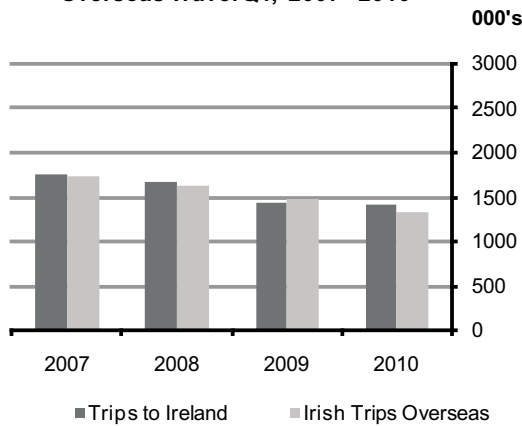

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Irish trips abroad decreased by over 10% in Quarter 4 2010

Irish residents took 1,322,500 overseas trips in Quarter 4 2010. This is a decrease of 10.2% when compared to the same quarter in 2009. The last quarter in 2009 saw a drop of 10.0% from Quarter 4 2008. *See Tables 1 and 2.*

In Quarter 4 2010, the total number of overseas trips to Ireland fell by 2.2% compared to the same period twelve months earlier. The annual comparison shows that visitors to Ireland have decreased by 12.9% in 2010 compared to 2009. *See Tables 1, 2 and 4.*

The number of trips to Ireland by residents of Great Britain fell by 8.7% from Quarter 4 2009 to 657,600 in Quarter 4 2010. Trips from Other Areas and North America rose by 9.2% and 13.9% respectively while those from Other Europe remained virtually unchanged. *See Tables 1 and 2.*

Background Notes

Periodicity	Quarterly.
Scope	Overseas Travel.
Coverage	All Overseas Travel into and out of the Republic of Ireland.
Data Collection	The quarterly Country of Residence Survey (CRS) forms the basis of the data used in this release. This survey is conducted at Dublin, Cork, Shannon, Knock and Kerry airports and Rosslare, Ringaskiddy, Dún Laoghaire and Dublin ports. Data from passengers is collected by a Central Statistics Office (CSO) interviewer.
Sample Design	<p>A sample of flights and sailings is made to facilitate proper representation of airport/port pairings; day, night, week day and weekend flights/sailings.</p> <p>On the selected flights/sailings, a 1 in 5 (20%) systematic sample of passengers is selected and their country of residence is recorded.</p> <p>Sample results are grossed to total passenger numbers travelling for each airport or port pairing, as provided by the airports and ferry companies.</p> <p>Where there is no survey coverage in a quarter for an airport/port pairing, results are imputed using the 'nearest neighbour' imputation methodology.</p>
Sample Size	The sample size for the Q4 2010 Country of Residence Survey was just over 71,800 passengers.
Reliability of Results	<p>Estimation of survey results using the above sampling design introduces a statistical variability which would not be present if <i>all</i> passengers from <i>every</i> flight/sailing had been interviewed. In some cases where ports/airports are unable to provide private/charter figures, estimations are made. This means that the survey results are best estimates based on available information.</p> <p>This variability is expressed by means of a standard error. The standard error gives the relative size of the 'sampling error' (variability) present in an estimate compared with the estimate itself. In general, estimates can be said to have a relative precision of twice their standard error.</p>

The effect of sampling error is greater for small estimates and may, in particular, make it more difficult to compare figures for different time periods. Standard error estimates in respect of the major Area of Residence categories for the 2008 reference year are presented in the following table. In 2008, just over 468,000 persons were interviewed from a total of almost 33,838,500 journeys giving a sampling rate of 1.4%. The more detailed country figures in Table 5 would of course be subject to higher standard errors, as a percentage of the estimate.

In general, the more detailed the classification provided the greater the standard error of the estimates. In the derivation of the results, the assumption was made that non-respondents had similar characteristics and activity levels to those respondents in the same classification cell. This assumption, which is usual in surveys such as this, may introduce some slight bias into the results. Moreover, although every effort was made to ensure that the information received during interview was correct, it is possible that some minor non-sampling errors remain undetected.

Definitions

- (1) Trips** The data presented in this report is in terms of Trip numbers. A Trip is defined as a journey (usually including the return) from one place to another.
- (2) Visitor** The definition of Visitor used in the CRS survey is based on that agreed with Eurostat, the European Statistical Office. A Visitor is defined as '*any person travelling to a place other than that of his/her usual environment for less than twelve months and whose main purpose is other than the exercise of an activity remunerated from within the place visited*'. However, as the CRS does not establish the reason for an individual's trip or length of stay, those travelling for reason of remuneration or for more than one year to a country cannot be excluded. Therefore, for the purposes of this survey, Trips include those travelling for paid work. Commercial Drivers travelling on sea routes are excluded.
- (3) Country of Residence** Country of Residence is defined as the country in which the person has resided during the past year.
