

Merchandise Exports up 2% and Imports up 5% in 2004

Exports of merchandise trade for the year 2004 were €83,892m, up 2% on 2003. The rise was due mainly to Pharmaceuticals but was offset by a fall in Computer equipment. Imports for 2004 were €50,100m, up 5% on 2003. This increase was principally due to Road and Other Transport (including aviation) and Fuels.

In December 2004 (see Table 1) the value of exports was 6,978m, up 61m on December 2003, while imports were 4,545m, up 194m. On a seasonally adjusted basis (see table 2) the value of exports in December 2004 was 7,047m, down 7m on November 2004 (-1%), while imports were 4,395m, up 401m (+10%).

Preliminary estimates for January 2005 (see Table 5) show exports of ϵ 6,447m and imports of ϵ 4,274m. The corresponding seasonally adjusted values for January 2005 (see table 2) are ϵ 7,132m for exports and ϵ 4,383m for imports. Table 5 introduces a broad commodity by principal country classification of the preliminary month contrasted with the corresponding month in the previous year.

Comparing the 2004 figures with those of 2003 shows that (see Tables 3-4):

- ◆ Exports of Medical and Pharmaceutical products increased from €13,612m to €15,111m (+11%), Essential oils and cleansing preparations from €4,173m to €4,761m (+14%) and professional and scientific apparatus increased from €3,267m to €3,808m (+17%). Exports of Computer equipment decreased from €14,837m to €13,453m (-9%).
- ♠ Exports of goods to Belgium increased from €10,334m to €12,315m (+19%) and to Japan from €2,109m to €2,333m (+11%). Goods to the USA decreased from €16,939m to €16,509m (-3%), to Germany from €6,845m to €6,422m (-6%) and to the Netherlands from €4,184m to €3,814m (-9%).
- Imports of Other transport equipment (including aviation) increased from €812m to €1,501m (+85%) and Petroleum and related materials from €1,593m to €2,136m (+34%). Road vehicles increased from €2,809m to €3,254m (+16%). Medical and Pharmaceutical products decreased from €2,168m to €1,976m (-9%) and General industrial machinery and equipment decreased from €1,207m to €1,097m (-9%).
- Imports of goods from China increased from €2,215m to €2,839m (+28%), Great Britain from €13,662m to €14,299m (+5%), France from €1,914m to €2,232m (+17%) and Germany from €3,498m to €3,764m (+8%). Goods from the USA decreased from €7,416m to €6,961m (-6%).

Central Statistics Office External Trade

Background Notes

Introduction

The statistics are a combination of Customs-based non-EU trade statistics and estimates from the Intrastat Survey of Irish traders involved in trade with other EU member states. Details of non-EU trade for December 2004 have already been published in a separate Statistical Release.

Revisions

All figures are estimates. They are subject to revision on the incorporation of late Intrastat and VAT returns and corrections made by traders to Intrastat returns already submitted.

When the results for a particular month are published, the results for the same month in the previous year are revised for the last time and may be considered final. However, further revisions are possible in very exceptional cases.

Intrastat System

The Intrastat system has two components. Firstly, the Intrastat survey itself (conducted by the Revenue Commissioners), in which the larger traders make detailed monthly returns giving information on the quantity and value of all exports to or imports from EU countries.

The total number of traders required to make a detailed import return is about 6,885 while about 2,040 must make a detailed export return. The response rate in terms of number of traders in December 2004 was 91%, covering an estimated 95% of the total value of intra-EU trade. The response rates for January 2005 are 57% and 80% respectively.

The second component of the Intrastat system is the regular VAT return, on which all traders are required to record the *total* value of goods imported from and exported to other EU member states. This information provides the basis for determining total EU trade for those traders below the Intrastat survey thresholds. It is also used to maintain the register of EU traders.

Estimation

The figures in this release include estimates for traders above the Intrastat thresholds who did not make detailed returns for the period and for traders below the thresholds who did not provide aggregate intra-EU trade figures on their VAT returns.

Estimates for Intrastat non-respondents are apportioned to individual commodities and countries whenever previous Intrastat returns are available. Estimates for traders below the Intrastat thresholds are assigned to partner country where possible, but not to commodity.

The estimate of imports incorporates an upward adjustment equivalent to about 1.75% of total imports, which is included in 'Unclassified estimates'. This special adjustment arises from the difficulty of comprehensively covering all EU imports through the Intrastat survey system.

The unclassified category also includes certain miscellaneous adjustments.

Price and Volume Indices

The monthly price (unit value) index measures monthly price trends relative to the annual levels in the preceding year using value weights relating to that year's trade (Laspeyres index).

The annual index is compiled using value weights for both the current and previous year (Fisher index) to allow for change in the structure of external trade.

The monthly index series should be regarded as interim measures suitable for month-to-month comparisons within a given year. However, when the annual price index is compiled, the monthly price indices are rescaled to make their average equal to the annual index.
