## Consumer Price Index

## September 1999

## Food

Food prices fell by $0.4 \%$ in the month with decreases in mutton/lamb, potatoes and fresh vegetables and fresh fruit while canteen prices rose. The annual percentage increase in the year to September stands at $2.7 \%$.


## Drink

Drink prices in September remained relatively stable showing a monthly increase of $+0.2 \%$. In the year to September alcoholic drink prices have increased by 3.7\%.

## Tobacco

Tobacco prices remained fixed in September leaving the annual percentage increase at $3.2 \%$, the same annual increase recorded in August.

## Clothing \& Footwear

There was a further recovery from sales in clothing and footwear, particularly in the case of mens and womens clothing. The price of footwear increased by $2 \%$ in the month.

## Fuel \& Light

The price of home heating oil increased by just over $4 \%$ in the month. As a result Fuel \& Light increased by $0.8 \%$ in the month, putting the annual increase at over $4 \%$.


## Housing

Following a reduction in interest rates in September mortgage interest charges decreased by just over $9 \%$. There were, however, increases in home insurance charges.

## Durable Household Goods

There were increases in the cost of soft furnishings such as towels and bed linen, while other household durables remained relatively stable. The annual percentage change shows that durables are less expensive than the same period last year.

## Other Goods

There were increases in the price of cosmetics, sport and recreation goods, magazines and newspapers which resulted in a monthly increase of $0.3 \%$ and an annual increase of $1.5 \%$ in the twelve months to September.

## Transport

The main factors causing an increase in transport costs were an increase of $2.7 \%$ in the month in motor fuels including petrol and an increase of $1.6 \%$ in the cost of motor insurance.

## Services \& Related Expenditure

In September there was an increase in the cost of medical insurance, childcare costs, education \& training and package holidays. These price increases lead to a overall monthly change for services and related expenditure of $1.7 \%$. As a result the annual percentage increase is now running at $5.2 \%$.

## Overall CPI

The CPI for September increased by $0.4 \%$ over the previous month, resulting in an annual increase of $1.5 \%$. The main contributors to the annual percentage change were increases in services \& related expenditure, transport, food and drink and decreases in the cost of housing (mortgages) and clothing \& footwear prices.
