Over 90,000 days lost in the first quarter

During the first quarter of 2001, there were 90,427 days lost due to industrial disputes. This compares to 23,238 days lost for the same period last year. The 11 disputes in progress in the first quarter of 2001 involved 21,289 workers.

The largest dispute in the first quarter was the teachers' strike, which accounted for more than 80% of the total days lost. Disputes in the transport, storage and communication sector accounted for a further 12%, while the rest of the days lost were in construction and manufacturing. *See table 1*.

Central Statistics Office Industrial Disputes

Background Notes

The information on Industrial Disputes is based on details supplied by the Monitoring Unit of the Department of Enterprise, Trade and Employment and on information collected directly from other sources by the Central Statistics Office.

Scope Disputes are included in this release if they involve a stoppage of work lasting for at least one day and the total time lost is 10 or more person-days.

Days Lost In calculating days lost, it is assumed that work would have continued if no dispute had occurred. No allowance is made for loss of work from unemployment or other causes (such as bad weather) which might have happened even if there was no dispute. The number of days lost is calculated by multiplying the number of persons involved by the number of normal working days during which they were involved in the dispute. Persons working for approximately 40 hours per week are assumed to be working the equivalent of a 5 day week even if the work is spread over more than 5 days.

Disputes in Progress

The tables show data on disputes which began and disputes which were in progress in each quarter. The quarterly figures for the number of disputes in progress and for the number of firms and workers involved will not always add to the annual total, since an industrial dispute can be in progress in more than one quarter.
