

### Tourism and Travel Fourth Quarter 2001

### Numbers of Visitors to Ireland decreases by 2.2%

There were 1,276,000 Overseas Visitors to Ireland between October and December 2001 compared with 1,305,000 in the same period of 2000, a decrease of 2.2%. The number of Visitors travelling on Transatlantic routes fell by 15.5% while the numbers travelling on Continental routes fell by 8.9%. *See Table 1 and Graph*.

In the Fourth Quarter of 2001, the number of visits abroad by Irish Residents was 898,000, an increase of 11.8% on the corresponding quarter of 2000. Irish Residents travelling abroad on Transatlantic routes fell by 15.4% compared with the Fourth Quarter of 2000. *See Table 9 and Graph*.

The expenditure figures for October-December 2001 show a net inflow of  $\notin$ 148m. Earnings from Visitors to Ireland accounted for  $\notin$ 802m while expenditure by Irish Visitors Abroad amounted to  $\notin$ 654m. *See Table 15*.

The total number of bednights spent by Overseas Visitors in Ireland increased by 613,000 on the same period last year. Decreases in the number of bednights spent in Guest houses/B&B's, Caravan/Camp Sites and Hostels were offset by a large increase in stays in Rented houses and apartments. *See Table 6.*

### **Background Notes**

- **Introduction** This quarterly series gives details on the number of visits made by Overseas Visitors to Ireland and by Irish Residents travelling abroad for the quarter. It includes data on the reason for journey, average number of nights and expenditure. The quarterly series supplements the annual release which provides more extensive annual information on tourism and travel.
  - **Reason for** Journey From the 1<sup>st</sup>January, 1999 the classification by reason for journey was changed in accordance with Council Directive 95/57/EC. The new classification (business, holiday/leisure/recreation, visits to friend or relatives and other) also accords with the recommendations of the World Tourism Organisation (W.T.O.).
    - **Sources** Two sample surveys of passengers, the Country of Residence Survey and the Passenger Card Inquiry are carried out by the Central Statistics Office. These are used in conjunction with passenger movement figures supplied by the transport companies to provide estimates for overseas tourism and travel.

The Country of Residence Survey is a continuous sample survey of passengers (both inward and outward) at all major air and sea ports to provide an estimated distribution of passengers by country of residence. This distribution is applied to the total passenger movement figures to provide estimates of Irish residents travelling abroad and visits to Ireland by non-residents. Visitors to Ireland are further broken down into the areas of residence shown in this release.

The Passenger Card Inquiry is a continuous sample survey of incoming and departing passengers at air and sea ports. This survey provides information on the reason for journey, area of residence, length of stay, expenditure and fare costs. The results are combined with the overall visitor estimates from the Country of Residence Survey to provide the overseas tourism and travel estimates shown in this release.
