

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Decline in visitors from Great Britain slows down in June 2010

In June 2010, the number of trips to Ireland by residents of Great Britain fell by 3% to 252,900 from twelve months earlier. This was in contrast to a fall of almost 20% in June 2009 from June 2008. *See Tables 1 and 2*.

Overall, the number of trips to Ireland in June 2010 fell by 5.7% to 600,300 from the same month in 2009. Trips from Other Europe fell by 14.4% to 187,900 while those from North America and Other Areas increased by 1.4% and 4.1% respectively. *See Tables 1 and 2*.

Irish residents took 657,200 overseas trips in June 2010, down 7.4% from June 2009. *See Tables 1 and 2*.

Please note that the publication of this release will move from a monthly to a quarterly basis, with the next results, in respect of Quarter 3 2010, due to be released in November 2010.

The CSO "Airport Pairings" database contains information on every direct flight in and out of the nine Irish airports on a monthly basis. Data is available from January 2006 up to May 2010. Background Notes

Periodicity Monthly.

> Overseas Travel. Scope

All Overseas Travel into and out of the Republic of Ireland. Coverage

Data Collection The monthly Country of Residence Survey (CRS) forms the basis of the data used in this release.

This survey is conducted at Dublin, Cork, Shannon, Knock and Kerry airports and Rosslare, Ringaskiddy, Dún Laoghaire and Dublin ports. Data from passengers is collected by a Central

Statistics Office (CSO) interviewer.

A sample of flights and sailings is made to facilitate proper representation of airport/port pairings; **Sample Design** day, night, week day and weekend flights/sailings.

> On the selected flights/sailings, a 1 in 5 (20%) systematic sample of passengers is selected and their country of residence is recorded.

> Sample results are grossed to total passenger numbers travelling for each airport or port, as provided by the airports and ferry companies.

> Where there is no survey coverage in a month for an airport/port pairing, results are imputed using the 'nearest neighbour' imputation methodology.

Sample Size The sample size for the June 2010 Country of Residence Survey was just under 33,200 passengers.

Estimation of survey results using the above sampling design introduces a statistical variability which would not be present if all passengers from every flight/sailing had been interviewed. In some cases where ports/airports are unable to provide private/charter figures estimations are made. This means that the survey results are best estimates based on available information.

> This variability is expressed by means of a standard error. The standard error gives the relative size of the 'sampling error' (variability) present in an estimate compared with the estimate itself. In general, estimates can be said to have a relative precision of twice their standard error.

> The effect of sampling error is greater for small estimates and may, in particular, make it more difficult to compare figures for different time periods. Standard error estimates in respect of the major Area of Residence categories for the 2008 reference year are presented in the following table. In 2008, just over 468,000 persons were interviewed from a total of almost 33,838,500 journeys giving a sampling rate of 1.4%. The more detailed country figures in Table 5 would of course be subject to higher standard errors, as a percentage of the estimate.

Reliability of Results

In general, the more detailed the classification provided the greater the standard error of the estimates. In the derivation of the results, the assumption was made that non-respondents had similar characteristics and activity levels to those respondents in the same classification cell. This assumption, which is usual in surveys such as this, may introduce some slight bias into the results. Moreover, although every effort was made to ensure that the information received during interview was correct, it is possible that some minor non-sampling errors remain undetected.

Seasonal Adjustment

Visitor numbers to Ireland are subject to a high degree of seasonality. These seasonal fluctuations do not affect annual comparisons but they do affect monthly or quarterly comparisons. Typically trips are at their highest during the summer months, although there are also clear peaks around Christmas and Easter. To facilitate interpretation of underlying trends visitor numbers are adjusted to remove these seasonal trends.

The seasonal adjustment method used is the X-11 Arima (Auto-Regressive Integrated Moving Average) variant of the US Bureau of the Census X-11 seasonal adjustment model. Each series is adjusted separately to capture the different seasonal patterns exhibited by different visitor groups. Once a year, in January, new seasonal factors are calculated based on the most recent data available.

The X-11 Arima variant requires at least five years data. The present seasonally adjusted series are based on seasonal patterns from January 2000 to December 2009.

Definitions

(1) Trips

The data presented in this report is in terms of Trip numbers. A Trip is defined as a journey (usually including the return) from one place to another.

(2) Visitor

The definition of Visitor used in the CRS survey is based on that agreed with Eurostat, the European Statistical Office. A Visitor is defined as 'any person travelling to a place other than that of his/her usual environment for less than twelve months and whose main purpose is other than the exercise of an activity remunerated from within the place visited'. However, as the CRS does not establish the reason for an individual's trip or length of stay, those travelling for reason of remuneration or for more than one year to a country cannot be excluded. Therefore, for the purposes of this survey, Trips include those travelling for paid work. Commercial Drivers travelling on sea routes are excluded.

(3) Country of Residence

Country of Residence is defined as the country in which the person has resided during the past year.
