

### Number of Visits to Ireland decreases by 0.6%

There were 2,173,000 Overseas Visits to Ireland in the Third Quarter of 2004 compared with 2,187,000 in the same period last year, a decrease of 0.6%. The number of Visits to Ireland by residents of Great Britain fell by 3.6% on the same quarter of 2003, while the number of Visits by residents of Other European Countries grew by 1.6%. Visits by residents of the USA and Canada grew by 2.8% on the Third Quarter of 2003. The number of Third Quarter Overseas Visits to Ireland by residents of Other Areas grew from 95,000 in 2003 to 105,000 in 2004. Overseas Visits to Ireland on Cross-Channel Sea routes fell by 5% on the same quarter in 2003. See Table 1(a), Table 1(b) and Graph.

The number of Bednights spent in Ireland by Overseas Visitors in Q3 2004 fell by 4.5% on the same Quarter of 2003, while Bednights spent in Guest House/B&B's fell by 13.5%. *See Table 6*.

There were 1,749,000 Irish Visits abroad between July and September 2004, an increase of 9.8% on the corresponding period last year. Irish residents travelling abroad on Transatlantic routes grew by 16.5% compared with the Third Quarter in 2003, while the number travelling on Continental routes grew by 12.8%. The number of Irish residents travelling on Cross-Channel Sea routes in the Third Quarter of 2004 fell by 6.1% on the same period of 2003. *See Table 9(a), Table 9(b) and Graph.* 

The expenditure figures for July – September 2004 show a net outflow of  $\in$ 97m, earnings from Visitors to Ireland accounted for  $\in$ 1,426m while expenditure by Irish Visitors Abroad amounted to  $\in$ 1,523m. *See Table 15*.

The Tourism figures in this release also show that:

- ♦ The Average Length of Stay of Overseas Visits to Ireland in the Third Quarter of 2004 fell to 8.5 Bednights on the Quarter 3 2003 average of 8.9 Bednights. *See Table 5*.
- ♦ Irish residents made 60,000 Same-Day Visits abroad in Quarter 3 2004, an increase of 11.1% on the same period of 2003. *See Table 11*.

## **Background Notes**

#### Introduction

This quarterly series gives details on the number of overseas visits to Ireland and Irish visits abroad for the quarter. It includes data on the reason for journey, average length of stay (nights) and expenditure. The quarterly series supplements the annual release, which provides more extensive annual information on tourism and travel.

### **Commercial Drivers**

From the 1st January 2000 Commercial Drivers on sea routes are excluded from visitor numbers.

The agreed European interpretation of Annex 1 of Commission Decision of 9 December 1998 implementing Council Directive 95/57/EC is that commercial drivers should be considered travellers rather than visitors.

One of the fundamental criteria that are used to distinguish a visitor from a traveller is that the *trip should be to a place other than that of the usual environment*. Places that are frequently visited are part of a person's *usual environment* even though they may be located at a considerable distance (or in another country) from the place of residence. Persons who work in means of transport are included in visitor numbers under "Business" unless their trips consist of frequent routine travel, in which case they may be excluded by the *usual environment* criterion.

### **Sources**

The Central Statistics Office carries out two sample surveys of passengers, the Country of Residence Survey and the Passenger Card Inquiry. The results of these surveys are used in conjunction with passenger movement figures supplied by the transport companies to provide estimates for overseas tourism and travel.

The Country of Residence Survey is a continuous sample survey of passengers (both inward and outward) at all major airports and seaports to provide an estimated distribution of passengers by country of residence. This distribution is applied to the total passenger movement figures to provide estimates of Irish visits abroad and visits to Ireland by non-residents. Visits to Ireland are further categorised into the areas of residence shown in this release. The sample size of the Country of Residence Survey in Quarter 3 2004 was almost 204,000 passengers.

The Passenger Card Inquiry is a continuous sample survey of incoming and departing passengers at airports and seaports. This survey provides information on the reason for journey, area of residence, length of stay, expenditure and fare costs. The results are combined with the overall visit estimates from the Country of Residence Survey to provide the overseas tourism and travel estimates shown in this release. The sample size of the Passenger Card Inquiry in Quarter 3 2004 was almost 141,000 passengers.
