NOTES.

CODE NUMBERS:—A complete list of industries, with code numbers, is given on pages XI-XII. and a complete list of occupations on pages VIII-X. In the following table code numbers corresponding to those on the lists are shown opposite each industry and each occupation or group of occupations. Industries and their respective code numbers are shown in heavy type; groups of occupations within each industry are shown in italics and the principal occupations within each industry are shown in ordinary type.

PRINCIPAL OCCUPATIONS WITHIN EACH INDUSTRY :—These are arranged in order of code number, irrespective of the number in each occupation. Where two or more occupations have been added together and shown under a general description, a (+) has been inserted at the side of the code number. For example, on page 75, Industry Code Number 072—Plumbing, Domestic Heating and Lighting Industry—the occupational description " Other Skilled Workers " (Code Number 094) includes any Skilled Metal Workers in the industry except those specifically mentioned (i.e., Employers and Managers, Mechanics (so returned), Fitters, Plumbers and Gasfitters), whilst " Other Metal Workers " (Code Number 095) includes any unskilled workers, other than Plumbers and Gasfitters' Labourers, in the industry. The description " All Other Occupations," which covers any occupations in the industry which are not specifically mentioned, is shown without code number reference.
