

### Merchandise trade remains steady in 2007

Exports of merchandise trade for the year 2007 were €88,581m, up 2% on 2006. This rise was due to Organic chemicals and Pharmaceuticals (*see Table 3*). Excluding these categories exports actually fell by 2%. Imports for 2007 were €62,179m, up 2% on 2006. This increase was due to Transport equipment. If we exclude this, imports were flat.

In December 2007 (*see Table 1*) the value of exports was €6,116m, down €1,048m (-15%) on December 2006, while imports were €5,017m, down €351m (-7%). On a seasonally adjusted basis (*see Table 2*) the value of exports in December 2007 was €6,310m, 14% down on November 2007, while imports were €4,970m, down 11%.

Preliminary estimates for January 2008 (*see Table 5*) show exports of €6,958m and imports of €5,328m. The corresponding seasonally adjusted values for January 2008 (*see Table 2*) are €7,198m for exports and €5,175m for imports.

*A comparison of the preliminary January 2008 values with January 2007 is given in Table 5 at broad commodity level by principal country.*

Comparing the 2007 figures with those of 2006 shows that (*see Tables 3-4*):

- ◆ Exports of Organic chemicals increased from €17,059m to €19,427m (+14%), Eggs and dairy products from €1,195m to €1,436m (+20%) and General industrial machinery from €1,216m to €1,449m (+19%).

Exports of Computer equipment decreased from €14,063m to €12,533m (-11%).

- ◆ Exports of goods to China and Hong Kong increased from €1,498m to €1,950m (+30%), to the Philippines from €424m to €709m (+67%) and to Switzerland from €2,516m to €3,248m (+29%).

Goods to the United States decreased from €16,182m to €15,779m (-2%) (in \$ terms this represented a 9.5% increase) and to Italy from €3,613m to €3,125m (-14%).

- ◆ Imports of Other transport equipment (including aviation equipment) increased from €1,452m to €2,564m (+77%), Petroleum and related materials from €3,842m to €4,055m (+6%), Iron and steel from €911m to €1,080m (+18%) and Road vehicles from €4,102m to €4,382m (+7%).

Computer equipment decreased from €10,452m to €9,233m (-12%).

- ◆ Imports of goods from China and Hong Kong increased from €4,768m to €5,148m (+8%), France from €2,219m to €2,616m (+18%), Germany from €5,012m to €5,399m (+8%) and Great Britain from €18,099m to €18,704m (+3%).

Goods from Singapore decreased from €1,218m to €838m (-31%) and Norway from €1,857m to €1,425m (-23%).

**Please note that the apparent increases and decreases are partially influenced by the transition from SITC (Rev3) to SITC (Rev4) nomenclature (*see background notes on page 8*).**

## Background Notes

**Introduction** The statistics are a combination of Customs-based non-EU trade statistics and estimates from the Intrastat Survey of Irish traders involved in trade with other EU member states.

**Revisions** All figures are estimates. They are subject to revision on the incorporation of late Intrastat and VAT returns and corrections made by traders to Intrastat returns already submitted.

When the results for a particular month are published, the results for the same month in the previous year are revised for the last time and may be considered final. However, further revisions are possible in very exceptional cases.

**Intrastat System** The Intrastat system has two components. Firstly, the Intrastat survey itself (conducted by the Revenue Commissioners), in which the larger traders make detailed monthly returns giving information on the quantity and value of all exports to or imports from EU countries.

The total number of traders required to make a detailed import return is about 7,468 while about 2,072 must make a detailed export return. The response rate in terms of number of traders in December 2007 was 89%, covering an estimated 93% of the total value of intra-EU trade. For January 2008 the respective response rates being 65% and 85%.

The second component of the Intrastat system is the regular VAT return, on which all traders are required to record the *total* value of goods imported from and exported to other EU member states. This information provides the basis for determining total EU trade for those traders below the Intrastat survey thresholds. It is also used to maintain the register of EU traders.

**Estimation** The figures in this release include estimates for traders above the Intrastat thresholds who did not make detailed returns for the period and for traders below the thresholds who did not provide aggregate intra-EU trade figures on their VAT returns.

Estimates for Intrastat non-respondents are apportioned to individual commodities and countries whenever previous Intrastat returns are available. Estimates for traders below the Intrastat thresholds are assigned to partner country where possible, but not to commodity.

The estimate of imports incorporates an upward adjustment equivalent to about 1.75% of total imports, which is included in 'Unclassified estimates'. This special adjustment arises from the difficulty of comprehensively covering all EU imports through the Intrastat survey system.

The unclassified category also includes certain miscellaneous adjustments.

**Price and Volume Indices** The monthly price (unit value) index measures monthly price trends relative to the annual levels in the preceding year using value weights relating to that year's trade (Laspeyres index).

The annual index is compiled using value weights for both the current and previous year (Fisher index) to allow for change in the structure of external trade.

The monthly index series should be regarded as interim measures suitable for month-to-month comparisons within a given year. However, when the annual price index is compiled, the monthly price indices are rescaled to make their average equal to the annual index.

**Discontinuity in Commodity classification** Merchandise Trade source data are collected using the 8-digit Combined Nomenclature (CN) – the EU's tariff and statistical nomenclature. This nomenclature is managed and updated annually by the Commission in co-operation with the member states. The CN is aligned with the 6-digit Harmonised Commodity Description and Coding System (HS) – the nomenclature of the Customs Co-operation Council that is used throughout the world for applying customs tariffs and compiling external trade statistics. The CN contains over 9,700 8-digit subheadings, the first six digits of which correspond to the HS code.

A major revision of the HS, with corresponding changes to the CN, entered into force on 1 January 2007. The motivation for the revision relates to keeping the nomenclature up to date in the light of changes in technology and in patterns of international trade. Over 350 sets of amendments were carried out broadly covering

- Technological progress;
- Change in trade patterns and practice;
- To facilitate the monitoring and control in the environmental and social fields.

In this publication, imports and exports are classified according to the United Nations' Standard International Trade Classification (SITC)<sup>1</sup>. The SITC has been developed by the United Nations for the advancement of the international comparability of statistics on external trade.

The SITC follows the structure of the HS. Each of the categories in the SITC (including all the basic headings) is equivalent to a combination of HS headings (and therefore to a combination of CN headings). Accordingly, in order to make the SITC more completely synchronised with the HS a major revision to the SITC was also carried out. This new version of the classification, known as SITC (Rev4), concurs with HS2007 and HS2002 and is the basis for dissemination of data from 2007 onward.

**These changes will create some discontinuity in time series between data up to December 2006 and that from January 2007 onwards. A preliminary examination suggests that at Division level, those within Sections 5 and 7 and Division 87 are the most affected.**
