## Non-EU exports strong in August

The value of Ireland's exports to non-EU countries rose to $£ 2,288 \mathrm{~m}$ in August $2000,47 \%$ higher than the $£ 1,558 \mathrm{~m}$ recorded in August 1999. Imports were $£ 1,405 \mathrm{~m}$ in August, $33 \%$ higher than the $£ 1,053 \mathrm{~m}$ recorded in August 1999.

On a seasonally adjusted basis (see graph), exports rose to $£ 2,442 \mathrm{~m}$ in August from $£ 1,883 \mathrm{~m}$ in July and imports fell slightly to $£ 1,604 \mathrm{~m}$ from the high of $£ 1,662 \mathrm{~m}$ in July.

Comparing January - August 2000 with the corresponding period in 1999 shows that (see Tables 3 and 4):

- Imports increased from $£ 8,622 \mathrm{~m}$ to $£ 10,695 \mathrm{~m}(+24 \%)$. Imports from USA increased from $£ 3,527 \mathrm{~m}$ to $£ 4,479 \mathrm{~m}(+27 \%)$ and imports from South Korea increased from $£ 241 \mathrm{~m}$ to $£ 438 \mathrm{~m}(+82 \%)$. Imports from Taiwan fell from $£ 449 \mathrm{~m}$ to $£ 410 \mathrm{~m}(-9 \%)$.
- Imports of Computer equipment increased from $£ 2,338 \mathrm{~m}$ to $£ 2,724 \mathrm{~m}$ ( $+16 \%$ ) and imports of Electrical machinery increased from $£ 1,445 \mathrm{~m}$ to $£ 1,685 \mathrm{~m}(+17 \%)$. Imports of Transport equipment other than road vehicles fell from $£ 549 \mathrm{~m}$ to $£ 460 \mathrm{~m}(-16 \%)$.
- Exports increased from $£ 11,372 \mathrm{~m}$ to $£ 16,114 \mathrm{~m}(+42 \%)$. Exports to the USA increased from $£ 5,169 \mathrm{~m}$ to $£ 8,024 \mathrm{~m}(+55 \%)$, and exports to Japan increased from $£ 940 \mathrm{~m}$ to $£ 1,530 \mathrm{~m}(+63 \%)$. Exports to Australia fell from $£ 329 \mathrm{~m}$ to $£ 271 \mathrm{~m}(-18 \%)$.
- Exports of Organic chemicals increased from $£ 2,469 \mathrm{~m}$ to $£ 5,391 \mathrm{~m}$ $(+118 \%)$ and exports of Computer equipment increased from $£ 2,000 \mathrm{~m}$ to $£ 2,785 \mathrm{~m}(+39 \%)$. Exports of Telecommunications and sound equipment fell from $£ 592 \mathrm{~m}$ to $£ 504 \mathrm{~m}(-15 \%)$.

## Background Notes

Introduction The data in this release relate only to trade with non-EU countries, which is subject to Customs documentation. Estimates for trade by companies operating in the Shannon Free Zone and for parcel post trade are also included. About $35 \%$ of total external trade is covered. Up to the end of 1992, statistics of Ireland's external trade were collected almost entirely from Customs documentation. Following the completion of the single market at the end of 1992, trade statistics with EU member states and trade statistics with non-EU countries are compiled from different sources.

The trade statistics with non-EU countries are for the most part compiled, in a similar manner as previously, from the returns provided by importers and exporters (or their agents) to the Customs authorities. These returns give value and quantity information classified according to the headings of the Customs and Excise Tariff of Ireland and to countries of origin or destination. This information is processed in the Office of the Revenue Commissioners and converted to the format required for statistical purposes.

Revisions Data from July 1999 onwards are provisional and are subject to minor amendments.
Imports These are classified by country of origin. Goods imported directly into Ireland from a non-EU country are covered in this release since they are recorded on Customs documentation. Occasionally, goods from a non-EU country may be released for free circulation in another EU member state before being imported into Ireland. These "indirect" imports are not covered in this release, as they are not subject to Customs documentation. They are surveyed in the Intrastat system and, therefore, estimates of total imports from non-EU countries will become available only when the Intrastat estimates are to hand. However, the year-on-year percentage changes derived from the coverage of non-EU imports in this release give reasonable trend indications.

Exports These are classified by country of final destination in so far as this is known. From 1993, there are some circumstances in which Customs documentation for Irish exports to a non-EU country may be completed at the external frontier of another member state. These "indirect" exports to non-EU countries are recorded in the Intrastat system and are not covered in this release. Furthermore, since in the Intrastat system a trader indicates only the EU member state to which these "indirect" exports are first despatched, with no indication of the non-EU country to which they are subsequently sent, the Intrastat results will not give rise to adjustments to the value of non-EU exports.

Publication arrangements

Estimates of trade with EU countries based on the Intrastat survey become available later than the mainly Customs-based non-EU trade statistics. Two releases are issued in respect of each month, one relating to non-EU trade and the other covering all trade including the Intrastat estimates of trade with EU countries.

Price and Volume Indices

The monthly index series should be regarded as interim measures suitable for month-to-month comparisons within a given year. However, when the annual price index is compiled, the monthly price indices are rescaled to make their average equal to the annual index.
