

1,801 days lost in the second quarter

During the second quarter of 2006 there were 1,801 days lost to industrial disputes. This compares with 1,556 for the same period last year. Three disputes began in the second quarter of 2006. See table 1.

Five disputes began or were in progress in the first six months of 2006, involving five firms and a total of 5,208 days lost. During that period, the Construction sector accounted for just over 65% of the total days lost and just over 19% were accounted for by the Manufacturing sector. See table 2.

Background Notes

- **Sources** The information on Industrial Disputes is based on details supplied by the Monitoring Unit of the Industrial Relations section within the Employment Rights and Industrial Relations division (Department of Enterprise, Trade and Employment) and on information collected directly from other sources by the Central Statistics Office.
- **Scope** Disputes are included in this release if they involve a stoppage of work lasting for at least one day and the total time lost is 10 or more person–days.
- **Days Lost** In calculating days lost, it is assumed that work would have continued if no dispute had occurred. No allowance is made for loss of work from unemployment or other causes (such as bad weather) which might have happened even if there was no dispute. The number of days lost is calculated by multiplying the number of persons involved by the number of normal working days during which they were involved in the dispute. Persons working for approximately 40 hours per week are assumed to be working the equivalent of a 5 day week even if the work is spread over more than 5 days.
- **Disputes in Progress** The tables show data on disputes which began and disputes which were in progress in each quarter. The quarterly figures for the number of disputes in progress and for the number of firms and workers involved will not always add to the annual total, since an industrial dispute can be in progress in more than one quarter.
- Reference QuartersThe reference quarters for Industrial Disputes results are:
Q1 January to March, Q2 April to June, Q3 July to September and Q4 October to December.
