## September 2000

## Annual Inflation remains unchanged at 6.2% in September

This release provides a summary analysis of the major price developments within the main CPI commodity groups together with constituent CPI Sub-Indices and details of their monthly and annual percentage changes. It also details the annual and monthly percentage changes for each commodity group for each month from January 1998 to date.

A detailed description of the CPI is published in the June 1997 issue of the Irish Statistical Bulletin. This release, together with the monthly CPI Statistical Release is available on the CSO Web Site (www.cso.ie) immediately following publication.

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
## **Consumer Price Index**

#### September 2000




#### **Food**

Food prices remained static in September, but the annual increase in the year to September rose to 4.6%, up from 4.3% in August. In September, there were increases in the price of biscuits, beef, poultry and meals out while the price of potatoes, fresh fruit and vegetables, bread, milk and butter fell.



### **Alcoholic Drink**


Alcoholic Drink prices showed a minor increase in September with bar and public house prices remaining stable and some small increases in off licence prices. As a result of this, the annual percentage change fell marginally to 4.9%, down from 5.0% in August. The annual increase added +0.65% to the overall annual consumer price index of 6.2%.





#### Tobacco


Tobacco prices remained relatively stable in September with no major price changes. The annual percentage change since September 1999 is 17.4%, down marginally from the previous month.





## **Clothing & Footwear**


Clothing & Footwear prices showed some signs of further recovery from the summer sales as well as some general price increases. Following a fall of 9.2% in July, prices rose by 4.2% in August and by a further 2.4% in September. Year on year the annual percentage change shows a decline of 5.6% in Clothing & Footwear prices since last year, reflecting the strong competition in this sector.





## **Fuel & Light**


Fuel & Light prices rose by 1.9% in September with a further increase in the cost of home heating oil and the price of bottled gas. The annual percentage increase in the twelve months since September 1999 was 9.1%, an increase on the August rate of 7.9%. The annual increase in the price of home heating oil in the year to September was 46.6%, up from 39.6% in August.





## Housing


Housing costs rose by 1.6% in September, reflecting higher mortgage interest payments, increased local authority rents and higher house insurance premiums. The annual increase in housing is now running at 16.6% in the year to September. This is in contrast to the annual change in the year to September of last year when there was an annual decrease of 14.1% reflecting falling interest rates at that time.





## **Durable Household Goods**


Following the conclusion of the summer sales in August, there were further recoveries in the prices of Durable Household Goods in September. There were some further price increases for items such as furniture and soft furnishings. Year on year, Durable Household Goods have risen by 0.7%.





#### Other Goods


The price of Other Goods rose by 0.6% in September, putting the annual rate of increase in prices at 4.0%, up from 3.7% in August. Price increases were recorded for certain newspapers, magazines and books, paper goods and stationery, toilet and kitchen paper, cosmetics and shampoo and other hair applications.






## **Transport**

Transport prices rose marginally in September but at a slower rate than for the same period last year. As a result, the annual increase in the year to September was 7.1%, down from 8.1% in August. There were increases in the cost of motor insurance and repairs and maintenance. These increases were partially offset by decreases in the price of motor fuel, boat fares and car hire.



## **Services & Related Expenditure**


Services & Related Expenditure costs rose by 0.1% in September in contrast to an increase of 1.7% for the same period last year. There were marginal increases in entertainment costs, medicines, hairdressing and package holidays and decreases in telephone charges and accommodation costs.





## **Overall CPI**

Consumer Prices increased by 0.4% in September to bring the overall CPI to 112.1. This increase was the same as that recorded for September 1999. As a result, annual inflation in the twelve months to September 2000 remained unchanged at 6.2% for the second successive month.
