Increase of 7.7% in Visitors to Ireland

There were 1,315,000 Overseas Visitors to Ireland in the Fourth Quarter of 2000 compared with 1,221,000 in the same period last year, an increase of 7.7%. *See Table 1 and Graph*. The number of Overseas Visitors on Continental routes increased by 18.8% while the number on Transatlantic routes increased by 15.8% on the same quarter in 1999.

The number of Irish Visitors going abroad between October and December 2000 was 809,000, an increase of 7.7% on the corresponding period last year. *See Table 6 and Graph*. Irish residents travelling abroad on Continental routes increased by 19.2% compared with the fourth quarter in 1999.


The expenditure figures for October – December 2000 show a net inflow of $\pounds 174m$ - earnings from Visitors to Ireland accounted for $\pounds 631m$ while expenditure by Irish Visitors Abroad amounted to $\pounds 457m$. *See Table 8*.

The Tourism figures in this release also show that:

- ◆ In the Fourth Quarter of 2000, the number of Visitors to Ireland from the Other Europe area increased by 18.1% compared with the same period in 1999.
- ♦ As table 3 shows, in the period October December 2000, 33,000 same-day visitors from Great Britain were in the business category, while 18,000 were Holiday/Leisure/Recreation visitors.
- The average length of stay for visitors to Ireland during the period October – December 2000 was 6.9 nights. This compares with 9 nights for Irish Residents going abroad. See Table 5 and Table 7.

Background Notes

- **Introduction** This quarterly series gives details on the number of visits made by Overseas Visitors to Ireland and by Irish Residents travelling abroad for the quarter. It includes data on the reason for journey, average number of nights and expenditure. Additional information on overseas same day visits to Ireland by non-residents was first introduced for the quarter January to March 1997. The quarterly series supplements the annual release which provides more extensive annual information on tourism and travel.
- **Reason for** Journey From the 1stJanuary, 1999 the classification by reason for journey was changed in accordance with Council Directive 95/57/EC. The new classification (business, holiday/leisure/recreation, visits to friend or relatives and other) also accords with the recommendations of the World Tourism Organisation (W.T.O.).
 - **Sources** Two sample surveys of passengers, the Country of Residence Survey and the Passenger Card Inquiry are carried out by the Central Statistics Office. These are used in conjunction with passenger movement figures supplied by the transport companies to provide estimates for overseas tourism and travel.

The Country of Residence Survey is a continuous sample survey of passengers (both inward and outward) at all major air and sea ports to provide an estimated distribution of passengers by country of residence. This distribution is applied to the total passenger movement figures to provide estimates of Irish residents travelling abroad and visits to Ireland by non-residents. Visitors to Ireland are further broken down into the areas of residence shown in this release.

The Passenger Card Inquiry is a continuous sample survey of incoming and departing passengers at air and sea ports. This survey provides information on the reason for journey, area of residence, length of stay, expenditure and fare costs. The results are combined with the overall visitor estimates from the Country of Residence Survey to provide the overseas tourism and travel estimates shown in this release.
