



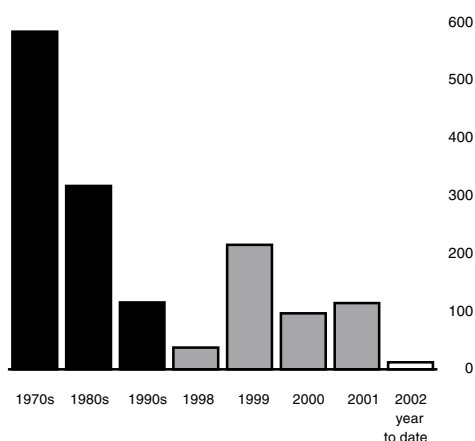

Less than 8,500 days lost in the second quarter.

During the second quarter of 2002, there were 8,487 days lost due to industrial disputes. This compares to 19,706 days lost for the same period last year. The 7 disputes in progress in the second quarter of 2002 involved 8 organisations and 1,463 workers.

The manufacturing sector (55%) and the transport, storage and communication sector (27%) are the sectors most affected in terms of days lost.

In the first six months of 2002 there were 12,110 days lost due to industrial disputes. This compares to 110,133 days lost for the first six months of last year. The figure for last year remains significantly larger than this year even if one allows for the impact the teachers' dispute had on last years' figures. *See table 1.*

Background Notes

Sources The information on Industrial Disputes is based on details supplied by the Monitoring Unit of the Department of Enterprise, Trade and Employment and on information collected directly from other sources by the Central Statistics Office.

Scope Disputes are included in this release if they involve a stoppage of work lasting for at least one day and the total time lost is 10 or more person-days.

Days Lost In calculating days lost, it is assumed that work would have continued if no dispute had occurred. No allowance is made for loss of work from unemployment or other causes (such as bad weather) which might have happened even if there was no dispute. The number of days lost is calculated by multiplying the number of persons involved by the number of normal working days during which they were involved in the dispute. Persons working for approximately 40 hours per week are assumed to be working the equivalent of a 5 day week even if the work is spread over more than 5 days.

Disputes in Progress The tables show data on disputes which began and disputes which were in progress in each quarter. The quarterly figures for the number of disputes in progress and for the number of firms and workers involved will not always add to the annual total, since an industrial dispute can be in progress in more than one quarter.
