

Visits to Ireland up 8% in Q1 2006

There were 1,390,000 Overseas Visits to Ireland in the First Quarter of 2006 compared with 1,290,000 in the same period of 2005, an increase of 8%. The number of Overseas Visits by residents of Other European Countries grew by 16% while the number of Visits by residents of the USA and Canada fell by 3% on the same quarter in 2005. Visits by residents of Great Britain grew by 7% on the First Quarter of 2005. The number of Overseas Visits to Ireland by residents of Other Areas fell from 49,000 in Q1 2005 to 47,000 in Q1 2006. *See Table 1(a), Table 1(b) and Graph.*

The number of Irish Visits abroad between January and March 2006 was 1,346,000, an increase of 11% on the corresponding period in 2005. Trips abroad on Continental routes grew by 23% compared with Q1 2005 and trips on Air Cross-Channel routes increased by 6%. There was a decrease of 26% in the number travelling abroad on Sea Cross-Channel routes, compared with Q1 2005. *See Table 9(a), Table 9(b) and Graph.*

The expenditure figures for January - March 2006 show a net outflow of \notin 276m. Earnings from Visitors to Ireland accounted for \notin 733m while expenditure by Irish Visitors Abroad amounted to \notin 1,008m. *See Table 15*.

The Tourism figures in this release also show that:

- Overseas visits to Ireland on Continental European routes in the First Quarter of 2006 increased by 18% on the corresponding Quarter of 2005. See Table 1(b).
- ♦ The number of Bednights spent in Rented Houses/Apartments by Overseas Visitors to Ireland decreased by 7% in the First Quarter of 2006 when compared to the same period in 2005. However, bednights spent in Guest house/B&Bs by inward visitors recorded a rise of 4% on Q1 2005. See Table 6.
- The Average Length of Stay of Overseas Visits to Ireland with at least one overnight grew from 6.4 nights in Q1 2005 to 6.7 nights in Q1 2006. This compares with a decrease in the Average Length of Stay of Overseas Visits by Irish residents, with at least one overnight from 7.6 nights to 7.2 nights. See Tables 5 and 14.

Background Notes

- **Introduction** This quarterly series gives details on the number of overseas visits to Ireland and Irish visits abroad for the quarter. It includes data on the reason for journey, average length of stay (nights) and expenditure. The quarterly series supplements the annual release, which provides more extensive annual information on tourism and travel.
- **Commercial Drivers** From the 1st January 2000 Commercial Drivers on sea routes are excluded from visitor numbers.

The agreed European interpretation of Annex 1 of Commission Decision of 9 December 1998 implementing Council Directive 95/57/EC is that commercial drivers should be considered travellers rather than visitors.

One of the fundamental criteria that are used to distinguish a visitor from a traveller is that the *trip* should be to a place other than that of the usual environment. Places that are frequently visited are part of a person's usual environment even though they may be located at a considerable distance (or in another country) from the place of residence. Persons who work in means of transport are included in visitor numbers under "Business" unless their trips consist of frequent routine travel, in which case they may be excluded by the usual environment criterion.

Sources The Central Statistics Office carries out two sample surveys of passengers, the Country of Residence Survey and the Passenger Card Inquiry. The results of these surveys are used in conjunction with passenger movement figures supplied by the transport companies to provide estimates for overseas tourism and travel.

The Country of Residence Survey is a continuous sample survey of passengers (both inward and outward) at all major airports and seaports to provide an estimated distribution of passengers by country of residence. This distribution is applied to the total passenger movement figures to provide estimates of Irish visits abroad and visits to Ireland by non-residents. Visits to Ireland are further categorised into the areas of residence shown in this release. The sample size of the Country of Residence Survey in Quarter 1 2006 was just over 129,000 passengers.

The Passenger Card Inquiry is a continuous sample survey of incoming and departing passengers at airports and seaports. This survey provides information on the reason for journey, area of residence, length of stay, expenditure and fare costs. The results are combined with the overall visit estimates from the Country of Residence Survey to provide the overseas tourism and travel estimates shown in this release. The sample size of the Passenger Card Inquiry in Quarter 1 2006 was just under 91,000 passengers.
