



Percentage of households that have experienced any crime, classified by region, 2006

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Crime and Victimisation

Quarterly National Household Survey 2006 (including results for 1998 and 2003)

Small reduction in crime rates between 2003 and 2006

There was a reduction in the prevalence of personal crime experienced by those aged 18 years and over in 2006 when compared with 2003. In 2006, there were an estimated 150,700 persons (4.6%) who experienced theft with violence, theft or physical assault (excluding domestic and sexual assaults). Both the 2003 and 2006 rates were, however, approximately double the 2.4% prevalence rates in 1998 (the only other year for which directly comparable figures are available). See table 1a.

In 2006, 11.3% of all households were affected by property crime. This compares with 11.7% and 12.1% in 2003 and 1998 respectively. Offences included as property crimes are burglary, theft of and from vehicles, theft of bicycles and vandalism. *See table 17a*.

Males and young adults more at risk

There were 91,800 (5.7%) male victims of personal crimes in 2006 compared with 58,900 (3.6%) females. For both sexes, the most at risk age groups were younger adults aged 18-24 years followed by those in the 25-44 years category. The prevalence of these crime types in these age categories for males was 11.3% and 6.0%, respectively. For females, the corresponding rates were 6.4% and 4.1%. See table 1a and 1b. However, the survey did not cover domestic violence or sexual assault, for which the majority of victims are female. See background notes

As in previous years, Dublin was the region with the highest prevalence of both personal and property crime. In 2006, 18.0% of Dublin households were affected, compared to the national figure of 11.3% (i.e. Dublin households were about 50% more likely to have experienced property crime than households in the country as a whole). The Border, South-East and South-West regions had the lowest levels, at 7.7%. In general, households in rural areas had less than half the prevalence of property crime as those in urban areas. *See tables 17a & 17b*.

About 61 Dublin residents in every 1,000 experienced personal crime as against the national figure of 46 persons. This is a reduction from 2003 when the corresponding figures were 73 and 52 for Dublin and the whole country, respectively. *See tables 1a, 1b, 1c & 1d.* In general, residents of urban areas were twice as likely to be victims of robbery and three times more likely to have been assaulted than those in rural areas. *See adjacent table.*

Location of incidents

More than 4 in every 10 people who were victims of theft with violence indicated that the offence occurred in the vicinity of home. This reflects a change since 1998, when less than a quarter of incidents occurred near home. In 1998, almost 1 in every 5 such robberies occurred close to a pub or club. In 2006, this had reduced to less than 1 in 10. The location of assaults showed similar trends. *See tables 3 & 9*.

Burglary

For every 1000 households in the state, 32 were affected by burglary in 2006. This is a small reduction from both 2003 and 1998 when the corresponding figure was 34. In over half of these burglaries, someone was present in the home at the time of the burglary. In approximately 3 in 10 occurrences, such a burglary was not reported to the Gardaí. Of the 48,700 households burgled in 2006, about 15% were burgled more than once. *See table 18*.

Vandalism

As in previous years, vandalism was the most common household crime experienced in 2006. Of the 72,800 households affected, about 3 in every 10 households were affected more than once. This indicates that, where it occurs, vandalism is a recurring problem. Households in urban areas were more than 3 times as likely to experience vandalism than households in rural areas. *See table 22*. While nearly 1 in 20 households were affected by vandalism, households containing one adult with children were over 50% more likely to have been affected than the national average. *See table 17b*.

Perceptions of crime and safety

Even though the risk of being a victim of personal crime almost doubled between 1998 and 2006, feelings of safety in the home or in the neighbourhood have remained relatively stable. About three quarters of people said that they would feel safe or very safe walking alone in the neighbourhood after dark. Similar results were obtained in 2003 and 1998. For every 1,000 persons, about 935 said that they would feel safe or very safe in their homes after dark – a figure which is almost identical to that recorded in previous years. *See tables 12a & 13a.*

When asked about the seriousness of crime in Ireland, just over 80% responded that it was either a serious or very serious problem. This has not changed appreciably since 1998 when about 76% responded similarly. In all years, about 3% of people said that crime was not a problem or a serious problem. *See table 14a*.

Sex and age differences in perceptions of safety

There is an appreciable difference in perceptions of safety between males and females as well as between younger and older persons. The proportion of females who would feel unsafe or very unsafe walking alone in the neighbourhood is about four times higher than that for males (41.5% and 10.9%, respectively). Perception of safety in the neighbourhood also decreases with age. Of those aged 65 years or over, 45.2% would feel unsafe or very unsafe in their area after dark. There are similar differences in perceptions of safety alone in the home after dark. While about 1 in 40 men would feel unsafe or very unsafe in their homes after dark, the figure is 1 in 10 for women. Again, those aged 65 years and over feel less

safe than others. Also, about 1 in 9 young women aged 18-24 years would feel unsafe or very unsafe alone at home at night. *See tables 12b and 13b*.

Reporting of crime to the Gardai

In general, reporting of crime incidents to the Gardaí seems to be related to the perceived seriousness of the crime, the financial loss incurred (and whether the loss is insured) and the individual's perception as to whether the Gardaí could or would do anything about the incident. Overall, reporting rates to the Gardaí have changed little since 2003. This, however, follows on from a reduction in reporting rates from 1998 to 2003. *See adjacent table*.

In about 3 of every 10 cases, burglaries were not reported. Of those who did not report a burglary, almost 36% believed the Gardaí could (17.2%) or would (18.6%) do nothing. Almost 5% did not wish to involve the Gardaí, while over 41% said that the incident was not serious enough or there was no loss. *See tables 18 & 20.*

Households that suffered vandalism reported the incident to the Gardaí in just over 4 in 10 instances. For unreported incidents, 45.6% said the incident was not serious enough to report, while 42.5% believed that the Gardaí could (20.5%) or would (22.0%) do nothing. *See tables 23a & 23b*.

For violent theft, 61.5% of incidents were reported. For unreported violent thefts, 40% believed that the Gardaí could (13.8%) or would (26.2%) do nothing. A belief that the incident was not serious enough was cited by 30.5% of people as the reason for not reporting. *See tables 2 & 5*.

For assaults, just over half were reported. For unreported assaults, 4 in 10 said the incident was not serious enough. Over 10% did not wish to involve the Gardaí while almost 7% said that they feared reprisal if the incident was reported. *See tables 8b and 11*.

Satisfaction with the Gardai


Just over half (50.9%) of people rated the work of the Gardaí in the local area as good or very good. This is a reduction from 2003 and 1998 when the corresponding figures were 56.4% and 63.4% respectively. (Those who did not give an opinion rose to 6.5% in 2006, reflecting in part the increased numbers of non-Irish nationals, many of whom did not express an opinion).

The proportion of people who rated the work of the Gardaí as "very good" has almost halved in the period since 1998, from 18.6% to 9.6%. *See tables 16a & 16b*.

Background Notes

Reference period

The Crime and Victimisation module was included in the Quarterly National Household Survey (QNHS) in the three months interviewing period from September to November 2006. The module was carried out in the same period in 1998 and 2003. Respondents were asked about experiences in the previous 12 months.

Questionnaire

The module contained over fifty questions on crime-related topics, divided into two main sections - household and individual questions:

Household

- security of premises
- burglary
- theft of and from vehicles
- vandalism
- theft of bicycles

Individual

- theft with violence
- theft without violence
- physical assault
- perceptions and opinions in relation to crime, safety and the Gardaí

The module also included questions on the seriousness of crimes (such as cost and injuries) and on whether crimes were reported to the Gardaí. These questions related to the last incident, in cases where the household or person had been a victim of a particular kind of crime more than once in the past year. The survey did not ask about sexual assaults or domestic violence, as these questions are too sensitive and personal for inclusion in a general household survey such as the QNHS. The questions about crimes against individuals and about perceptions and opinions were confined to persons aged 18 or over participating directly in the survey.

Definitions of crimes

Burglary: Breaking and entering by a person into a premises (either a house/flat or an outbuilding). Thefts from gardens are not included nor thefts by a person who has the permission/right to be in the premises.

Vandalism: Damage done to any type of property or vehicle belonging to any member of the household, for example graffiti on house, shed or garden walls, damage to vehicles.

Theft with violence: Stealing or attempting to steal something from a person by using force or threatening to use violence. This includes incidents such as mugging or attempted mugging. Sometimes referred to as robbery.

Theft without violence: Stealing or attempting to steal something from a person without involving force. Examples of this type of incident are pick-pocketing or a jacket being stolen.

Physical assault: Physical assault of a person, excluding attacks of a sexual nature and domestic violence.

Double-counting of incidents was avoided as much as possible. For example, if a person was attacked during a burglary then this incident would have been only recorded as burglary and not also as an assault.

Survey weighting

The QNHS grossing procedure aligns the distribution of persons covered in the sample with independently determined population estimates at the level of sex, five-year age group and region. The Crime and Victimisation module can be thought of as a subset of the QNHS. The same weighting procedure was used to ensure the totals matched independent population estimates.

Nationality

The figures presented on nationality are based on a self perception question, in which the respondent could choose from a list of nationalities. As the QNHS is a household survey some nationalities may be under-represented in the figures.

Presentation of results

The results of this module are being presented, in general, in the form of percentages. Some of the survey results should be interpreted with extreme caution as the number of respondents in certain detailed categories is too few to allow valid conclusions to be drawn. However, all estimates have been presented as suppressing some cells would have taken from the coherence of the release. The 1998 and 2003 figures have been revised in line with current grossing methodology to facilitate direct comparisons between the years. While the reference period of the survey does not correspond to an exact calendar year, the results are presented as referring to the year in which most of the reference period belongs. Therefore, the results are given as referring to 1998, 2003 and 2006. Survey questions used to generate perception results (Tables 12-15) elicited a very small number of non-responses. These have been excluded for the purposes of these tables.

Comparison with Garda statistics

The survey results are not directly comparable with administrative crime statistics such as the "Headline Crime" release which is based on Garda administrative sources. There are fundamental differences in sources, definitions and classification methodology. The administrative sources provide a much more detailed breakdown of offences reported or known to the Gardaí, offences prosecuted and offences committed by juvenile offenders. The CSO survey results provide a more aggregated view of the level of crime, including unreported incidents, together with details of the demographic characteristics of victims.

Acknowledgements: The original questions asked in the 1998 module on crime and victimisation were designed with the assistance of an advisory committee comprising representatives of the following organisations: An Garda Síochána, Department of Justice, Equality and Law Reform, Department of an Taoiseach, Economic and Social Research Institute, National Council on Ageing and Older People, National Womens Council, the Health Boards and other researchers.

Regions

The regional classifications in this release are based on the NUTS (Nomenclature of Territorial Units) classification used by Eurostat. The NUTS3 regions correspond to the eight Regional Authorities established under the Local Government Act, 1991 (Regional Authorities) (Establishment) Order, 1993, which came into operation on 1 January 1994. The NUTS2 regions, which were proposed by Government and agreed by Eurostat in 1999, are groupings of the NUTS3 regions. The composition of the regions is set out below.
