Progress Report on the CSO Annual Statistical Work Programme

2017

Introduction

The Central Statistics Office (CSO) Annual Statistical Work Programme 2017 was published on the CSO's website in March 2017 and is available <u>here</u>. This Annual Report presents information on the number of products which were produced in 2017, including new products not listed on the Work Programme for 2017, statistical innovations released during the year and also which products listed on the Work Programme for 2017 which were not produced.

Confidence in the quality and independence of official statistics is crucial as Ireland continues to use the information and insight provided by the CSO to guide economic and social development. In May 2017, the Irish Government adopted a Commitment on Confidence in Statistics reaffirming the CSO's independence, impartiality and quality. With the publication of the annual CSO Work Programme and Annual Report the CSO is complying with Principle 1.5 of the European Statistics Code of Practice on Professional Independence which states:

"The statistical work programmes are published and periodic reports describe progress made",

and recommendation 2 of the Eurostat Peer Review of the Irish Statistical System carried out in 2015 which stated:

"The Central Statistics Office of Ireland should regularly compile and publish the Irish annual statistical work programme covering statistical surveys and other statistical activities of European statistics. The progress reports should also be published accordingly. (European Statistics Code of Practice, indicators 1.5 and 11.2.)"

In the Annual Statistical Work Programme 2017, the products were divided into the following six main themes with twenty three associated sub-themes:

People and Society; Labour Market and Earnings; Business Sectors; Economy; General Statistical Publications; Environment.

The structure of the progress report matches the breakdown by theme and subtheme.






Highlights of the 2017 Work Programme

Main highlights of the 2017 Statistical Work Programme

- 252 statistical products were scheduled to be produced in 2017 compared to 228 in 2016
- 244 statistical products were actually published in 2017



- 21 new products were introduced in 2017, 11 of which were not listed on the 2017 work programme
- 19 products were delayed/not published in 2017
- 4 new visualisation tools were made available on the CSO website
- 73% of the products produced in 2017 were classified as European and 27% as National
- 36 EU Regulations mandated the collection of those European outputs.



- 16% of products used Administrative data only as their source data, up from 13% in 2016.
- 37% used Survey data as their source in 2017, down from 38% in 2016.
- 47% used a combination of Survey and Administrative data as their source data, down from 49% for the previous year.

Innovation

In the introduction to the 2017 statistical work programme the CSO outlined its commitment to the research and development of new products. During the course of the year CSO launched twenty one new products, one <u>new website</u> and four new <u>visualisation tools</u>.

New Products

The following ten products were listed as new on Work Programme and were produced in 2017:

Earning Analysis using Administrative Data Source 2011 – 2014

This release presents statistics on earnings based on administrative data sources. The primary data source is the Revenue Commissioner's P35L dataset of employee annual earnings which is linked to CSO and other data to provide demographic breakdowns of earnings similar to those previously provided by the National Employment Survey (NES).

Agricultural Land Prices

A new annual publication which expanded on agricultural land prices data already being published on CSO's Statbank. The information in this publication includes more detailed land price data at a regional level and more statistical indicators on volume and value of transactions.

Domestic Metered Public Water Consumption 2015

This annual publication on Domestic Metered Public Water Consumption is based on data from Irish Water on both meter readings and derived consumption data. Consumption data is presented by month, size class, threshold level, decile, county (average, median and number of meters) and Dublin Postal District (average, median and number of meters).

Networked Gas Consumption 2016

This annual release first published in August 2017 contains consumption data from Gas Networks Ireland on all connections to the mains gas network.

Environmental Subsidies and Similar Transfers

An annual publication first published in June 2017. As part of the implementation of the UN System of Environmental-Economic Accounting (SEEA), Eurostat, the European statistical office, has developed a series of environmental accounts modules, including the Environmental Subsidies and Similar Transfers module. An environmental subsidy or similar transfer is defined as a: "current or capital transfer that is intended to support activities which protect the environment or reduce the use and extraction of natural resources". Ireland has submitted data for voluntary collections in 2015 and 2016 and this new release is based on those submissions.

Continuing Vocational Training Survey (CVTS) 2015

The CVTS is a survey based on enterprises investment in education and training occurring during paid working time or paid at least partially by employers (if training activities are organised outside paid working time).

HSE Funded Dental Treatments 2013 - 2016

The number of Health Service Executive (HSE) funded treatments under the Dental Treatment Services Scheme (DTSS) from 2013-2016. Statistics on dental procedures by gender, age group, region and average payments are presented in this release first published in July 2017.

Aviation Statistics Quarterly

The data in this release provides details on the number of passengers classified by arrivals and departures, and by reference to national and international traffic; the number of flights by arrivals and departures and information on air freight and mail (in tonnes). The release also highlights the top routes for each of the five main airports: Dublin, Cork, Shannon, Knock and Kerry.

System of Health Accounts 2015

This release is the first official publication by CSO of health care expenditure estimates for Ireland according to the international standard of the System of Health Accounts. The release provides a detailed profile of Irish current health expenditure according to the classifications of the functions of health care (ICHA-HC), health care provision (ICHA-HP), and financing schemes (ICHA-HF).

Services Trade by Enterprise Characteristic

Electronic questionnaire for Eurostat on enterprise characteristics such as size (the number of employees), ownership (foreigncontrolled or domestic) and economic activity of enterprises trading in services.

During 2017 the CSO published eleven new products which were not originally listed on the 2017 Work Programme:

Historical Earnings 1938 -2015

Earnings statistics have been produced in Ireland since the early nineteen hundreds, published in the Irish Trade Journal and Statistical Bulletin. Broad Industrial average earnings were first published in 1938. This ad-hoc Historical Earnings publication focused on Industrial employees in the Industry sector and presented available average earnings data from 1938 – 2015.

Foreign Direct Investment in Ireland 2015

Published in May this publication presents experimental research which adds value to pre-existing Foreign Direct Investment (FDI) statistics and has been created in response to the large increase in Foreign Direct Investment in Ireland in 2015. As a result of this increase, when measured in terms of FDI, Ireland became one of the most globalised countries in the world.

Public Income and Expenditure on Water Supply and Water Waste Treatment 2000 – 2013

This annual release provides information on public income and expenditure on Water Services at local authority level for the period 2000 to 2013. Operational and capital figures are both included. Expenditure on maintenance and investment in water and waste water treatment plants have an impact on the quality of drinking water supplies and on the status of water bodies such as rivers and lakes.

Trade by Invoicing Currency (for extrastat data only)

Biennial product for transmission to Eurostat based on VIMA admin data on trade in goods by invoicing currency of the EU with countries outside the EU

Cereal Survey

A small cereal survey was piloted to estimate the level of crop stocks held on holdings in June and December in preparation for the reinstatement of the cereal balance sheets in 2018.

Ireland's Top Motors

A new visualisation tool and statistical product launched on 6 June 2017. The product contains model statistics on vehicle licensing for the first time. Monthly seasonally adjusted and trend series were developed and published for all vehicle licensing taxation classes. It allows users to follow trends in fuel types, colours and top makes of private cars, commercial vehicles, motor cycles and tractors.

Reporting of EDP supplementary questionnaire contingent liabilities to Eurostat at end year

The data on contingent liabilities are collected by Eurostat in the context of the reinforcement of the EU economic governance which took place in 2011 (the 'six-pack') and in particular of Council Directive 2011/85/EU of 8 November 2011 on requirements for budgetary frameworks of the Member States. Article 14(3) of this Directive laid down new statistical requirements on the Member States. The Decision specifies that Eurostat would collect and publish the following indicators related to contingent liabilities:

- government guarantees,
- off-balance public-private partnerships (PPPs),
- non-performing loans (government assets),
- Iiabilities of government controlled entities classified outside general government (public corporations) compiled by Eurostat on the basis of information collected via the Questionnaire on government controlled units classified outside general government.

<u>Register of Public Bodies</u>

Under Council Regulation (EC) No. 479/2009 as amended by Council Regulation 679/2010, and Commission Regulation (EU) No 220/2014 the Central Statistics Office (CSO) is required to define the scope of the Public Sector (which includes the General Government Sector) in Ireland. The Register of Public Bodies publication is produced in April and October and presents a list of bodies to be included in this register (reference year 2016) and information on the methodology and classifications employed in its compilation.

Electoral Division to Electoral Division commuting counts

Commuter flows (inward commuters less outward) by electoral division from Census 2016. Data is presented in the form of an interactive Census map.

New Website

Census Open Data Website

CSO and OSi launched a new Open Data website in August 2017 aimed at getting geographical and statistical information into the hands of Public Sector decision makers and Civil Society groups. The new website is part of OSi's GeoHive platform (http://www.geohive.ie) and is available at http://census2016.geohive.ie/. This new site makes the Census 2016 Small Area Population Statistics (SAPS) which were released by CSO on 20th July 2017, available as geographical Open Data for the first time. Any variable from Census 2016 SAPS can be visualized in map form across 31 Administrative Counties, 95 Municipal districts, 3,409 Electoral Divisions and 18,641 Small Areas. For the first time, this site provides access to the data so that the end-user can manipulate the data, change the visualisation, filter data, and combine multiple Layers to create their own maps which they can then save and embed in other applications.

Visualisation Tools

The CSO launched four new Visualisation tools on the website in 2017 to further enhance our dissemination channels for our Products:

Baby Names of Ireland App

The CSO launched a fun new online application in December 2017 for searching the baby names of Ireland. Located in the Interactive Zone of our website, and with information from 1964 to 2016, users can follow the popularity of the names of friends, family and children. You can also download and print a Name Certificate. The user enters their name and the year of your birth to see how many babies were registered with that name, and how that name ranked in that year.

Brexit Indicators: Ireland and the UK in numbers

The CSO setup a dedicated page on our website to track key indicators on the relationship between Ireland and the United Kingdom. The information is displayed graphically and links directly to the CSO databank so that the most recent data available is always shown. This webpage complements the publication in December 2016 of the CSO report "Brexit: Ireland and the UK in numbers" and has data on Ireland's relationship with the UK for: Trade in goods; Trade in services; Employment; Migration; Outbound travel (GB); Inbound travel (GB).

Ireland's Top Motors

A new visualisation tool which allows users to follow trends in fuel types, colours and top makes of private cars, commercial vehicles, motor cycles and tractors.

Census 2016 Interactive Maps

Twenty six interactive maps from Census 2016 on topics such as home ownership rates, feeder towns, age dependency and nationalities.

2017 Work Programme by Theme and Sub-theme

Products on the CSO Work Programme were divided into the following six main themes with twenty three associated sub-themes. Also included are the main Corporate publications produced during the year:

People and Society

Contained within this theme are statistical products all about people and the society in which we live. This theme is further divided into eight sub-themes and covers <u>Population and Migration</u>; <u>Births, Deaths and Marriages</u>; <u>Crime and Justice</u>; <u>Social Conditions</u>; <u>Health</u>; <u>Information Society</u>; <u>Education</u>; <u>Housing and Households</u>.

Twenty five of the twenty seven statistical products scheduled to be produced in 2017 were published. Two products were delayed (one until 2018) and two new products which were not listed on the work programme were produced.

Highlight:

Products - Census of Population suite of results

New Products:

Two new products not listed on the Work Programme were produced in 2017 -

- Electoral Division to Electoral Division commuting counts
- Vacancy by small area dataset

Products not produced:

The **Surnames** and the **Area Profiles** products were not produced. Work pressures associated with ensuring the published Census programme was completed on time led to the decision not to publish these products. The surnames product is now scheduled for release in early 2018.

Other Highlights:

Responding to high user demand for housing data, Census Division undertook significant additional and unplanned analysis on the housing stock. This additional analysis was included in the Census housing report.

Development work on the improvement of Census data through the investigation of incorporating administrative data in Census 2021 commenced.

The CSO is continuing to work with An Garda Síochána to improve the reliability of the data and will continue this analysis at regular intervals to monitor data quality.

The Household Budget Survey 2015-2016 was published in June.

Highlight:

Product – Household Budget Survey 2015-2016

The 2015-2016 Household Budget Survey (HBS) was undertaken between February 2015 and February 2016 inclusive, and covered 6,839 households. Some of the main results were:

- The estimated average weekly expenditure in 2015-2016 for all households in the State was €837.47. This was 3.3% higher than the €810.61 figure recorded five years earlier.
- The proportion of total household expenditure that related to expenditure on Food dropped from 16.2% in 2009-2010 to 14.7% in 2015-2016. Expenditure on Housing increased by 11.3% from €147.73 per week in 2009-2010 to €164.36 in 2015-2016. This was caused by an increase in expenditure on rent, purchases of dwellings and the introduction of Local property tax and Water charges.
- Expenditure on Alcoholic drink and tobacco decreased by 29.1% (from €39.48 per week to €28.00). This is due to a drop in expenditure on both Tobacco and Drink consumed out. Expenditure on Drink consumed at home has remained relatively consistent since 2009-2010 at €10.56.

Revisions to data:

Household Budget Survey 2015-2016

Some amendments were made to the data after publication relating to the calculation of medical expenditure and the derivation of household income.

Labour Market and Earnings

Statistical Products measuring employment/unemployment, the flow of jobs and persons, industrial disputes, earnings and labour costs are included in this area. The theme is subdivided into two sub-themes <u>Labour Market</u>; <u>Earnings</u>.

Six of the eight statistical products scheduled to be produced in 2017 were published.

Products not produced:

- Labour Force Survey this new survey was not published in 2017. It was published on January 16th 2018 (for reference quarter Q3 2017)
- Job Churn the job churn product is being reviewed to ensure coherence with other products produced from the P35 administrative file; in particular this review is being undertaken to ensure that the earnings figures included in the Job Churn output are coherent with those produced from the Earnings Analysis from Administrative Data Sources (EAADS). In addition, the actual outputs which are published are also being reviewed as the current outputs included are overly complex and difficult for users to understand and more reflect the outputs of a research product rather than a statistical release.

This ad-hoc Historical Earnings publication focused on Industrial employees in the Industry sector and presented available average earnings data from 1938 – 2015.

Business Sectors

Statistical Products measuring all aspects of the Business Economy using short term statistics and longer term structural statistics. This theme is further divided into seven sub-themes and covers <u>Agriculture</u>; <u>Construction</u>; <u>Industry</u>; <u>Multisectoral</u>; <u>Services</u>; <u>Tourism</u> and <u>Travel</u>; <u>Transport</u>.

15 of the statistical products scheduled to be produced in 2017 were produced. 2 new products due to be published in 2017 were delayed as detailed below and 1 new product was launched which was not listed on the work programme.

New Product:

One product which was not listed on the Work Programme was produced in 2017 -

Cereal Survey - A small cereal survey was piloted to estimate the level of crop stocks held on holdings in June and December in preparation for the reinstatement of the cereal balance sheets in 2018.

Products not produced:

Cereal Supply Balance and **Supply Balance for Oilseeds** were two new products due to be produced in 2017. They were not published in 2017 due to delays resulting from an unexpected change in methodology and launch date by the European statistics agency Eurostat. The revised release dates for these products is unclear pending further clarification from Eurostat on the correct methodology to be used.

Revisions to data:

The planned revisions/methodological changes that were due to be made to the Crops and Livestock Survey did not take place because Eurostat delayed the reintroduction of the cereal balance sheets until 2018. In response to this delay the CSO piloted a small cereal survey in preparation for the reinstatement of the cereal balance sheets.
