New Series shows 5% increase in average weekly earnings

This new CSO Release shows that average weekly earnings of full-time employees in enterprises with five or more persons engaged in the distribution and business services sectors was $\pounds 363.59$ in June 1999, compared with $\pounds 346.35$ in June 1998, an increase of 5.0% in the year. *See Table 1*.

Average weekly earnings in the distribution sector were £343.36 in June 1999, compared with a June 1998 level of £325.89.


Business services average weekly earnings were £374.79, up from £358.42 in June 1998.

The breakdown of earnings into the different sub-sectors shows:

- The highest average weekly earnings were recorded in the Post and Telecommunications sub-sector, with a level of £502.73 in June 1999, compared with £492.21 in June 1998.
- The lowest average weekly earnings were in the Accommodation and Catering sub-sector, at £238.14 in June 1999, following a June 1998 level of £223.26.

Background Notes

Introduction This Release details average weekly earnings of full-time employees in the Distribution and Business Services sectors. The series are derived from quarterly inquiries to enterprises, conducted under the Statistics (Business Accounts) Order, 1996, made under the Statistics Act 1993.

The total number of persons engaged in the Distribution and Services sectors in the first quarter of 1998 was estimated as 507,600 by the Quarterly National Household Survey (QNHS). Some 302,900 were full-time employees (Table A in the Appendix). Early analysis showed that it would not be possible to derive reliable earnings estimates for part-time employees or for small enterprises with less than 5 persons engaged[†]. These have been excluded from the current release.

The new series, therefore, covers full-time employees in enterprises with 5 or more persons engaged, about 272,100 persons in March-May of 1999. The survey collects details of the number of full-time employees (defined as persons working 30 or more hours per week) and their total wages. The number of hours worked was not sought, nor was any breakdown by gender or employment activity.

- **Scope** The activity classification used is the NACE Rev. 1 classification. The survey relates to a week in the months of March, June, September and December. It covers a sample of enterprises in the Distribution sector (NACE divisions 50 to 52), and NACE divisions 55, 60 to 64, and 70 to 74 of the Business Services sector. The target sample size is approximately 25% of the total number of enterprises with 5 or more persons engaged.
- Methodology Using the CSO Business Register, the sample in each quarter is classified into cells defined by NACE division and employment size. March 1998 was taken as the base period and average earnings per person per week were computed, from the survey returns, for each cell. These cell averages were then weighted by the corresponding estimated full-time employment to derive the average earnings at divisional and higher levels. The employment figures used for this weighting were the QNHS estimates for the December 1997 February 1998 quarter, allocated to size classes using the Business Register.

For each subsequent quarter, a matched sample of enterprises making returns in both the current quarter and the previous quarter was used. The average weekly earnings in each cell of the matched sample for both quarters were computed. The quarter-on-quarter matched sample change in average weekly earnings in each cell was then applied to the average weekly earnings for the cell in the previous quarter, to produce the average weekly earnings for the cell in the current quarter. These cell averages were then weighted by QNHS-based full-time employment estimates for the current quarter to produce average earnings at divisional and higher levels.

Tables B and C in the Appendix show the number of full-time employees and the number of enterprises, respectively, covered by returns used to compile the average weekly earnings figures in each period since March 1998. These show that returns covering 127,200 full-time employees in 2,900 enterprises were used to estimate the average weekly earnings in the March 1998 base period. The subsequent changes from quarter to quarter are based on matched returns from between 1,512 and 2,332 enterprises, covering between 91,600 and 109,100 full-time employees.

[†] In the second quarter of 1999 there are an estimated 71,200 full-time employees in these enterprises and rough indications are that including them would result in the overall average weekly earnings figures being reduced by approximately £ 20. It is hoped that increasing the sample size and improved response rates may permit the inclusion of this group at some later stage.

Definitions Employee

An employee is defined as any person working in the enterprise who is paid a definite wage or salary. Full-time employees are employees who work 30 or more hours per week.

Earnings

Earnings represent the gross amount (before the deduction of tax, PRSI, superannuation, etc.) payable to employees. Earnings include normal wages and salaries and overtime, taxable allowances, regular bonuses and commissions, as well as holiday pay and sick pay. Excluded from earnings are back-pay, redundancy pay, irregular bonuses (incl. annual bonuses), advances of pay, expenses, employers PRSI, and any earnings paid at irregular intervals.

Enterprise

An enterprise is defined as the smallest legally independent business unit. It may be comprised of one or more local units or branches.
