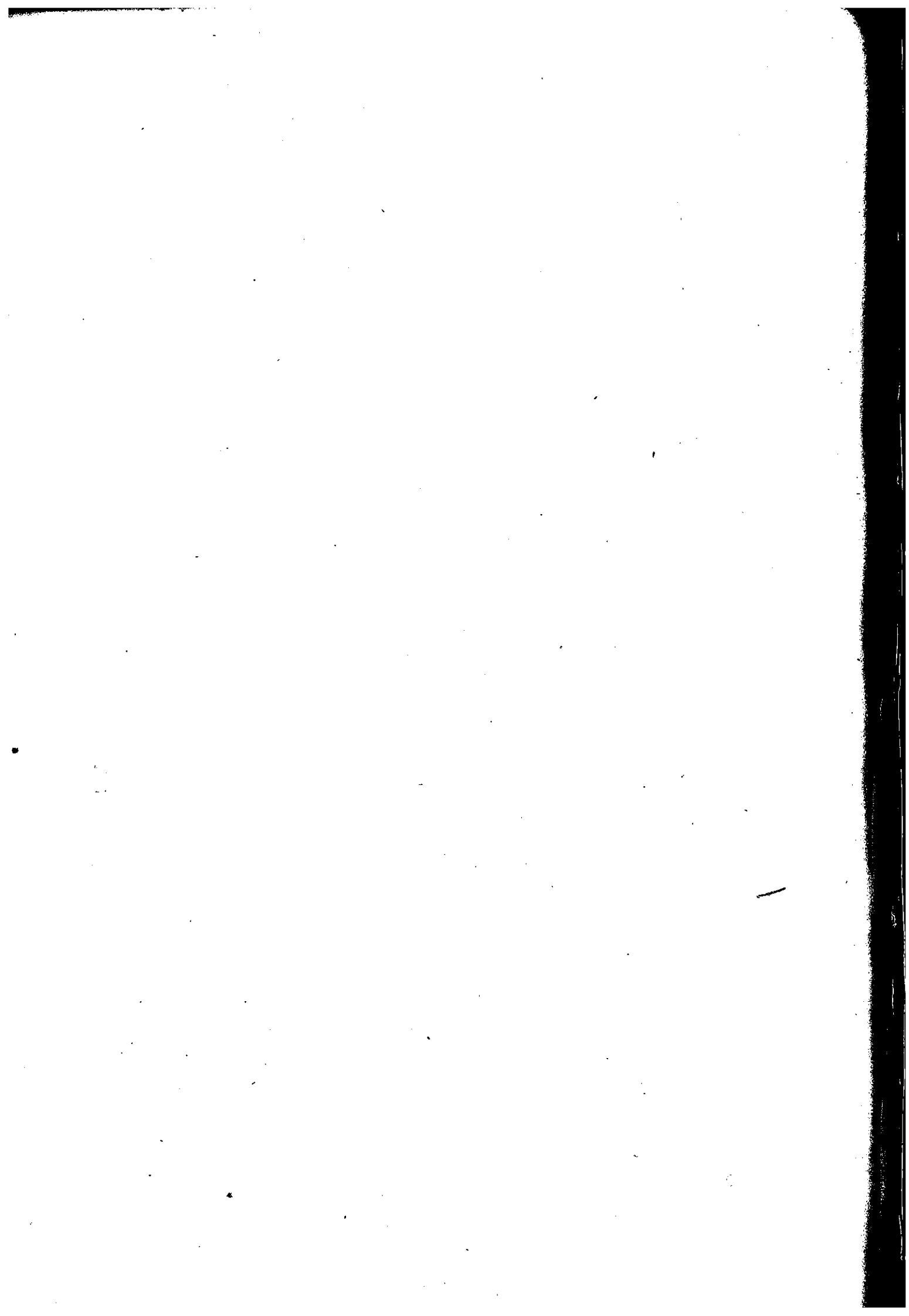

1852 to 1871—The English birth and death rates, as above, were used, deducting the number of emigrants according to the returns obtained by the Registrar-General for Ireland, and allowing for excess over Census numbers for 1861 and 1871 as explained for the last period.

1872 to 86—By adding the Births registered in each year to the estimated population for the previous year and deducting the deaths and emigration.
