Survey on Income and Living Conditions (SILC) 2014 results

Note

Revised SILC results have been produced for reference years 2012-2014. See Survey on Income and Living Conditions 2015

The Survey on Income and Living Conditions (SILC) in Ireland is a household survey covering a broad range of issues in relation to income and living conditions. It is the official source of data on household and individual income and also provides a number of key national poverty indicators, such as the 'at risk of poverty' rate, the consistent poverty rate and rates of enforced deprivation. A summary of the key results of the 2014 survey and comparable results from previous years is presented below:

Summary of main findings

- In 2014, the nominal median annual equivalised disposable income was €18,210 representing an increase of 3.8% on the nominal 2013 value of €17,551. The real median annual equivalised disposable income was €17,977, an increase of 3.5% on the previous year's figure. These changes are statistically significant.
- ♦ The Gini coefficient in 2014 was 31.8% compared with 31.3% in 2013. The quintile share ratio was 5.0 in 2014 compared with 4.8 in 2013. These changes are not statistically significant.
- ♦ In 2014, the 'at risk of poverty' rate was 16.3% compared with 15.2% in 2013. The change is not statistically significant.
- Enforced deprivation was experienced by 29.0% of the population in 2014, down from 30.5% in 2013. This change is not statistically significant.
- ♦ The consistent poverty rate was 8.0%, not a statistically significant change on the 2013 figure of 8.2%.
