#### Exports fall back in November

Initial indications for November 2001 show unadjusted exports of  $\epsilon$ 7,550m and imports of  $\epsilon$ 4,750m resulting in a surplus of  $\epsilon$ 2,800m. The corresponding seasonally adjusted figures are exports of  $\epsilon$ 7,440m (down  $\epsilon$ 477m on October) and imports of  $\epsilon$ 4,330m (down  $\epsilon$ 453m on October) giving a surplus of  $\epsilon$ 3,110m.

On a seasonally adjusted basis (see graph and Table 2) the more final October figures, relative to September 2001, show imports decreased to  $\notin$ 4,783m from  $\notin$ 4,858m (down  $\notin$ 75m) while exports increased to  $\notin$ 7,917m from  $\notin$ 7,487m (up  $\notin$ 431m) giving an adjusted merchandise trade surplus of  $\notin$ 3,134m (up  $\notin$ 506m).

On an unadjusted basis *(see Table 1)* imports in October were  $\notin$ 5,188m ( $\notin$ 4,522m in September) and exports were  $\notin$ 8,141m ( $\notin$ 7,999m in September), giving a surplus of  $\notin$ 2,952m ( $\notin$ 3,476m in September).

Surplus, as used here, differs from the Balance of International Payments concept of current account balance, which also includes transactions relating to invisibles.

Comparing the January-October 2001 figures with the same period in 2000 shows that (*see Tables 3-4*):

- Imports increased from €45,484m to €47,706m (+5%). Imports of Computer equipment increased from €9,015m to €10,036m (+11%), Electrical machinery and parts increased from €5,573m to €6,438m (+16%), and of Telecommunications and sound equipment from €2,216m to €2,659m (+20%). Road vehicle imports decreased from €3,280m to €2,636m (-20%).
- Imports from Great Britain increased from €13,229m to €15,584m (+18%) and imports from France increased from €2,084m to €2,345m (+12%). Imports from Germany and the Netherlands also increased while those from Japan, Singapore and South Korea declined.
- Exports increased from €67,657m to €77,359m (+14%). Exports of Medical and pharmaceutical products increased from €4,211m to €7,653m (+82%), of Computer equipment from €15,433m to €18,286m (+18%) and of Electrical machinery and parts from €6,177m to €7,893m (+28%).
- Exports to Great Britain increased from €13,696m to €16,854m (+23%), to Germany increased from €7,318m to €10,168m (+39%) and to USA increased from €11,543m to €13,525m (+17%). Exports to France decreased from €5,163m to €4,643m (-10%).





# **Background Notes**

- **Introduction** The statistics are a combination of Customs-based non-EU trade statistics and estimates from the Intrastat Survey of Irish traders involved in trade with other EU member states. Details of non-EU trade have already been published in a separate Statistical Release.
  - **Revisions** All figures are estimates. They are subject to revision on the incorporation of late Intrastat and VAT returns and corrections made by traders to Intrastat returns already submitted.

When the results for a particular month are published, the results for the same month in the previous year are revised for the last time and may be considered final. However, further revisions are possible in very exceptional cases.

From July 1996, sales of some software licences previously included in export returns have been excluded. It is estimated that this has reduced exports by about £50m a month. These sales are now captured in the Balance of Payments.

**Intrastat System** The Intrastat system has two components. Firstly, the Intrastat survey itself (conducted by the Revenue Commissioners), in which the larger traders make detailed monthly returns giving information on the quantity and value of all exports to or imports from EU countries.

The total number of traders required to make an import return is about 6,780 while about 2,000 must make an export return. The response rate in terms of number of traders in October 2001 was 77%, covering an estimated 94% of the total value of intra-EU trade.

The second component of the Intrastat system is the regular VAT return, on which all traders are required to record the *total* value of goods imported from and exported to other EU member states. This information provides the basis for determining total EU trade for those traders below the Intrastat survey thresholds. It is also used to maintain the register of EU traders.

**Estimation** The figures in this release include estimates for traders above the Intrastat thresholds who did not make detailed returns for the period and for traders below the thresholds who did not provide aggregate intra-EU trade figures on their VAT returns.

Estimates for Intrastat non-respondents are apportioned to individual commodities and countries whenever previous Intrastat returns are available. Estimates for traders below the Intrastat thresholds are assigned to partner country where possible, but not to commodity.

The estimate of imports incorporates an upward adjustment equivalent to about 1.75% of total imports, which is included in 'Unclassified estimates'. This special adjustment arises from the difficulty of comprehensively covering all EU imports through the Intrastat survey system.

The unclassified category also includes certain miscellaneous adjustments.

**Price and Volume** The monthly price (unit value) index measures monthly price trends relative to the annual levels in the preceding year using value weights relating to that year's trade (Laspeyres index).

The annual index is compiled using value weights for both the current and previous year (Fisher index) to allow for change in the structure of external trade.

The monthly index series should be regarded as interim measures suitable for month-to-month comparisons within a given year. However, when the annual price index is compiled, the monthly price indices are rescaled to make their average equal to the annual index.
