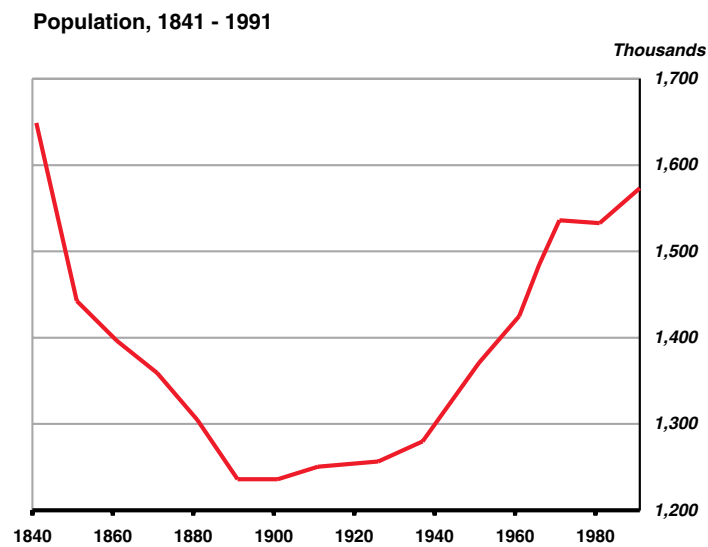

Components of population changes, 1891 - 1991

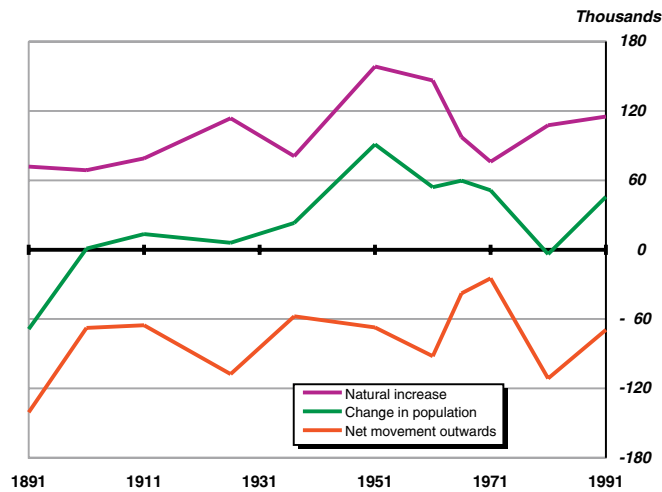

Workforce in Spring of each year

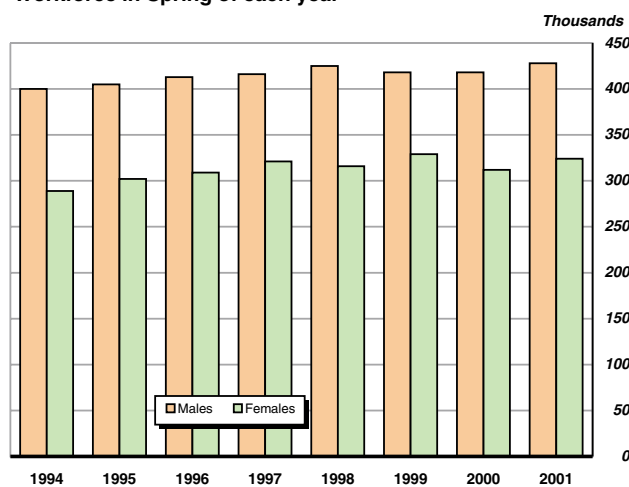

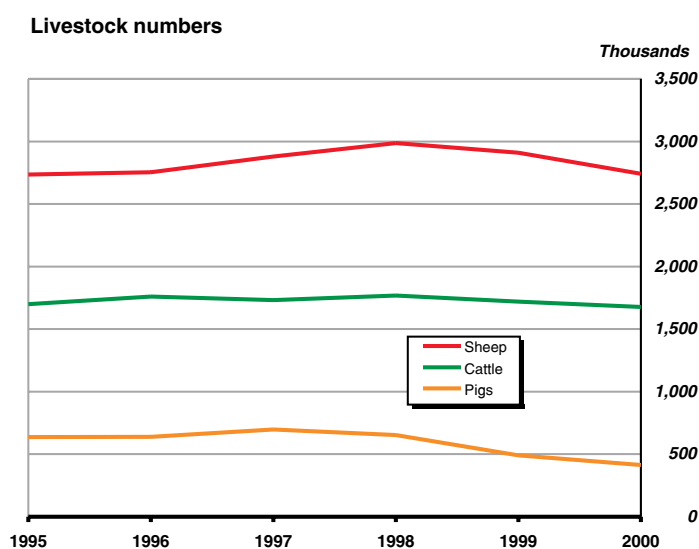

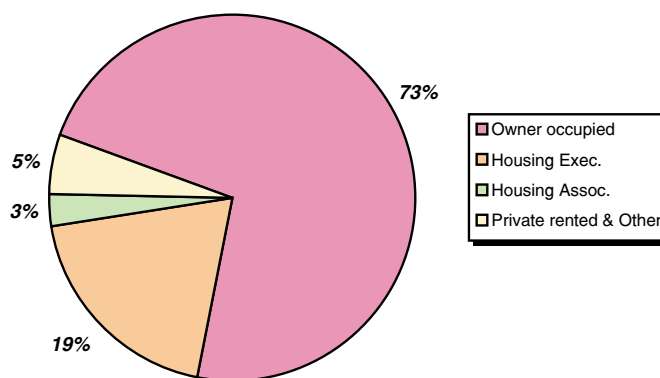
