



Recorded Crime

Quarter 4 2009

Robberies rise by almost a quarter

When comparing Quarter 4 2009 (Q4 2009) with Quarter 4 2008, Group 06 *Robbery, Extortion and Hijacking Offences* increased by 23.0%. The only other offence groups which increased over this time period were Group 05 *Kidnapping and Related Offences* and Group 07 *Burglary and Related Offences*. There were notable decreases in Group 04 *Dangerous or Negligent Acts*, Group 10 *Controlled Drug Offences* and Group 15 *Offences against Government, Justice Procedures and Organisation of Crime*. See figure 1.

When comparing the annual figures for 2008 and 2009 a decrease of over a fifth (-20.8%) was observed in the number of recorded Group 04 *Dangerous or Negligent Acts Offences*.

Group 01 - Homicides

There were 12 recorded *Murder and Manslaughter* offences in Q4 2009, representing a decrease of 33.3% on the same quarter in 2008. When considering yearly totals, there was no increase in the number of *Murder and Manslaughter* offences recorded in 2009, when compared with 2008. For *Dangerous driving leading to death* offences, there was a decrease from 34 in 2008 to 25 in 2009. This may be due to the fact that all road collision investigations for this period have not yet concluded, which will result in some being reclassified as homicide. Figure 2 provides an indication of the trends in the annualised (i.e. the 12-month running total to the end of a quarter) figures for all offence types within this group.

Group 02 - Sexual Offences

The number of offences in this group decreased slightly from 293 in Q4 2008 to 287 in Q4 2009. However a full year comparison shows an increase of over 4% in *Sexual offences* from 1,407 in 2008 to 1,464 in 2009. *Rape of a male or female* offences rose by over 10%, from 342 to 377, in this 12 month period.

Group 03 - Attempts/Threats to Murder, Assaults, Harassments and Related Offences

The number of *Other Assaults* decreased by almost 16% from 2,932 in Q4 2008 to 2,466 in Q4 2009. *Harassment and related offences* fell from 626 to 525 between Q4 2008 and the corresponding quarter in 2009. In comparing the 12-month totals for 2008 and 2009 *Assault causing harm, poisoning* fell from 3,850 in 2008 to 3,630 in 2009.

Group 04 - Dangerous or Negligent Acts

In Q4 2009, recorded *Dangerous or Negligent Acts* offences decreased by over 31% to 3,308, when compared with Q4 2008. This decrease mainly relates to *Driving/In charge of a vehicle while over legal alcohol limit* offences, which decreased from 4,363 (Q4 2008) to 3,013 (Q4 2009). When considering the yearly total, there were 15,509 recorded Group 04 offences, representing a decrease of 20.8% on the 2008 figure.



Group 05 - Kidnapping and Related Offences

It is important to note that a new offence type *Human trafficking offences* was added to this category, which will affect the total number of offences recorded in this group. Comparing figures for 2008 with 2009, *False imprisonment offences* increased from 47 to 55, an increase of 17.0%.

Group 06 - Robbery, Extortion and Hijacking Offences

The quarterly figure for *Robbery, extortion and hijacking offences* rose by 23.0%, from 525 in Q4 2008 to 646 in Q4 2009. *Robbery from the person* offences rose by over a third (+33.5%) from 263 in Q4 2008 to 351 in Q4 2009. There were 1,028 recorded offences of *Robbery of an establishment or institution* in all of 2009, a rise of over 18% on the 2008 figure.

Group 07 - Burglary and Related Offences

In Q4 2009, there were 6,847 recorded *Burglary (not aggravated)* offences representing an increase of 556 (+8.8%) on the number recorded in Q4 2008. Possession of an article (with intent to burgle, steal, demand) offences increased by almost 39% between Q4 2008 and Q4 2009, from 78 to 108. In the year ending December 2009, recorded *Aggravated burglary* offences increased by 11.7% to 363 when compared with 2008. The annualised totals for *Burglary and related offences* have been increasing continuously since Q1 2009. See figure 3.

Group 08 - Theft and Related Offences

Theft/Taking of vehicle and related offences decreased from 3,466 in Q4 2008 to 2,908 in Q4 2009, a decrease of over 16%. The annual figure for *Theft from shop* rose by 517 (+2.6%) from 20,098 to 20,615 between 2008 and 2009.

Group 09 - Fraud, Deception and Related Offences

There were 1,072 recorded *Fraud, deception and related offences* in Q4 2009. This is a decrease of 184 (-14.6%) on the same period in Q4 2008. In 2009, *Fraud, deception and related offences* decreased by almost 10% when compared with 2008, from 5,410 to 4,890.

Group 10 - Controlled Drug Offences

In Q4 2009, there were 4,529 recorded *Controlled drug offences*, a decrease of 19.3% on the Q4 2008 total. There were 3,365 recorded offences of *Possession of drugs for personal use* in Q4 2009, a decrease of 23.1% on the corresponding figure in Q4 2008. The annual figure for *Cultivation or manufacture of drugs* rose by almost a quarter (+24.8%) between 2008 and 2009.

Group 11 - Weapons and Explosives Offences

There were 1,107 offences in Group 11- *Weapons and explosives offences*, in Q4 2009, a decrease of 0.2% on Q4 2008. *Possession of a firearm* offences rose from 92 in Q4 2008 to 101 in Q4 2009, an increase of 9.8%.

Group 12 - Damage to Property and to the Environment

Recorded *Arson* offences rose by 31.8% from 509 in Q4 2008 to 671 in Q4 2009. The largest number of offences recorded in this group was for *Criminal damage (not arson)*. The annual figure for these offences decreased by 7.6%, from 42,193 in 2008 to 38,985 in 2009.


Group 13 - Public Order and other Social Code Offences

Recorded *Public order and other social code offences* fell by 8.5% from 14,884 in Q4 2008 to 13,624 in Q4 2009. The most frequently occurring offences in this group were under *Disorderly conduct*, which have fallen from 13,019 in Q4 2008 to 11,722 in Q4 2009. This is equivalent to approximately 130 *Disorderly conduct* offences a day in Q4 2009.

Group 15 - Offences against Government, Justice Procedures and Organisation of Crime

There were 2,004 *Offences against government, justice procedures and organisation of crime* recorded in Q4 2009, a decrease of over 30% when compared with the same period in 2008.

Background Notes

Introduction The Crime Incidents, Quarter 4 2009 release provides provisional figures for the number of offences recorded by An Garda Síochána based on the Irish Crime Classification System (ICCS) but excluding elements of Group 4 (*Dangerous or negligent acts*), and all of Groups 14 (*Road and traffic offences (Not elsewhere classified or nec)*) and Group 16 (*Offences not elsewhere classified*). Figures are provided from Quarter 1 2006 to Quarter 4 2009. The information supplied in this report refers only to crime incidents known to An Garda Síochána and recorded as such in the Garda PULSE (Police Using Leading Systems Effectively) system. Because of timing issues with respect to the extraction of data, figures may be revised subsequent to this publication.

Crime recording Incidents reported or which become known to members of An Garda Síochána are recorded when, on the balance of probability, a Garda determines that a criminal offence defined by law has taken place, and there is no credible evidence to the contrary. If it is subsequently determined that a criminal offence did not take place, the criminal offence recorded is invalidated and is not counted in the statistics. If a person makes a report and subsequently withdraws it by stating that the criminal act did not take place, then this too is invalidated unless there is evidence to suggest that, by reasonable probability, the offence has taken place.

For criminal offences where victim confirmation is required (e.g. assault, fraud), a criminal offence is recorded only where the victim confirms the offence or where there is evidence to suggest that by reasonable probability it occurred. Another important feature of a recorded offence is that it is based on the date reported to, or that it became known to, the Gardaí. This has major implications for some offence types. Notable amongst these are sexual offences, as it has often been the case that such incidents have been reported to An Garda Síochána many years (sometimes decades) after the event(s). Thus a sexual assault, which occurred in 1960, would be included in the statistics for 2006 if it was first reported in that year.

Crime classification A criminal offence is classified as a particular offence type at the initial recording of that offence. However, upon investigation, it may later become apparent that an alternative offence type should be used. In this event, the record is amended to reflect this. Re-classification on the basis of court proceedings only occurs in relation to homicide offences. A murder offence is reclassified as manslaughter when a charge of manslaughter commences or when a murder charge results in a conviction for manslaughter. It is also possible, though more rare, that an incident originally classified as manslaughter may be re-classified as murder. Also, a re-classification to a homicide offence occurs when, for example, a serious assault has been recorded and, some time later, the victim dies as a consequence of the assault.

General counting rules Crime counting rules are applied to all criminal offences for the purposes of the statistics. The following are the main rules relevant to the quarterly figures:

Primary Offence Rule: Where two or more criminal offences are disclosed in a single episode, it is the primary criminal offence that is counted. The primary offence is that offence which the greater penalty may apply. Where offences have similar penalties, offences against the person take precedence over offences against property for the purpose of determining the primary offence.

One Offence Counts Per Victim: One offence counts per victim involved with the exceptions of cheque or credit card fraud and burglary. Under certain circumstances, the cheque or credit card exception necessitates that a series of these offences counts as one crime where the originating bank ultimately suffers the loss. The burglary exception dictates that one burglary offence is counted where property belonging to two or more victims is stolen (or damaged) during a single burglary.

Continuous Series Involving the Same Victim and Same Offender: A continuous series of offences against the same victim involving the same offender counts as one offence.
