# **July 2000**

## Annual Inflation rises to 6.2% in July

This release provides a summary analysis of the major price developments within the main CPI commodity groups together with constituent CPI Sub-Indices and details of their monthly and annual percentage changes. It also details the annual and monthly percentage changes for each commodity group for each month from January 1998 to date.

A detailed description of the CPI is published in the June 1997 issue of the Irish Statistical Bulletin. This release, together with the monthly CPI Statistical Release is available on the CSO Web Site (<u>www.cso.ie</u>) immediately following publication.

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
## **Consumer Price Index**

#### **Food**


Food prices rose by 0.7% in July, thereby increasing the annual percentage change in the year to July to 4.1%, up from 3.1% in June. There were increases in the prices of beef, mutton/lamb, bacon, potatoes and meals out, while the price of confectionery such as cakes and biscuits, preserves and yogurt fell.





### **Alcoholic Drink**


Alcoholic drink prices rose by 0.3% in July, increasing the annual percentage change to 5.1%, up from 5.0% in the year to June. Increased prices were recorded for beer and spirits consumed in public houses. The annual increase in the year to July added +0.67% to the overall Consumer Price Index of 6.2%.





### **Tobacco**


Tobacco prices remained relatively stable in July. The only price increase recorded was for flake tobacco. As a result, there was a marginal decrease in the annual percentage increase for tobacco in the year to July down to 17.4% from 17.5% in June.





# **Clothing & Footwear**


Clothing & Footwear prices fell by 9.2% in July as a result of the traditional summer sales. This decrease is lower than last year when a decrease of 9.7% was recorded during the same period. Since July last year, Clothing & Footwear prices have decreased by 5.4% reflecting continuing competition in this sector.





# **Fuel & Light**

Fuel & Light prices rose by 0.5% in July, a lower increase than the same period last year. As a result, the annual percentage increase in the year to July fell to 7.1%, down from 8.2% in June. Price increases were recorded for domestic home heating oil, firelighters and coal. The annual increase in home heating oil has fallen to 34.3%, down from over 47% in the year to June.






# Housing


Housing costs rose by 4.4% in July, increasing the annual percentage increase to 10.6%, up from 6.1% in June. Higher average mortgage repayments in July, in contrast to falling average payments last year, and increased repair and decoration costs were the main reasons for this increase.





#### **Durable Household Goods**


Durable Household Goods prices fell by 1.7% in July following the impact of summer sales on certain categories of goods. There were price reductions in furniture and soft furnishings such as bed linen and in crockery, glassware and kitchen utensils. Year on year, the prices of durable goods have risen by 0.5%.





#### Other Goods

The price of Other Goods fell marginally in July by 0.2%, but show an increase of 4.0% over the same period last year. The price of certain newspapers and personal goods, such as ladies handbags and suitcases fell while price increases were recorded for items such as toilet paper and deodorant.





## **Transport**


Transport prices rose again in July, up by 1.0% in the month or by 9.0% in the year. The main increases were in the prices of motor fuel and car insurance. The annual increase in the cost of motor fuel in the year to July was 24.3%, while other vehicle costs rose by 10.5%. In July, Transport contributed 1.26% to the overall CPI of 6.2%.



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# **Services & Related Expenditure**


Services and Related Expenditure rose by 0.4% in July, putting the annual increase in Services inflation to 7.0%. In July, price increases were recorded for childcare, cinema and dancing, medical expenses, hairdressing, shoe repairs, laundry and dry cleaning and package holidays. The largest year on year increases have been recorded for childcare, hairdressing, education & training and medical expenses.





## **Overall CPI**

Consumer Prices increased by 0.3% in July to bring the overall CPI to 111.1. This compares with a decrease of 0.4% in July 1999. As a result, annual inflation in the twelve months to July 2000 was 6.2%, compared with 5.5% in June 2000. The main contributory factors were increases in transport, services and related expenditure, food, tobacco, housing and alcoholic drink.
