


# Reading Habits of Teenagers vs Adults

12-13 years old14-15 years old • 16-17 years old • 18-19 years old




# INTRODUCTION

#### How do the Reading Habits of Teenagers differ from the Reading Habits of Adults?








### **FREQUENCY**

The first question on our survey was simply, "How often do you read?" We found that for teenagers it was more likely for them to either read daily or almost never. But the majority do read daily. From the comments at the end of the survey, it seems




that teens are either super-readers or not readers at all. As for adults, 30% responded that they almost never read, 25% said monthly and 25% weekly, leaving the last 20% of adults readers that read daily. From this we have deduced that teenagers read more often that adults.

#### INTEREST / GENRE


In question 6, how did you get interest in reading the most common answer for the teenagers was other and for the adults it was through family.



Family Adult Category Title Teenager


How did you get interested in reading?


