

Cattle slaughterings up 1.6% in March

The number of cattle slaughtered in March 2009 was 1.6 % higher than in March 2008. See Table 1 and graph.

A comparison of March 2009 and 2008 figures show that (see Table 1):

- ◆ Sheep slaughterings decreased by 8.7%.
- ◆ Pig slaughterings increased by 0.6%.

The number of cattle slaughterings in January-March 2009 was 7.8% lower than the corresponding 2008 figure. Over the same period there was a decrease of 3.5% in sheep slaughterings and a decrease of 8.4% in pig slaughterings.

Between the periods January to December 2007 and 2008, Ireland, Italy and the United Kingdom recorded decreases in cattle slaughterings of 6.0%, 4.1% and 1.1% respectively. During the same period, Germany recorded an increase of 3.7%. See Page 4.

Background Notes

Introduction

This release gives details on the number and carcass weight of cattle, sheep and pig slaughterings. These figures include slaughterings at both licensed meat export and Local Authority licensed premises. Estimates for the on-farm kill of sheep and pigs have also been incorporated. The collection of monthly slaughtering data for pigs, cattle and sheep is governed by Regulation (EC) No. 1165/2008.

Export

Information on the number of slaughterings in meat export premises for cattle, sheep and pigs is received from the Department of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food on a monthly basis. Average carcass weights of cattle are taken from the Department's Beef Carcass Classification Scheme. Average weights of pigs are based on information obtained directly from the export factories by the CSO. Average weights of sheep are derived following consultation with industry experts.

Local Authorities

The CSO conducts a monthly survey of all Local Authorities in the State. All slaughterings in premises over which inspection controls are exercised are included.

The CSO estimates the carcass weight of cattle, sheep and pigs slaughtered under Local Authority control. These estimates are reviewed on a regular basis with butchers and abattoirs.

Calves

Calves are included with cattle.

Carcass weight

For cattle, the carcass weight is defined as the weight of the slaughtered animal's cold body after being skinned, bled and eviscerated and after removal of external genitalia, the limb at the carpus and tarsus, head, tail, kidneys and kidney fats and the udder.

For sheep, the carcass weight is defined as the weight of the slaughtered animal's cold body after being skinned, bled and eviscerated and after removal of the head, feet, tail and genital organs including the udder. Kidneys and kidney fats are included in the carcass.

For pigs, the carcass weight is defined as the weight of the slaughtered animal's cold body either whole or divided in half along the mid-line, after being bled and eviscerated and after the removal of the tongue, bristles, hooves, genitalia, flare fat, kidneys and diaphragm.
