

Visits to Ireland fell by 5.1% in 2001

There were 6,081,000 overseas visits to Ireland by non-residents in the year 2001, compared with 6,409,000 in 2000, a decrease of 5.1%. The number travelling on the Sea Cross-Channel route fell by 13%. The number of American and Canadian Residents visiting Ireland fell by 12.6%. *See Table 3 and Graph*

Visits abroad by Irish Residents increased from 3,811,000 in 2000 to 4,250,000 in 2001, an increase of 11.5%. Irish Residents travelling abroad on Continental European routes increased by 20.8%. *See Table 13 and Graph*.

The expenditure figures for the year 2001 show a net inflow of €871m - earnings from Visitors to Ireland accounted for €3,960m, while expenditure by Irish Visitors Abroad amounted to €3,089m. *See Table 15*.

The total number of bednights spent by Overseas Visitors in Ireland in the year 2001 was 45,276,000, a decrease of 893,000 on the year 2000. The number of bednights spent in Caravan/Camping Sites fell by 23.3%. *See Table 8*.

The average length of stay for Visits to Ireland during 2001 was 7.9 nights. This compares with 9.2 nights for Irish Residents going abroad. *See Tables 7 and 14*.

Background Notes

Introduction

This annual series gives details on the number of visits made by Overseas Visitors to Ireland and by Irish Residents travelling abroad for the year. It includes data on the reason for journey, average number of nights and earnings and expenditure.

Reason for Journey

From the 1st January 1999, the classification by reason for journey was changed in accordance with Council Directive 95/57/EC. The new Classification (business, holiday/leisure/recreation, visit to friends/relatives and other) also accords with the recommendations of the World Tourism Organisation (W.T.O.).

Sources

Two sample surveys of passengers, the *Country of Residence Survey* and the *Passenger Card Inquiry* are carried out by the Central Statistics Office. These are used in conjunction with passenger movement figures supplied by the transport companies to provide estimates for overseas tourism and travel.

Passenger fare payments by non-residents to Irish carriers refer to total fare payments to Irish carriers that is including fares for non-Irish travel.

The Country of Residence Survey is a sample survey of passengers (both inward and outward) at all major air and seaports to provide an estimated distribution of passengers by country of residence. This distribution is applied to the total passenger movement figures to provide estimates of the numbers of visits abroad by Irish residents and of visits to Ireland by non-residents. This 'Visits to Ireland by non-residents' figure is further broken down into the areas of residence shown in this release. The sample size in the 2001 Country of Residence Survey was 479 thousand passengers (218 thousand inward and 261 thousand outward).

The Passenger Card Inquiry is a sample survey of incoming and departing passengers at major air and seaports. Cards are distributed and completed by passengers which give information on the reason for journey, area of residence, length of stay, expenditure and fare costs. The results are combined with the overall visitor estimates from the Country of Residence Survey to provide the overseas tourism and travel estimates shown in the tables. The sample size in the 2001 Passenger Card Inquiry at air and seaports was 457 thousand passengers (235 thousand inward and 222 thousand outward).

The estimates for cross-border visitors on rail and scheduled bus services are derived from the Passenger Card Inquiry on these services and from passenger movement statistics. In this case the Passenger Card Inquiry results are used to estimate the country of residence distribution in addition to the reason for journey, average length of stay, expenditure and fare costs. The sample size in the Passenger Card Inquiry on cross-border services in 2001 was 4 thousand passengers (2 thousand inward and 2 thousand outward). The estimates of expenditure by cross-border visitors using private cars (or un-scheduled bus services) are based on very limited information and must be regarded as subject to error.
