NOTE.—The parishes of Currykippane, Kilcully, Rathcooney, and parts of the parishes of Ballinaboy, Carrigaline, Carrigrohane, Dunbulloge, Inishkenny, Killanully, Kilnaglory, St. Anne Shandon, St. Finbar, St. Mary Shandon, St. Michael, St. Nicholas, and Whitechurch, which heretofore formed part of the ancient county of the city of Cork, have been transferred to the county of Cork; they contain 25,335 persons—3 and 4 Vict., c. 108. The Act 3 and 4 Vict., c. 109, not having yet been carried into effect, they are returned as a separate barony.
