

### Irish Visits Abroad exceed Visits to Ireland in Q1 2007

There were 1,575,00 Irish Visits Overseas in the first quarter of 2007 compared with 1,478,000 Overseas Visits to Ireland. This is the first time since this quarterly series began in 1990 that Overseas Visits by Irish Residents exceeds the number of Overseas Visits to Ireland. See Tables 1(a), 9(a) and Graph.

The number of Irish Visits abroad between January and March 2007 was 1,575,000 an increase of 17% on the corresponding period in 2006. Overseas trips on Continental European routes grew by 28% compared with Q1 2006 and trips on Air Cross-Channel routes increased by 7%. There was a decrease of 2% in the number of overseas trips on Sea Cross-Channel routes, compared with Q1 2006. See Tables 9(a), 9(b) and Graph.

There were 1,478,000 Overseas Visits to Ireland in the First Quarter of 2007 compared with 1,390,000 in the same period of 2006, an increase of 6%. The number of Overseas Visits by residents of Other European Countries grew by 33% while the number of Visits by residents of Great Britain fell by 6% on the same quarter in 2006. Visits by residents of the USA & Canada grew by 4% on the First Quarter of 2006. The number of Overseas Visits to Ireland by residents of Other Areas increased from 47,000 in Q1 2006 to 54,000 in Q1 2007. See Tables 1(a), 1(b) and Graph.

The expenditure figures for January - March 2007 show a net outflow of €324m. Earnings from Visitors to Ireland accounted for €819m while expenditure by Irish Visitors Abroad amounted to €1,143m. See Table 15.

The Tourism figures in this release also show that:

- ♦ In Q1 2007 Holiday/Leisure/Recreation was the primary Reason for Journey accounting for 48% of Overseas Visits to Ireland by Non-Residents and 57% of Overseas Visits by Irish Residents. See *Tables 1(b) and 9(b).*
- The Average Length of Stay of Overseas Visits to Ireland with at least one overnight in Ireland fell from 6.7 nights in Q1 2006 to 6.4 nights in Q1 2007. The Average Length of Stay of Overseas Visits by Irish Residents abroad with at least one overnight also showed a decrease from 7.2 nights to 6.6 nights. See Tables 5 and 14.

# **Background Notes**

### Introduction

This quarterly series gives details on the number of overseas visits to Ireland and Irish visits abroad for the quarter. It includes data on the reason for journey, average length of stay (nights) and expenditure. The quarterly series supplements the annual release, which provides more extensive annual information on tourism and travel.

### **Commercial Drivers**

From the 1st January 2000 Commercial Drivers on sea routes are excluded from visitor numbers.

The agreed European interpretation of Annex 1 of Commission Decision of 9 December 1998 implementing Council Directive 95/57/EC is that commercial drivers should be considered travellers rather than visitors.

One of the fundamental criteria that are used to distinguish a visitor from a traveller is that the *trip should be to a place other than that of the usual environment*. Places that are frequently visited are part of a person's *usual environment* even though they may be located at a considerable distance (or in another country) from the place of residence. Persons who work in means of transport are included in visitor numbers under "Business" unless their trips consist of frequent routine travel, in which case they may be excluded by the *usual environment* criterion.

### **Sources**

The Central Statistics Office carries out two sample surveys of passengers, the Country of Residence Survey and the Passenger Card Inquiry. The results of these surveys are used in conjunction with passenger movement figures supplied by the transport companies to provide estimates for overseas tourism and travel.

The Country of Residence Survey is a continuous sample survey of passengers (both inward and outward) at all major airports and seaports to provide an estimated distribution of passengers by country of residence. This distribution is applied to the total passenger movement figures to provide estimates of Irish visits abroad and visits to Ireland by non-residents. Visits to Ireland are further categorised into the areas of residence shown in this release. The sample size of the Country of Residence Survey in Quarter 1 2007 was just over 105,000 passengers.

The Passenger Card Inquiry is a continuous sample survey of incoming and departing passengers at airports and seaports. This survey provides information on the reason for journey, area of residence, length of stay, expenditure and fare costs. The results are combined with the overall visit estimates from the Country of Residence Survey to provide the overseas tourism and travel estimates shown in this release. The sample size of the Passenger Card Inquiry in Quarter 1 2007 was just under 74,000 passengers.
