

## Turnover up 24.2% in 2000

Early estimates for 2000 show that industrial enterprises with 3 or more persons engaged had a turnover of epsilon 102,923m and a gross value added of epsilon 36,600m. Turnover was up **24.2%** on the 1999 figure and the gross value added increased by **21.8%**.

Two sectors accounted for **74%** of the increase in turnover - manufacture of chemicals and chemical products; and manufacture of optical and electrical equipment (including computers). These two sectors accounted for **59%** of the increase in gross value added. See *Table 1*.

Employment in industrial enterprises increased by 11,455 to **276,352**. A total of €7041m was paid in wages and salaries.

These early estimates are based on a **59%** response rate to date to the Census of Industrial Production. The final response rate to the 1999 Census of Industrial Production was **84%**. See the *Background Notes* for details of the methodology used to estimate for non-respondents.

The provisional results of the 2000 Census of Industrial Production will be published in April 2002 and the detailed report will be published during the summer of 2002. The detailed 1999 Census of Industrial Production report was published in December 2001.

# **Background Notes**

# Scope and Coverage

This release presents early estimates for the 2000 Census of Industrial Production which covers manufacturing industry, mining and quarrying, together with electricity, gas and water supply. This inquiry is conducted under SI 17/1998.

Results are presented for industrial enterprises with 3 or more persons engaged.

The activity classification used in this release is the NACE Rev. 1 classification.

#### **Definitions**

An *Enterprise* is defined as the smallest combination of legal units that is an organisational unit producing goods or services, which benefits from a certain degree of autonomy in decision making, especially for the allocation of its current resources (e.g. company, partnership, individual proprietorship, etc.). An enterprise may be a sole legal unit.

*Persons Employed* relates to a week in September and proprietors, directors and family members working in the business together with full-time and part-time employees are included. Outside piece-workers are also included. *Persons Engaged* excludes outside piece-workers.

Wages and Salaries is defined as the gross amount paid to employees before deduction of income tax, employees' contributions to social security, etc. It includes the earnings of outside piece-workers.

*Turnover* is the net amount (excluding VAT) invoiced to customers after deductions for trade and quantity discounts and allowances for returns but not cash discounts.

Gross Value Added is the production value (i.e. total turnover adjusted for changes in stocks and own-account capital assets) less *intermediate consumption* (i.e. total purchases adjusted for changes in stocks of materials and fuels).

### Methodology

To date there is a 59% response rate to the 2000 Census of Industrial Production. The 41% of enterprises for which estimates had to be made account for 19% of the total turnover and 22% of the total number of persons employed.

The numbers of persons employed in the non-respondent enterprises were estimated using data from the Quarterly Employment survey, the Prodcom inquiry, the 1999 Census of Industrial Production and, for new enterprises, the Register inquiry.

A year-on-year regression model was used to estimate for most non-respondents. Per person values (e.g. turnover per person) from the 2000 respondents were regressed on corresponding data for 1999. Estimates for 65% of non-respondents were derived using this method.

Data for the remaining non-respondents were estimated using donor imputation. This method involves the imputation of missing values using values from a respondent enterprise (donor) which is similar (in terms of the NACE classification and the number of persons employed) to the non-respondent enterprise.

The imputed turnover figures for the larger non-respondent enterprises were aligned with the turnovers returned to the Prodcom inquiry and/or the Monthly Turnover inquiry. The imputed gross value added data were scaled correspondingly.
